The Universities Admissions Centre (NSW & ACT) Pty Ltd (UAC) was established in 1995 and is the largest tertiary admissions centre in Australia. Our mission is to provide excellence in admissions services and promote equity of access to tertiary education. Central to that mission is a strong culture of servicing the needs of all our stakeholders, in particular our institutions and applicants.

UAC has a trusted and valuable position in the higher education sector. Applicants turn to UAC for unbiased and authoritative information about university admissions and courses and for an easy interface to apply for courses from across multiple institutions.

Institutions rely upon UAC services to handle the bulk of the admissions process, allowing them to focus on their core capabilities of learning and teaching, research, and community engagement. Parents, schools, the media, and the public know UAC as their first point of reference for the ATAR and university admissions in NSW and the ACT.

UAC is a not-for-profit and registered as a charity with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC).
