ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

To be offered a place in a course at JNI you must meet the minimum entry requirements listed in one or more of the following categories as well as satisfy English language requirements.

Australian secondary studies

2016 Australian Year 12 students

If you are a 2016 Australian Year 12 student you are usually assessed on the basis of your Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) or equivalent. Refer to Table 4 in Part 1 for Queensland OP equivalents.

If you are a 2016 Australian Year 12 student who has previously undertaken Year 12, you will be considered on the basis of your latest ATAR or equivalent.

Students must be 18 years of age or over.

Australian tertiary studies

Applicants who have completed previous tertiary studies at Diploma level or above may be admitted on the basis of the study undertaken. If tertiary study is below Diploma level read 'Alternative entry and pathways' below.

Overseas qualifications

Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia with overseas qualifications must contact JNI to discuss eligibility for admission before submitting an application to UAC.

If you have secondary or tertiary qualifications from countries where English is not the standard language of instruction, you must provide evidence of English language proficiency. For more information read section 2.9 in Part 1 and visit www.uac.edu.au/undergraduate/admission/elp.shtml.

Alternative entry and pathways

Applicants who are over 18 years of age

Applicants who are over 18 and not yet 21 who have an ATAR below the published cut-off will be required to provide documentation of any study undertaken (completed or not completed with the results in those units and/or courses) and a CV of work experience, as well as a demonstrated ability to undertake study at this level, direct to JNI. Typical evidence may include written material generated as part of work functions demonstrating level of literacy and relevant professional-development activities undertaken which demonstrate commitment to study.

Applicants over 21 years of age

Applicants aged 21 or over may be admitted on the basis of their work experience and/or other study attempted and/or completed. Applicants will be required to provide documentation of any study undertaken (completed or

not completed with the results in those units and/or courses), a CV of work experience, and demonstrate the ability to undertake study at this level, which may take the form of written material generated as part of work functions confirming level of literacy or relevant professional development activities undertaken that show commitment to study. TAFE or equivalent qualifications
