ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Admission requirements vary depending on the course you wish to enter. Check the course descriptions on UAC's website at www.uac.edu.au/postgraduate/course-search to view entry requirements for individual ICMS courses.

Overseas qualifications and English proficiency

If you hold overseas qualifications from countries where English is not the standard language of instruction, you must provide evidence of English language proficiency. Refer to ICMS's English language proficiency requirements on UAC's website at www.uac.edu.au/postgraduate/admission/elp/icms.shtml.

TYPES OF PROGRAMS AVAILABLE

ICMS offers a specialised range of coursework programs at postgraduate level through UAC. These include a Graduate Certificate and Masters degree programs in International Business, Tourism & Hospitality and Management & Organisations.

All Masters degrees at ICMS include a 600-hour Industry Research Project where you will work in an organisation on a pre-defined business project. This project is a structured and supervised part of your curriculum.

ENROLMENT

Acceptance of offer

We will contact you at the time of offer with acceptance procedures and deadlines.

Advanced standing/Academic credit

Applicants who can demonstrate successful completion of equivalent postgraduate units of study at a recognised university or college may be eligible for credit towards a program of study at ICMS. Applications for advanced standing must be made directly to ICMS and must include certified copies of full academic transcript and official copies of the curriculum for the course of study undertaken by the applicant.

Enrolment dates

An enrolment session for students who receive an offer will be held during the orientation session of each intake. See 'Important dates' at the beginning of the entry for semester dates. You will also be contacted by ICMS at the time of offer with enrolment session details.

Deferral of offer

A deferral of up to one year is available on application to ICMS. Students can choose to re-enter in either semester (February or July).

FEES AND CHARGES

Postgraduate coursework students are required to pay a fee for tuition for each subject within the program.

Tuition fees can be paid up-front to ICMS. Refer to the course description at www.uac.edu.au/postgraduate/course-search for an estimate of the total program fees. This fee is indicative only and fees are reviewed annually.
