ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

For admission to a postgraduate coursework program you would normally be expected to have a Bachelor degree from a recognised tertiary institution in an appropriate discipline. Admission requirements vary depending on the course you're interested in. Details of specific qualifications and any additional requirements are listed in the individual course descriptions on UAC's website.

You can also obtain information about the specific entry requirements for each program from the University website at newcastle.edu.au/degrees#filter=level_postgraduate.

Overseas qualifications and English proficiency

If you hold overseas qualifications from countries in which English is not the standard language of instruction you must provide evidence of English language proficiency. Refer to the English language proficiency information at uac.edu.au/postgraduate/admission/elp.shtml for information about tests and qualifications accepted by the University as proof of proficiency in English.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

You may have to provide specific documentation as part of the application process. Check the individual course description on UAC's website at uac.edu.au/postgraduate/course-search to see whether special requirements apply. TYPES OF PROGRAMS AVAILABLE

UON offers a wide range of coursework programs at postgraduate level – Master, Graduate Diploma and Graduate Certificate. Courses offered through UAC are listed on UAC's website at uac.edu.au/postgraduate.

All other postgraduate coursework programs are available through direct application to UON. Visit newcastle.edu.au/degrees for more information.

Postgraduate research degrees are also available through direct application to UON. Visit newcastle.edu.au/research-and-innovation for more information.

There are limited Commonwealth-supported postgraduate coursework places available. These places are only available in the Master of Clinical Psychology, Master of Teaching, Master of Architecture, Master of Midwifery Studies and Master of Mental Health Nursing programs. Places may be granted on a competitive basis for some of these courses.

ENROLMENT

Acceptance of offer

If you are offered a place in a postgraduate coursework program you will receive an offer notification from UAC. To accept your offer you should then visit the acceptance page on UON's website at newcastle.edu.au/uac and follow the instructions.

Advanced standing/academic credit

If you have already successfully undertaken relevant study at another higher education institution you may be granted credit on enrolment in a program.

You need to submit a credit application with appropriate documentation, such as official academic transcripts and detailed course outlines. For further information about applying for credit, call 1300 ASK UON (1300 275 866) or (02) 4921 500 or visit newcastle.edu.au/credit.

Deferment of offer

Deferments are available for some postgraduate coursework programs. If you are unable to commence your studies, you must apply to defer or re-apply at the appropriate time and be considered along with all other new applicants. For further information contact UON.

FEES AND CHARGES

Study costs are dependent on whether you are enrolled as a Commonwealth-supported student or as a domestic fee-paying student. For 2018 fee information visit newcastle.edu.au/current-students/support/fees-and-scholarships.

Most postgraduate coursework programs are offered as full fee-paying, where students are required to pay a tuition fee per unit studied, charged on a semester/trimester basis. Check the individual course description at uac.edu.au/postgraduate/course-search for an estimate of costs. The fee is indicative only and varies according to the selection of courses within the study program. Fees are subject to change on an annual basis.

Eligible domestic fee-paying students enrolled in a postgraduate coursework program may have access to the Australian Government's FEE-HELP scheme. Further information can be found at uac.edu.au/postgraduate/fees/course-costs.shtml.

Domestic students are also required to pay a Student Services and Amenities Fee (SSAF). The SSAF is charged each term of study. The maximum fee for 2017 was \$294 for the year (full-time study).

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

ACCOMMODATION

On-campus accommodation

Living on campus is a great way to make the most of university life. You'll have an opportunity to make new friends and get involved in a number of social, cultural and sporting activities while living in a unique residential community. With all costs included, and the convenience of living so close to class, the distinctive world of on-campus living is more affordable than you may think.

UON has a total of nine residences and over 1,700 beds at the Newcastle (Callaghan) and Central Coast (Ourimbah) campuses, including the new (2015) residential precinct at Callaghan consisting of four multi-storey buildings, and apartment-style units. Another four residential colleges are available at Callaghan, including Barahineban, Edwards Hall, Evatt House and International House. Blue Gum House is the established residential college at our Central Coast (Ourimbah) campus, offering 26 ensuite rooms.

Each residence has a unique atmosphere and offers a choice of accommodation options, with either private or shared rooms and private or shared facilities. All rooms are fully furnished and you can choose from either fully or semi-catered, or self-catered for more independence.

On-campus residents are supported by an integrated ResLife program that offers strong academic and social support and a wide variety of fun activities to cater for all tastes. Living on campus is a perfect transition for students leaving home for the first time or who are arriving from other towns, cities or countries.

The demand for on-campus accommodation is high. Do not wait until you receive your university offer to apply. Applications are expected to open in October 2017.
