ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Admission to all ANU courses is on a competitive basis, taking into account all relevant academic qualifications. Course intakes are determined by the number of places available and the number of eligible applicants seeking entry to those courses.

The qualifications outlined in the following text will be considered when assessing your application. If you have completed an approved tertiary preparation course or alternative entry scheme, you will be assessed on the results of that scheme alone, unless you have undertaken subsequent study.

Courses in Design, Visual Arts and Music Performance streams have special selection criteria. Read the 'Interview and audition requirements' in the course descriptions for further information.

Bachelor of Philosophy courses and the Bachelor of Health Science require selection criteria in addition to achieving the published cut-off. Visit anu.edu.au/study/apply/additional-selection-criteria-undergraduate-coursework-applications for further information.

Australian secondary studies

If you are a 2017 or previous Australian Year 12 student and have not completed further study, admission to ANU is based on your ATAR or equivalent.

Offers made to applicants who have an ATAR below the published cut-off

Most students admitted to ANU have an ATAR at or above the published cut-off, but various schemes allow the consideration of additional information, which may facilitate entry below that cut-off. These schemes include:

- bonus points for strong performance in relevant Year 12 subjects
- Educational Access Schemes (EAS)
- Elite Athlete Friendly University (EAFU) Scheme
- Schools Recommendation Scheme (SRS).

International Baccalaureate Early Entry Scheme

The ANU International Baccalaureate Early Entry Scheme (IBEES) offers early entry to domestic school leavers currently completing an International Baccalaureate qualification in Australia and New Zealand IB Schools. IBEES considers your predicted IB grades to assess you for entry.

ANU Guaranteed Entry Scheme

ANU guarantees you an offer in offer rounds prior to and including January Round 1 if you:

- achieve the cut-off listed for that course, including any applicable bonus points
- have the course listed as your highest preference
- satisfy any applicable prerequisites or additional selection criteria.

Refer to the course entry for prerequisites, additional selection criteria and further information.

If you don't achieve the guaranteed cut-off you can still apply to ANU. Subject to places, ANU may make additional offers below the guaranteed cut-off on a merit basis.

Australian tertiary studies

For admission to undergraduate courses at ANU, the following qualifications from an approved institution will be considered when assessing your eligibility:

- completion of an Associate Degree, Diploma or Advanced Diploma (except for admission to Law courses)
- successful completion of at least one year's full-time study load (1.0 FTE) of Bachelor degree-level studies.

An entrance rank determined by the assessment of the above tertiary-level studies will supersede an entrance rank achieved during secondary studies. If you have achieved only part of the above, the entrance rank achieved in your secondary studies will take precedence.

Note: The definition of what is considered a standard full-time study load can vary between universities.

Present and former ANU students

If you are currently enrolled in an ANU course, or if you are on approved leave and you would like to transfer to another ANU course, you must apply directly to ANU for an internal program transfer.

Graduates and students completing an ANU program who would like to start a second undergraduate program, and students who left the University without completing their degree or taking approved leave, must apply for readmission through UAC.

Associate Degree or Diploma students

Applicants completing an ANU Associate Degree, the ANU University Preparation Program or Diploma (offered through ANU College), which articulates directly into an associated ANU program, can apply directly to ANU.

If you would like to apply for entry to the ANU University Preparation Program or a Diploma you must apply through UAC. For further details, visit anu.edu.au.

Failure or exclusion

Applicants with a record of failure are less competitive for a place than those with a successful academic history. If you have been excluded from study at any university you will not be considered for admission to ANU for up to five years. Following the exclusion period, you will need to demonstrate that you have successfully completed at least one year of full-time equivalent study load (1.0 FTE) of tertiary study to be considered.

Overseas qualifications

Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia with overseas qualifications should contact the ANU Domestic Admissions Office for information about eligibility for admission before submitting an application through UAC. For information on overseas secondary qualifications, visit uac.edu.au/undergraduate/admission/overseas.shtml.

Note: The Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) alone is not acceptable for admission to ANU. You must also submit a copy of your high school transcript to UAC when you apply.

If you hold overseas secondary or tertiary qualifications from countries where English is not the standard language of instruction you must provide evidence of English language proficiency: visit uac.edu.au/undergraduate/admission/elp.shtml.

Alternative entry and pathways

Pathway courses

University preparatory and bridging courses

ANU is introducing the University Preparation Program (UPP) in 2017, which has been developed as part of the ANU Access Scheme to ensure that ANU is able to offer a strong pathway to students who may have experienced educational disadvantage. This course will be offered in partnership with ANU College, the pathway provider to ANU. For further information, visit anucollege.edu.au.

Special Adult Entry Scheme (21 years old and over)

If you are over 21 years of age, have not completed tertiary study in the last two years, and do not otherwise meet the academic requirements for entry to ANU, you can apply for admission on the basis of the Special Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT). To be eligible for STAT assessment by ANU you must complete both the Written English and Multiple Choice tests.

Tertiary Preparation Certificate/TAFE qualifications (18 years old and over)

If you are over 18 years of age, you can apply for admission on the basis of the NSW TAFE Tertiary Preparation Certificate (TPC).

Certificate-level qualifications are not assessed for entry to ANU and will not contribute to your entrance rank. If you are unsure if your qualification can be assessed for admission, contact the ANU Domestic Admissions Office.

Note: Application through alternative entry schemes is not available for courses in Design or Visual Arts.

Limited ATAR/ACT Year 12 (20 years old and over)

To be eligible to apply for admission in 2018 on the basis of an ACT or interstate Year 12 mature-age package, you must be 20 years of age by Thursday 1 March 2018. Not all interstate packages are acceptable. If you are a 2017 NSW HSC student, read section 2.4 in Part 1 for details.

Employment experience

Students may be considered for admission to the ANU on the basis of work experience. ANU will consider work experience that meets the Australian and New Zealand Standard Classification of Occupations (ANZSCO) scale, with a minimum skill level of 2 and with a minimum duration of five years' work experience or higher. Employment experience is not considered for all courses. For more information call (02) 6125 5594.

SCHOOLS RECOMMENDATION SCHEME

ANU participates in the Schools Recommendation Schemes (SRS), which allow current Australian Year 12 students to receive early offers of undergraduate admission using criteria other than (or in addition to) ATARs. SRS for ANU is processed centrally through UAC and is assessed on equity-based criteria. To be considered under the EAS category of SRS, you must submit an EAS application to UAC by **Friday 29 September 2017**.

EDUCATIONAL ACCESS SCHEMES

ANU participates in Educational Access Schemes (EAS), which help current and recent Year 12 students (with no tertiary study) who display good academic potential but have experienced serious long-term disadvantage in their educational preparation for tertiary entrance.

ANU EAS applications are processed centrally through UAC. Read section 5.5 in Part 1 for further information on EAS.

If you have commenced tertiary study and experienced long-term disadvantage, you may be able to apply for special consideration. Read 'Special consideration' below.

EQUITY SCHOLARSHIPS

ANU offers a number of Equity Scholarships which are open to all eligible applicants applying to or currently enrolled at ANU.

Many scholarships are processed centrally through UAC, including ANU Commonwealth Indigenous Scholarship applications. Read section 7.6 in Part 1 for further information on Equity Scholarships.

SPECIAL CONSIDERATION

If your previous academic performance at either secondary or tertiary level has been adversely affected by circumstances beyond your control, you may be eligible to submit a 'Request for Special Consideration (Admission)' form to the Domestic Admissions Manager at ANU. This is in addition to applying for admission through UAC. The form and additional information is available at anu.edu.au/study/apply/special-consideration. Applications for special consideration must be received by the change of preference closing date for January Round 1 and June Round 1 offers. Read the inside front cover for important dates.

Note: To apply for special consideration you must have completed at least one year of full-time tertiary study. Applicants with no tertiary study must apply through the Educational Access Schemes administered by UAC; read section 5.5 in Part 1 for further information on EAS.

Elite athletes

ANU is an Elite Athlete Friendly University and will consider applications for special consideration from applicants who are recognised as elite athletes by the Australian Sports Commission's AIS Personal Excellence program. Pasifika applicants

Current Year 12 students whose qualifications do not meet minimum admission requirements can seek admission through the Schools Recommendation Schemes (SRS) – read section 5.5 in Part 1.

ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER AUSTRALIANS

The Tjabal Higher Education Centre offers a range of support services to all Indigenous Australian students, including orientation to the broad context of the University, study skills and academic advice, tutorial assistance, 24-hour computer lab access, a common room and study facilities. Indigenous applicants whose qualifications do not meet minimum admission requirements may be eligible for admission through ANU alternative entry schemes or pathway courses. BRIDGING COURSES

Mathematics: ANU College offers a mathematics bridging course which can be used to satisfy ANU maths prerequisites. Visit anucollege.edu.au for further information.

Chemistry: ANU offers a chemistry bridging course which can be used to satisfy chemistry prerequisites. This course runs after the UAC January offer rounds, so applicants may want to consider including B Science as a preference. If you meet entry requirements and successfully complete the chemistry bridging course, you can apply direct to ANU to transfer to your desired course later. ENROLMENT

Acceptance of offer

Once you receive your offer from UAC, visit anu.edu.au/study/accept.

Advanced standing/academic credit

Credit may be given to applicants transferring from other tertiary institutions. Applications for credit may be submitted at the time of enrolment and must be accompanied by course and subject outlines from your previous course. For further information, visit anu.edu.au/students/program-administration/program-management/get-course-credit-or-exemption.

Deferment of offer

Available to all applicants for up to one year.
