ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

To be offered a place in a course at Torrens University Australia you must meet the minimum entry requirements listed in one or more of the following categories as well as satisfy English language requirements.

Australian secondary studies

2016 Australian Year 12 students

If you are a 2016 Australian Year 12 student you are usually assessed on the basis of your Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) or equivalent. Refer to Table 4 in Part 1 for Queensland OP equivalents.

If you are a 2016 Australian Year 12 student who has previously undertaken Year 12, you will be considered on the basis of your latest ATAR or equivalent.

Australian tertiary studies

Applicants who have partially completed or completed previous tertiary studies at Diploma level or above may be admitted on the basis of the study undertaken. If tertiary study is below Diploma level, read 'Alternative entry and pathways' below.

Current students

Current Torrens University Australia students who wish to transfer to a new course must complete the 'Application for Course Transfer' form. Call 1300 880 610 for further information.

Overseas qualifications

Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia with overseas qualifications must contact Torrens University Australia to discuss eligibility of admission before submitting an application to UAC.

If you hold overseas secondary or tertiary qualifications from countries where English is not the standard language of instruction, you must provide evidence of English language proficiency – read section 2.9 and visit www.uac.edu.au/undergraduate/admission/elp.shtml.

Alternative entry and pathways

Torrens University Australia has a number of alternative pathways for admission available to applicants, including:

Applicants with an ATAR below the published cut-off

- Applicants with an ATAR of 58.00 or above, may be accepted into the Associate Degree and upon successful completion may progress to the Bachelor degree of their choice.
- Applicants with an ATAR of 56.00 or above, but below 58.00, may be accepted into the Higher Education Diploma and upon successful completion may progress to the Bachelor degree of their choice.
- Applicants with an ATAR below 56.00, may be accepted into a Vocational Diploma and upon successful completion may progress to the Bachelor degree of their choice. These programs are delivered through Think: Colleges Pty Ltd, RTO 0269.

Special entry requirements

Applicants may be admitted to a Bachelor degree of their choice based on their demonstrated ability to undertake study at the Bachelor level with the following criteria:

- having prior industry/work experience
- having completed or partially completed subjects or courses of a degree, Associate Degree or Diploma from an accredited institution.

Tertiary preparation certificate/TAFE qualifications

Applicants with a tertiary preparation certificate or TAFE Diploma can receive course credit for existing TAFE or equivalent qualifications in related fields of study. Call Torrens University Australia to discuss your eligibility before submitting an application to UAC on 1300 880 610.

Limited ATAR

EDUCATIONAL ACCESS SCHEMES

Torrens University Australia have an Educational Access Scheme (EAS) to assist applicants whose education has been disadvantaged by circumstances beyond their control for a substantial period of time.

EQUITY SCHOLARSHIPS
