To be eligible for an offer to a CQUniversity degree, applicants need to meet minimum entrance requirements, including subject prerequisites and English language requirements, and be selected in competition with other eligible applicants. Interviews, auditions, portfolios and/or tests may be needed for admission to some degrees – read the course descriptions for additional selection criteria.

Australian secondary studies

2016 Australian Year 12 students

2016 Australian Year 12 students are considered on their ATAR or equivalent. If you have previously undertaken Year 12, your application will be assessed on the basis of your latest ATAR or equivalent.

Offers made to applicants who have an ATAR below the published cut-off

CQUniversity has a number of alternative pathways for admission, which may allow 2016 Year 12 applicants to receive an offer to a degree even though they have an ATAR below the published cut-off. They include:

- Educational Access Schemes (EAS)
- School of Academic Learning Services' Tertiary Entrance Program (TEP) – for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander applicants.

Other school-leaving qualifications

You can be admitted for study if your score in any of the following is equivalent to or above the ATAR for the program/s you are interested in:

- an Australian Year 12 before 2016
- the former NSW Leaving Certificate.

If you have subsequent qualifications from TAFE or university, read 'Australian tertiary studies' below.

Australian tertiary studies

If you have ever undertaken tertiary studies, your application will be considered on the basis of your overall academic record – both secondary and tertiary.

Exclusion: Applicants who are currently under exclusion may not be eligible for admission. Contact CQUniversity for further information.

Overseas qualifications

Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia with overseas qualifications should call CQUniversity on 13 27 86 for advice before applying. Refer to tables 7 and 8 in Part 1 for information on overseas secondary qualifications.

If you have secondary or tertiary qualifications from a country where English is not the medium of instruction, you will need to provide evidence of proficiency in English – read section 2.9 in Part 1 and visit www.uac.edu.au/undergraduate/admission/elp.shtml.

Alternative entry and pathways

If you do not have the required prerequisites, you may be eligible for alternative entry if you:

- undertake a Special Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT) and achieve the required score. For further details on STAT, read section 2.8 in Part 1. If you are not able to sit the STAT, you must contact CQUniversity for advice.
- are a non-Year 12 student and have completed paid employment of one-year full-time or more. A 'Statement of service' will need to be provided with the required information for a formal assessment. For more information read section 4.16 and visit www.uac.edu.au/undergraduate/admission/employment.shtml.

Limited ATAR

EDUCATIONAL ACCESS SCHEMES

Educational Access Schemes (EAS) assists applicants who've experienced long-term educational disadvantage as a result of circumstances beyond their control or choosing.

ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER AUSTRALIANS

The School of Academic Learning Services provides co-ordinated academic services and study facilities for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students. Applicants who are successful in completing the Tertiary Entrance Program (TEP) will be considered eligible for admission to the University.

DISTANCE EDUCATION

CQUniversity is one of Australia's leading providers of distance education, with many of our degrees offered in this study mode. Distance education gives you the flexibility to study a university degree in your own home at your own pace, without needing to visit a campus. This allows you to balance your study with your family and work commitments and provides an opportunity for those who live in rural and remote areas or internationally to access university study without the need to relocate.
