FEES AND CHARGES

Tuition fees are payable per semester. Tuition fees are reviewed annually. Fees for each year are published on the AFTRS website. AFTRS reserves the right to change the fees for any course and to make alterations to the course of study, which may increase the fees over the duration of the course.
