MIT has three trimesters in one academic year – each trimester being the equivalent of one traditional semester. The trimester system also allows you to spread a traditional two-semester year over three trimesters – doing fewer units in each trimester in order to manage your work and personal commitments. Another option is to use the November trimester to catch up on units you weren't able to complete in previous trimesters.

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

### Australian secondary studies

If you are a 2016 Australian Year 12 student you are usually assessed on the basis of your Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) or equivalent. Refer to Table 4 in Part 1 for Queensland OP equivalents.

If you are a 2016 Australian Year 12 student who has previously undertaken Year 12, you will be considered on the basis of your latest ATAR or equivalent.

### Australian tertiary studies

Applicants who have attempted previous tertiary studies will be considered for admission on the basis of their overall academic merits.

### Current and former MIT Sydney students

If you were previously enrolled at MIT and are seeking re-admission to the same course, or you are currently enrolled and wish to apply to a new course, call MIT admission on (02) 8267 1400 or email info.sydney@mit.edu.au.

### Overseas qualifications

Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia with overseas qualifications should call MIT Admission on (02) 8267 1400 or email info.sydney@mit.edu.au to discuss eligibility for admission before applying through UAC. Refer to tables 7 and 8 in Part 1 for information on overseas secondary qualifications.

If you hold overseas secondary or tertiary qualifications from countries where English is not the standard language of instruction, you must provide evidence of proficiency in the English language – read section 2.9 in Part 1 and visit [www.uac.edu.au/undergraduate/admission/elp.shtml](http://www.uac.edu.au/undergraduate/admission/elp.shtml).
