ABOUT

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The basic admission qualification for postgraduate courses is completion of a recognised Bachelor degree. Admission is competitive and applicants will be considered on academic merit and any other criteria as specified by the faculty. Details of admission qualifications and any additional requirements such as work experience, supplementary forms or interviews are listed in the individual course description on UAC's website at uac.edu.au/postgraduate/course-search and on the Macquarie University postgraduate courses website at courses.mq.edu.au/list/postgraduate.

In exceptional cases, an applicant may be admitted as a candidate for a specific course if the applicant submits other evidence of academic and/or professional attainments and the admission is approved by the faculty for the course in which the applicant seeks to enrol.

Overseas qualifications and English proficiency

If you have undertaken studies in an overseas country you may have to provide proof of English proficiency.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

You may have to submit additional material as part of your application process; this will depend on the course/s for which you are applying. Submit your material by the date specified in the individual course descriptions.

TYPES OF PROGRAMS AVAILABLE

Macquarie University offers a wide range of coursework programs at postgraduate level – Masters, Graduate Diplomas and Graduate Certificates.

A number of these courses are offered through UAC. Courses offered through UAC are listed on UAC's website at uac.edu.au/postgraduate/course-search.

ENROLMENT

Acceptance of offer

Applicants who have been offered a place will be required to enrol online. Successful applicants will be provided with a web link to accept their offer and enrol.

Recognition of Prior Learning/Academic credit

Macquarie seeks to recognise your prior learning experiences, whether through formal qualifications or through other types of non-formal and informal learning, for credit towards its degrees. Course specific RPL information is available on Course Finder (courses.mq.edu.au/list/postgraduate). If you have prior learning that matches the criteria listed for your intended degree, you may simply submit the degree application via UAC and your RPL will be assessed through the admissions process.

Deferment of offer

Deferments are permitted in some postgraduate coursework fee paying programs. You can defer your place for one year. Refer to the deferment availability table at students.mq.edu.au/student_admin/enrolmentguide/defer to see if your course can be deferred. If you applied for Session 1 (March) but wish to commence in Session 2 (August) you can change your preference on UAC's website.

Deferment is not available for:

- Commonwealth-supported place offers
- Macquarie University Graduate School of Management (MGSM) offers
- Applied Finance Centre (AFC) offers
- Research course offers.

FEES AND CHARGES

Postgraduate coursework programs are either a fee-paying program (FEE) or Commonwealth-supported place (CSP) for which the Australian Government makes a contribution to the University towards the cost of a student's education.

Where it has been stated that a program offers CSP only, it is expected that, based on current enrolment numbers, all new students in that program will be given a CSP. If it is necessary to limit numbers, the CSP will be awarded on academic merit. Courses with limited CSP are indicated on the course list. The availability of CSPs may change from year to year and the University reserves the right to vary, without notice, any information relating to fees applicable to enrolment in any course or unit of study.

Some postgraduate courses at Macquarie offers both CSP and FEE places. CSPs are limited and the offer selection process is normally held closer to the start of the session. Applicants are strongly recommended to include the FEE program as a preference to maximise your study opportunities.

Tuition fees

Tuition fees are calculated on a per credit point basis. Students are charged on the basis of the number of postgraduate credit points attempted and not for the number successfully completed. Tuition fees are calculated each half year on the basis of the student load for that half year. Refer to mq.edu.au/study/postgraduate-study/fees-and-costs for fee estimates.

Payment of the Student Services and Amenities Fee is compulsory for most students who study on campus. For further information, visit studentadmin.mq.edu.au/fees/ssaf.html.

Scholarships

Macquarie Higher Study Scholarships are designed to enable recipients to continue their studies to an honours level or postgraduate coursework program. All successful students will be able to demonstrate financial hardship. Students can supplement their application by providing details regarding the following areas:

- capacity to triumph over hardship
- Indigenous background
- carer responsibilities
- geographic disadvantage
- non-English speaking background
- long-term medical condition
- ongoing effects of abuse.

Academic merit will also be considered.

Transport

Transport options at Macquarie make it one of the easiest universities to get to by public transport. There are over 4,000 car spaces on campus, regular buses to and from all destinations, and an on-campus train station.

The underground passenger rail service links the Northern line at Epping with the North Shore line at Chatswood via North Ryde.

State and private buses travel to Macquarie University from many areas of Sydney including the City, Hills District, North Shore, Chatswood, Manly, the Ryde and Carlingford areas, and the Western Suburbs.

For those travelling by car, parking facilities are available on campus. An annual parking sticker entitles you to unlimited use of the parking facilities.

Students with disabilities/health conditions

Macquarie University has a long-standing commitment to encouraging people with disabilities/health conditions to undertake tertiary studies.

The Disability Service provides support and assistance to students with a disability/health condition to ensure that they do not experience disadvantage in reaching their academic potential.
