ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Macleay College provides a unique learning experience and offers several admission paths into the course of your choice. To be offered a place in a course at Macleay College, applicants must meet the minimum entry requirements listed in one of the following categories as well as satisfy English language requirements.

Additionally, all applicants must attend an interview to determine their aptitude for entering their chosen course.

Australian secondary studies

2016 Australian Year 12 students

If you are a 2016 Australian Year 12 student you are usually assessed on the basis of your Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) or equivalent. Refer to Table 4 in Part 1 for Queensland OP equivalents.

If you are a 2016 Australian Year 12 student who has previously undertaken Year 12, you will be considered on the basis of your latest ATAR or equivalent.

Offers made to applicants who have an ATAR below the published cut-off

If you have an ATAR below the published cut-off, you will be considered for entry on performance in your best three HSC subject results or equivalent.

Australian tertiary studies

Applicants who have completed previous tertiary studies at Diploma level or above may be admitted on the basis of the study undertaken.

Current and former Macleay College students

Current Macleay College students who wish to transfer to a new course do not need to apply through UAC but must complete a 'Course transfer request' form which can be obtained by contacting the Registrar on 1300 939 888. Former students who wish to return to their studies should call the Admissions Team on 1300 939 888 for more information.

Overseas qualifications

Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia with overseas qualifications must contact Macleay College to discuss eligibility for admission before applying through UAC. Refer to tables 7 and 8 in Part 1 for information on overseas secondary qualifications.

If you hold overseas qualifications from countries where English is not the standard language of instruction, you must provide evidence of English

language proficiency – read section 2.9 in Part 1 and visit www.uac.edu.au/undergraduate/admission/elp.shtml.

Alternative entry and pathways

Applicants over 20 years of age/Mature-age entry

Applicants over 20 years of age (by Monday 6 February 2017) may be admitted to Macleay College on the basis of their work experience or other study attempted or completed. Applicants will be required to provide a CV and documentation of any study undertaken (completed or not completed with the results in those units and/or courses).

Tertiary Preparation Certificate/TAFE qualifications

Applicants with TAFE or equivalent qualifications will be considered for admission in competition with all other applicants.

Limited ATAR

EDUCATIONAL ACCESS SCHEMES

Macleay College has an Educational Access Scheme (EAS) for applicants whose educational performance has been affected by long-term educational disadvantage due to circumstances beyond their control or choosing.

ENROLMENT

Acceptance of offer

Successful applicants will be notified of their offer. Once they accept their offer they will receive information about enrolment and the necessary course commencement information, and an invitation to orientation.

Advanced standing/Academic credit

Applications for advanced standing/academic credit may be granted on the basis of completion of previous tertiary studies. Applications may be made at enrolment time and must be accompanied by full documentation of previous studies (including transcripts and subject descriptions).

Macleay College's degree courses run over six trimesters (two years) and the diploma courses run over three trimesters (one year).

Tuition fees are charged on a trimester basis and are required to be paid prior to the census date for each trimester. Students can choose to pay their tuition fees in full, through FEE-HELP or via a combination of both.
