ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The minimum educational requirement for entry to most postgraduate courses is a completed Bachelor degree. Entry requirements vary between courses – some courses have additional selection requirements. For details see the individual course description at uac.edu.au/postgraduate/course-search.

Applicants with substantial relevant work experience and no Bachelor degree may be considered for entry to some Graduate Certificate programs. You can obtain information about the entry requirements for a specific course by calling 1300 ASK UTS (1300 275 887) or from the relevant faculty website.

Overseas qualifications and English proficiency

If you have undertaken your studies in an overseas country you may have to provide proof of proficiency in English. Refer to UTS's English language proficiency requirements on UAC's website at uac.edu.au/postgraduate/admission/elp/uts.shtml.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

You may have to provide a personal statement, curriculum vitae (CV), questionnaire, portfolio, employer letter, a show reel or referee report as part of the application process. Check the individual course description on UAC's website at uac.edu.au/postgraduate/course-search to see whether additional application requirements apply.

Your application may not be considered if you fail to meet the additional application requirements specified for the courses listed on UAC's website.

How to upload your personal statement, CV, questionnaire, portfolio or show reel

You can upload your personal statement, CV, questionnaire or portfolio through UAC's website after you apply. For information about uploading your additional application documents, visit uac.edu.au/postgraduate/apply/documents/upload.shtml.

Show reels for Media Arts and Production should be included as a web link in your CV submission. You cannot upload a show reel to your application.

Academic documents (eg academic transcripts or testamurs from overseas or private providers) must be submitted as verified hard copy documents to UAC. Do not upload these documents through UAC's website.

Referee reports for the Master of Clinical Psychology must be submitted via the Graduate School of Health website at clinicalpsychology.uts.edu.au.

When do you have to submit your additional material?

You must submit your additional material at the same time that an application is submitted to UAC. If you delay the submission of your additional material your application may not be considered.

TYPES OF PROGRAMS AVAILABLE

UTS offers approximately 220 Masters by coursework, Graduate Diploma and Graduate Certificate courses throughout the year.

A number of the University's postgraduate coursework programs are offered through UAC. Courses offered through UAC are listed on UAC's website at uac.edu.au/postgraduate. All other postgraduate coursework programs (including courses offered by UTS Business School) and all postgraduate research programs are available through direct application to the University.

It is important that you distinguish between those courses for which you are required to apply through UAC (refer to uac.edu.au/postgraduate for details) and those for which you must apply directly to UTS.

Limited Commonwealth-supported places are available at the postgraduate coursework level.

ENROLMENT

Acceptance of offer

Successful applicants will receive an electronic offer notification from UAC. Offers are made progressively as decisions are provided by the relevant faculties.

Successful applicants must go to start.uts.edu.au for offer acceptance and enrolment.

Deferment of offer

Deferment is not permitted in postgraduate coursework programs at UTS. If you receive an offer for Autumn or Spring session in 2018 and you are unable to accept the offer for that session, you can carry forward your application for consideration in a later session in 2018 by changing your preferences online through UAC.

If you would like to be considered for 2019, you will need to submit a new application.

FEES AND CHARGES

Study costs are dependent on whether students are enrolled in a Commonwealth-supported place (CSP) or a fee-paying (FEE) course.

Most postgraduate courses are fee-paying and students are required to pay tuition fees directly to the University. However, a small number of courses available offer Commonwealth-supported places.

UAC's website at uac.edu.au/postgraduate/course-search includes details of the annual tuition fees based on enrolment in a full-time load in 2017. Check the UTS website at uts.edu.au/current-students/managing-your-course/fees-and-payment/domestic-student-tuition-fees/domestic for more information on fees and other charges. Tuition fees at UTS are calculated per credit point and charged on a per session basis.

In addition, a Student Services and Amenities Fee (SSAF) is payable for each Autumn and Spring session.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Eligible, local fee-paying students enrolled in postgraduate coursework may have access to the Higher Education Loan Program FEE-HELP. FEE-HELP provides students with a loan of up to \$100,879 (2017 limit) to cover their tuition fees. Further information can be found at studyassist.gov.au.

The Australian Government has proposed changes that will affect the way that students will repay the debt accumulated under HELP. For the latest information, including loan and government scholarship assistance details, visit studyassist.gov.au.
