Search for courses

Your course preferences are the courses that you have applied for through UAC Apply. In My UAC, you can manage your application wherever you are by adding courses, removing courses or re-ordering your course preferences.

> Your UAC PIN. UAC PINs are sent to Year 12 students in August. If you've forgotten your UAC PIN and you have applied through UAC, use Check & Change to have your UAC PIN automatically emailed to you. Otherwise, call UAC on 1300 ASK UAC (1300 275 822) or (02) 9752 0200 from mobiles to have your PIN re-issued.

What you need to log in

> Your UAC application number. It has nine digits and is issued when you apply. You can find it on your Confirmation of Application.
