ABOUT

The Australian National University (ANU) was established by the Australian Government in 1946 with a founding mission to advance Australia's understanding of itself and its neighbours and to explore the important issues that influence future prosperity. With six Nobel Laureates among ANU's staff and alumni, these objectives are still relevant today and quality research remains at the heart of everything ANU does.

ANU is the only Australian university ranked in the world's top 20 institutions according to the latest QS World University Rankings 2015/16, and is consistently ranked as one of the world's great teaching and research universities by the *Times Higher Education Supplement*, the Shanghai Jiao Tong University's Institute of Higher Education, and *Newsweek International*. ANU is also the only Australian member of the International Alliance of Research Universities.

Positioned close to national institutions, research organisations, offices of government and the Australian Parliament, ANU has close links with nationally and internationally significant decision-makers.

As a small university, ANU has a higher than average number of staff per student, ensuring that students enjoy small class sizes and unrivalled access to some of the world's leading researchers, state-of-the-art technology, well-equipped lecture theatres, computing and laboratory facilities and five main libraries.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Admission requirements are the minimum qualifications you need before you can be selected for admission to a course of study.

As an international student completing one of the following qualifications in 2016, you will apply for admission through UAC and will generally be selected on the basis of your performance in these studies (ie your ATAR or equivalent):

- an Australian Year 12 qualification (either outside or in Australia)
- an International Baccalaureate
- a New Zealand National Certificate of Educational Achievement Level 3.

When assessing your application, ANU may take any or all of your qualifications or attempts at study into account.

Additional selection criteria

In addition to achieving the standard of performance required for admission, for certain courses you must also satisfy additional selection criteria.

STUDENTS UNDER 18 YEARS OF AGE

Before you are granted a student visa, the Australian Government must be satisfied that you have appropriate accommodation, support and general welfare arrangements in place for the period that you will be under 18 years of age while in Australia.

ANU does not accept responsibility for welfare arrangements for international students who will be under 18 years of age. Welfare must be arranged through an external provider, this must commence seven days prior to commencement of their program and continue up to their 18th birthday or the full period of enrolment.

Note: If you are offered a place at ANU you must pay a deposit before we will issue you an electronic Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) for use in your student visa application process.

The deposit of A\$20,000 will contribute to your tuition fee and the applicable Overseas Student Health Cover insurance premium.
