Your privacy

When you apply to the Universities Admissions Centre (NSW & ACT) (UAC) you provide a lot of personal information, sometimes including health information.

UAC values the privacy of your personal information and recognises the importance of protecting it. UAC is bound by the following legislation:

- *Health Records and Information Privacy Act 2002* (NSW).

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STEPS TO STUDY THROUGH UAC

1. RESEARCH

Think about what subject areas you like and do well in at school, then use this Guide and UAC's website or the My UAC app to search for related courses. Check selection rank information, admission criteria and pathway options for courses you're interested in. Take note of important dates in the application process.

2. APPLY FOR UNI BEFORE 30 SEPTEMBER

Apply and pay before 30 September to avoid a significant increase to the processing charge. Domestic students can apply for up to five courses through UAC's website. International students can apply for up to six courses. (You can change these courses later.)

3. APPLY FOR SRS, EAS AND ES

Schools Recommendation Schemes (SRS) are one way institutions make early offers to domestic Year 12 students. They use a range of criteria other than, or in addition to, ATARs. Applications open 3 April and close at midnight 30 September.

If you've experienced long-term disadvantage that has affected your study, you may be eligible to apply for Educational Access Schemes (EAS). There are also Equity Scholarships (ES) for financially disadvantaged students. These applications usually require supporting documents and can take time to complete, so start as soon as possible.

4. ORDER YOUR COURSE PREFERENCES FOR EARLY OFFERS

Early entry schemes (including SRS) make offers in November. Your preferences are considered in the order you list them, so make sure you have the course you most want to do as your first preference.

5. GET YOUR ATAR

You will receive your ATAR mid-December. The ATAR helps universities rank applicants for selection into their courses.

7. GET YOUR OFFER

Most institutions make offers in the December and January rounds, but there are many offers throughout the admissions period.

6. REVIEW YOUR COURSE PREFERENCES

After you receive your ATAR, you will have a couple of days to update your preference list. Log in to your application on the UAC website to remove, change or add preferences.

8. ACCEPT AND ENROL

Accept your offer and follow the institution's instructions to start the enrolment process. Don't worry, you can still receive offers in later offer rounds, even if you've already accepted a previous offer.

Part 3 Apply direct institutions

This part lists apply direct institutions. UAC does not process applications or make offers on behalf of these institutions; applicants must apply directly to the institutions.

Each institution has its own entry, containing:

- an overview of the institution. For information about admission criteria, student services and facilities, and course fee information, visit the institution website.
- a list of courses offered by the institution.

Part 4 Course Finder

The Course Finder consists of two indexes: the cross-referenced index and the main areas of study index. Use the first index to help match the subject areas you're interested in to main areas of study; then use the second index to find the institutions offering courses in those main areas of study.

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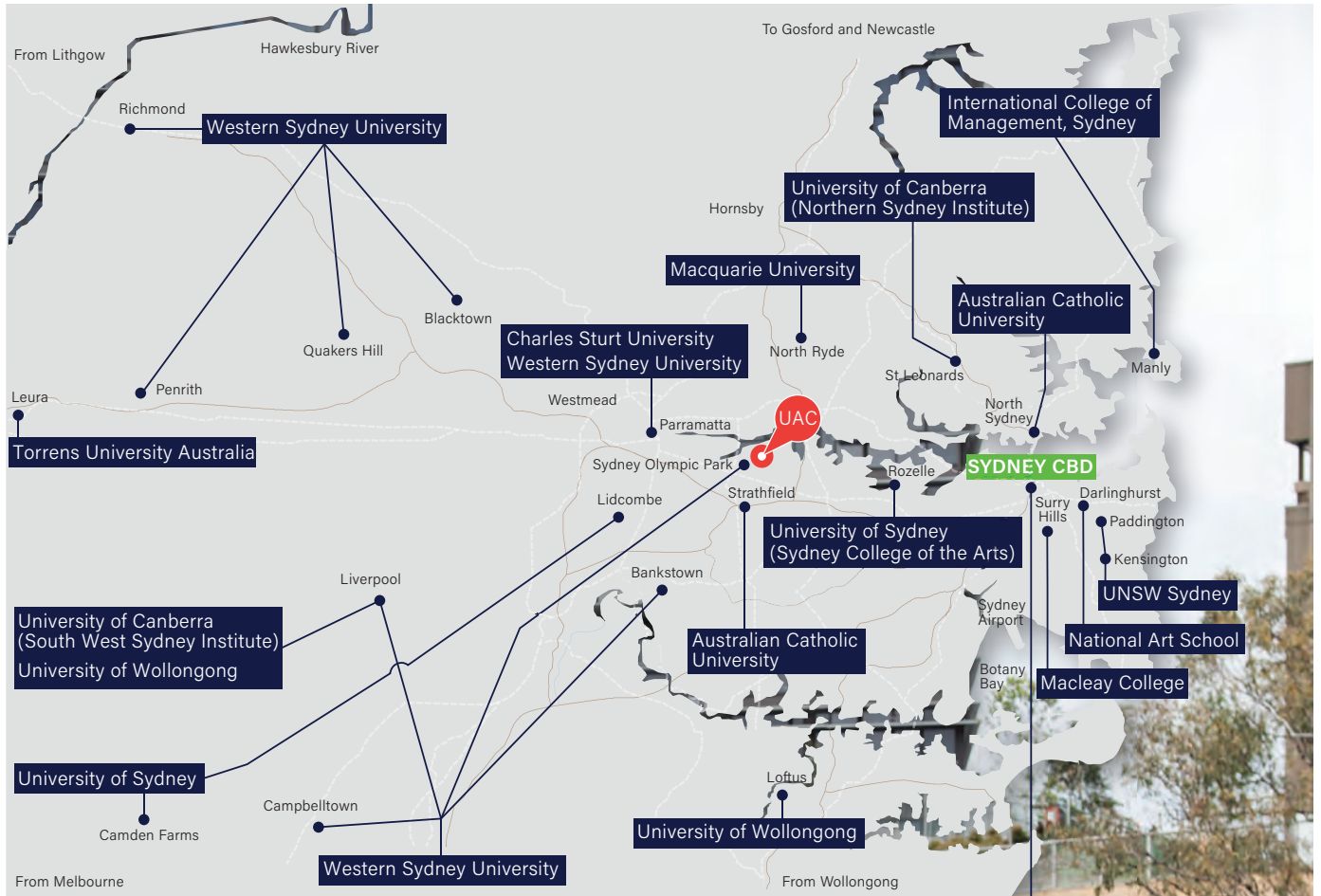

1 ABOUT UAC

1.1 UAC - WHAT WE DO

The Universities Admissions Centre (UAC) helps you continue your education after school. It does this by:

- calculating and providing the ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admission Rank) to eligible HSC students in NSW. Your ATAR is a measure of your overall academic achievement against other students in the state. It helps universities rank you for selection into their courses.
- processing applications to participating institutions (mainly universities in NSW and the ACT). If you're not sure what course you'd like to do, or even which university you'd like to go to, you can apply for different courses at various universities in one application through the UAC website – five courses if you're a domestic applicant, and six if you're an international applicant. And you can change these choices between offer rounds.
- processing equity programs for domestic applicants on behalf of institutions. These include Educational Access Schemes, Schools Recommendation Schemes and Equity Scholarships. For more information, read sections 5.6 and 7.8.

Owned by universities in NSW and the ACT, UAC is the largest tertiary admissions centre in Australia. It's a private and not-for-profit company.

1.2 CAN I APPLY THROUGH UAC?

Domestic students

You can apply through UAC to institutions listed in Part 2 of this Guide if you're:

- an Australian or New Zealand citizen
- a permanent resident of Australia
- the holder of an Australian permanent resident humanitarian visa.

To apply for a course at an institution listed in Part 3 of this Guide, you must apply directly to the institution, not through UAC.

ACCESS SCHEMES AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Educational Access Schemes

Educational Access Schemes (EAS) are for applicants whose studies were negatively affected as a result of circumstances beyond their control or choosing.

2 THE ATAR

2.1 ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for an ATAR in 2019, you must **satisfactorily complete** at least 10 units of ATAR courses. These ATAR courses must include at least:

- 8 units from Category A courses
- 2 units of English
- three Board Developed courses of 2 units or greater
- four subjects.

The fourth point can easily be overlooked or misunderstood. A subject is an area of study (eg mathematics). Within that subject there may be a number of courses (eg Mathematics Standard 2, Mathematics, Mathematics Extension 1, Mathematics Extension 2). If a student studies, for example, Mathematics Extension 1, Mathematics Extension 2, English Advanced, English Extension 1, English Extension 2 and Biology, they will not meet the four subjects requirement because, while they have completed 10 units of ATAR courses, they have only studied three subjects: mathematics, English and biology.

ATAR courses

There are many Higher School Certificate (HSC) courses but not all will contribute to an ATAR. Those that do are developed by the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA). They are known as 'Board Developed courses' and have formal examinations that yield graded assessments. They are classified as either **Category A** or **Category B** ATAR courses.

Category A courses have the academic rigour and depth of knowledge to provide the background for tertiary studies.

Category B courses are those for which the level of cognitive and performance demands are not regarded as satisfactory preparation for tertiary study, but their contribution to the ATAR is regarded as adequate if the other courses included in the ATAR calculation are more academically demanding.

Refer to the lists of 2019 Category A and B courses at the end of this section.

Satisfactory completion of a course

You'll be considered to have satisfactorily completed a course if, in your principal's view, there is sufficient evidence that you have:

- followed the course developed or endorsed by NESA
- applied yourself with diligence and sustained effort to the set tasks and experiences provided in the course by the school
- achieved some or all of the course outcomes
- made a genuine attempt at assessment tasks that total more than 50 per cent of the available school assessment marks for that course.

You also need to make a serious attempt at the examination for the course. For more information about HSC eligibility requirements, visit the NESA website at educationstandards.nsw.edu.au.

Failure to satisfactorily complete a course will result in that course not contributing to the eligibility requirements. If the course is a 2-unit course with an associated extension course, failure to satisfactorily complete the 2-unit course will result in neither the 2-unit nor the extension course contributing towards your ATAR.

Who isn't eligible for an ATAR?

International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma candidates are not eligible for an ATAR. Instead, if they've been awarded the IB Diploma or Bilingual Diploma, they are allocated a UAC rank based on their total IB score.

Also, students undertaking tertiary preparation programs such as the Tertiary Preparation Certificate (TPC) and Open Foundation do not receive an ATAR.

2.2 YOUR HSC MARKS

The HSC syllabus and exams are set by NESA. Students receive a mark based on their performance against standards in each HSC course. There is no quota as to the number of students who can achieve top marks and students are not scaled against other students in the course.

Your HSC marks, as reported in your Record of Achievement, indicate the standards you have reached in each of your courses. Your HSC mark for each course is a 50:50 combination of your school-based assessment mark for that course and your external examination mark. For detailed information about the reporting of HSC marks, search for 'HSC results' at educationstandards.nsw.edu.au.

Assessment marks

Your assessment tasks are marked at your school. Because schools mark in different ways, NESA needs to remove the differences so that it can compare the results in a way that is fair for all students. It does this through a process called 'moderation'.

Moderation aligns school-based assessment marks with the raw statewide exam marks. Since the exam for a course is taken by all students completing that course, it can be used as a common standard against which school assessments can be compared. When assessment marks are moderated, students maintain their assessment rank but may be given a different assessment mark. If you are ranked second in your school assessment, you will receive the second highest moderated assessment mark.

Only assessment marks are moderated; you will always keep your own examination mark.

Examination marks

Your exam mark will depend on how well you perform in the exam and is independent of your assessment marks. You keep your own exam mark, regardless of your performance in your assessments.

Your performance in each of your HSC course exams is measured against standards defined by NESA. Depending on how well you meet these standards, your raw examination mark will be aligned to one of six performance bands.

For a 2-unit course, Band 6 indicates the highest level of performance. Students who reach this standard will receive an exam mark between 90 and 100. It's this aligned exam mark that's reported on your Record of Achievement.

Your HSC Record of Achievement

Your HSC Record of Achievement will show your examination mark, assessment mark, HSC mark and performance band for each HSC course you've completed. You won't be given a single, overall score for your combined courses.

Below is an example of how your marks will be shown on your Record of Achievement.

2.3 YOUR ATAR

Your ATAR is a rank, not a mark out of 100. It's a number between 0.00 and 99.95 with increments of 0.05. It provides a measure of your overall academic achievement in relation to that of other students and helps universities rank applicants for selection into their courses.

ATARs are calculated in each state to reflect a student's rank against other students in their state. An ATAR of 85.00 in NSW or the ACT is equivalent to an ATAR of 85.00 in other states.

In NSW, the ATAR is calculated and released by UAC. In the ACT, it's calculated by the ACT Board of Senior Secondary Studies and released by schools.

Scaling

Just as individual units of different currencies are not of equal value (eg £1 is not the same as \$1), marks in different courses can't be compared because the courses are completely different. But just as exchange rates allow us to compare the value of different currencies, the scaling process allows us to compare marks in different courses properly and fairly.

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

HSC marks, ATARs and selection ranks are all different things.

– HSC mark

Your HSC mark is a combination of your exam mark and moderated assessment mark for each course. You will also be notified of the performance band you have achieved for each course.

– ATAR

Your ATAR is a rank (not a mark) based on your position compared to other students in the state.

– Selection rank

Your selection rank is your ATAR + any selection rank adjustments for which you are eligible. (Find out more about selection rank adjustments in section 5.2.) The lowest selection rank for a course will be the lowest selection rank of an applicant who receives an offer to that course.

Courses are scaled using the mean scores and distribution of marks, which indicate the ability of the students taking the course, not the perceived difficulty of the course:

- If a course has a high scaled mean it tells us that, on average, the ability of the students in that course is high – in general, they did well in their other courses. Courses such as Mathematics Extension 2 and Physics usually have high scaled means because they're studied by high-achieving students.
- If a course has a low scaled mean it tells us that the ability of the students in that course ranges from high to low. (It **doesn't** mean that you can't get a high ATAR if you study that course.)

Your scaled mark in a course will be influenced by your position in the course and the scaled mean for that course. The example below shows a set of HSC and scaled marks corresponding to results at the 90th percentile for each course.

Your scaled marks, not your HSC marks, will be used to calculate your ATAR. In this example, even though the highest HSC mark was for Society and Culture, it won't be included in the ATAR calculation. This is because in NSW the ATAR is calculated using the scaled marks from 2 units of English (even if they are your lowest units, as in this example) plus the next

best 8 units (to make 10 units in total), and in this example, Society and Culture has the lowest scaled mark of all the courses (apart from English).

Scaled marks are not reported to students.

English courses

In NSW, it's mandatory for 2 units of English to be included in the ATAR.

The NSW ATAR is calculated using the scaled marks from your best 2 units of English, plus your next 8 best units. If you're studying additional English units and they're among your next 8 best units, they will also be used in your ATAR calculation.

In 2019, English Studies is a Category B course and can be included in the ATAR calculation.

Mathematics courses

Up to 4 units of calculus-based maths can be included in the ATAR calculation. Mathematics Extension 1 has a different weighting (in terms of units) depending on if it's paired with Mathematics or Mathematics Extension 2.

If you study Mathematics (2 units), then Mathematics Extension 1 counts for 1 unit.

If you study Mathematics Extension 2 (2 units), then Mathematics Extension 1 counts for 2 units. This is calculated by doubling the mark you receive for the 1-unit course.

If you complete Mathematics then go on to satisfactorily complete Mathematics Extension 1 and Mathematics Extension 2, your results in Mathematics will not be included in your ATAR calculation, even if you've excelled in it.

Mathematics Standard 1 is a Category B course and can be included in your ATAR calculation.

BUSTING THE ATAR MYTHS

As you can see, calculating the ATAR is a complex process, and as a result there are some myths and misunderstandings. Here are some of the more common ones, along with the correct information.

Myth

Some courses are always 'scaled up', so I should take these courses. Some courses are always 'scaled down', so I shouldn't take these courses.

Fact

Marks are scaled according to a course's scaled mean. The scaled mean indicates the academic ability of the course candidature, which can change from year to year. For most courses, your scaled mark will be lower than your HSC mark. To get the best possible position and maximise your scaled marks, select the courses you'll do best in.

Myth

I need to study 'hard' subjects to get high scaled marks.

Fact

'Hard' is a subjective term. What is hard for one student could be easy for another. Students who achieve an ATAR of 99.95 study a large variety of subjects. You should choose the courses in which you feel you'll perform the best.

Myth

I should study Mathematics Standard 2 rather than Mathematics to get a better ATAR.

Fact

It's very difficult to predict which course will lead to a higher scaled mark. Your scaled mark depends on the scaled mean of the course and your position in the course. Some university courses have prerequisites or assumed knowledge of Mathematics, so choose the level of maths that best suits your plans for further study.

Accumulated courses

Courses can be accumulated for the ATAR over a period of up to five years. Scaled marks are calculated in the year you complete the course and the scaled mark can be included in your ATAR calculation when you become ATAR eligible.

Repeated courses

You'll be considered to be repeating an HSC course if you:

- repeat the same course
- study a different course in the same subject area, apart from an extension course.

If you repeat a course, only the marks for your latest satisfactory attempt will be available for inclusion in the calculation of your ATAR, even if they're lower than your earlier attempt.

You will receive an ATAR the first year you satisfy the eligibility requirements. If you complete additional courses or repeat courses, your ATAR will be recalculated. Your most recent ATAR will be the one used by tertiary institutions for selection purposes.

Re-marked HSC papers

If NESA provides UAC with amended HSC results, your ATAR will automatically be recalculated and UAC will notify you by email.

2.4 LIMITED ATAR


A Limited ATAR is calculated using the scaled marks from at least 1 unit of English plus the best 4 other units of Category A courses, rather than the best 10 units used for the standard ATAR.

Some institutions will assess applicants based on the Limited ATAR, along with other selection criteria.

To be eligible for a Limited ATAR, you must:

- be **over 20 years of age** on 1 March in the year you complete your HSC studies
- have taken between 5 and 9 units of ATAR courses, including at least 1 unit of English
- have completed all courses in the same academic year. You can't accumulate courses over several years.

Below is an example of an ATAR notification.

2.5 RECEIVING YOUR ATAR

You can access your ATAR or Limited ATAR by logging in to the UAC website or the My UAC app from mid-December 2019. To log in, you'll need your Year 12 student number and your UAC PIN.

When you view your ATAR, you'll be able to see a list of the ATAR courses you studied and their category, and the number of units of each ATAR course that contributed to the calculation of your ATAR. You'll also be able to download your official ATAR Advice Notice.

If you receive an ATAR between 0.00 and 30.00, your ATAR will appear as '30 or less'. If you haven't met the requirements of the ATAR, your ATAR will be recorded as 'not eligible'.

If you have a query about your ATAR, you can call UAC's ATAR Enquiry Centre, which operates when ATARs are released.

ATARs are only accessible by individual students or their authorised agents. ATARs are also released to institutions for the purpose of making offers to courses. UAC doesn't provide ATARs to parents, schools or careers advisers.

2.6 HSC AND ATAR: WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

HSC marks and the ATAR are two different measures of achievement. HSC marks tell you about your performance, whereas your ATAR tells you about your position, or ranking.

They are calculated separately using different methods.

The table below outlines the main differences between your HSC marks and your ATAR.

Your HSC marks	Your ATAR
Provide information about how well you've performed in each of the courses you've completed.	Provides information about where you're positioned overall in relation to other students.
Indicate your performance in the courses you've studied.	Allows you to be compared with other students who have completed different combinations of courses.
Are reported against standards.	Is a rank, not a mark.
Are provided by the NSW Education Standards Authority.	Is provided by UAC.

Most HSC marks lie between 50 and 100, and the middle students in most courses receive a mark between 70 and 80. Students who achieve marks in the mid-70s may get an ATAR of around 70.00 but sometimes HSC marks in the 70s can mean a much lower ATAR, depending on the courses and the student's position in those courses.

A high level of performance in their HSC courses does not guarantee the student a high position in those courses.

Consider, as an example, Fred and Laura, who completed the same HSC courses in the same year. Fred received an HSC mark of 70 in each course, while Laura received an HSC mark of 80 in each course.

Their HSC marks in each course differ by only 10, yet their ATARs differ by 20.4. Their performance was similar but their positions (reflected by their percentiles) were quite different.

Laura's ATAR is similar to her HSC marks while Fred's ATAR is much lower than his HSC marks. This is because Laura's percentiles (her positions) in her courses are much better than Fred's.

The percentile column in this table tells us about their positions in more detail. For example, Laura's mark of 80 in Biology positioned her in the 66th percentile, which means she is placed in the top 34 per cent of students. Fred's mark of 70 is in the 33rd percentile, so he's only in the top 67 per cent of students. Even though Fred and Laura's performance in Biology differed by only 10 marks, their positions varied by 33.

FAQS ABOUT THE ATAR

Why is my ATAR low compared with my HSC marks?

It's a mistake to compare your HSC marks and your ATAR, as they're different measures of achievement – performance (HSC) and position (ATAR).

There's no general rule for the relationship between these two measures. However, if you are in the middle group of students in all your courses (with marks typically in the mid-70s), you may get an ATAR of around 70.00, which is usually close to the middle ATAR. But sometimes marks in the 70s can mean a much lower ATAR depending on your courses and your position in those courses. See the example of Fred and Laura on page 13.

If I am ranked third in my class but get the highest exam mark, will that exam mark be given to the student ranked first?

No. You'll keep your own exam mark and your own assessment rank. When your school's assessment marks are moderated, you may be given a different assessment mark depending on the exam results of the other students in your course, but you'll keep your rank. Your exam mark will depend on how well you perform in the exam and is not affected by your assessment rank.

Why do some courses scale better than others?

Courses are scaled using the mean scores and distribution of marks, which indicate the ability of the course candidature (ie all students studying that course). Courses such as Mathematics Extension 2 and Physics traditionally scale well because of this. However, you need to achieve high HSC marks to gain any benefit from scaling.

What happens if I do not 'satisfactorily complete' a course?

'Satisfactory completion' is described in section 2.1. If you do not satisfactorily complete a course, that course will not count towards meeting your ATAR requirements. If the course is a 2-unit course with an associated extension course in which you are enrolled, the extension course will not count either.

Receiving a mark for a course on your Record of Achievement issued by NESA is an indication that you have satisfactorily completed that course.

How many units of maths can be included in the calculation of the ATAR?

Up to 4 units of maths can be included in the ATAR calculation. If you study Mathematics Extension 1 you should be aware that it has a different weighting (in terms of units) depending on whether you take Mathematics or Mathematics Extension 2. Read 'Mathematics courses' on page 11.

Can my ATAR be recalculated?

Generally speaking no, but there are some instances in which your ATAR will be recalculated:

- if NESA provides amended HSC results
- if you complete additional courses in subsequent years
- if you repeat courses in subsequent years.

If your ATAR is recalculated you will receive a new ATAR notification.

Are schools notified of ATARs?

No. UAC does not release ATAR information to schools. ATARs are released only to the individual student and the institutions to which that student has applied.

NOTES

- 1 You can study both Ancient History and Modern History, but there is only one History Extension course. It is considered a course within the subject of either Modern History or Ancient History.
- 2 The unit value of this course changes depending on whether the course is taken in combination with Mathematics or Mathematics Extension 2.
- 3 You must study Music 2 if you wish to study HSC Music Extension.
- 4 You may study either Studies of Religion I or Studies of Religion II, but not both.

3 CHOOSING YOUR COURSES

3.1 THE BIG QUESTIONS

There are many different institutions to choose from when you are thinking about tertiary study. UAC has 27 participating institutions offering more than 2,000 undergraduate courses to domestic students and 19 participating institutions offering more than 1,500 courses to international students.

This section explains where you can get answers to some of the most important questions to ask yourself when choosing your courses.

What courses are available?

Refer to each institution's entry for a list of courses.

If you have an idea of the area you'd like to study but aren't sure what courses you can study, or where, use the Course Finder on page 215. Here you'll find two course indexes: the cross-referenced index links subjects to main areas of study. You can look up a general area of interest to find the related main area of study. Then go to the main areas of study index to find a list of related courses.

For the latest information about courses you can apply for through UAC, use the course search on the UAC website or the My UAC app.

How do I choose the right course for me?

It can be overwhelming trying to figure out what you want to study, and what career path is right for you. Here are a few things to keep in mind:

- What are you interested in? What subjects do you most enjoy and do well in at school? Choosing something that you're good at and interested in is the first step towards doing well at university.
- Investigate the jobs that use these subjects as key parts of what they do.
- Do some work experience. Consider volunteering at a workplace to see if you enjoy it.
- If you're in Australia, visit careers expos and open days where you can meet and talk to staff from universities and colleges, prospective employers or recruiters. If you're overseas, find out when each institution will be running information sessions in your home country.
- Consider areas of job growth and skills shortages.
- Beware of peer pressure (eg picking a course just because your friends are), family expectations (eg choosing a course because you think it's what your parents want), lack of direction (eg selecting a course because it looks easy or is close to home) and misguided perceptions (eg not wanting to 'waste' a high ATAR).
- Take a look at Course Compass, UAC's course-finding tool. It can show you the study paths taken by people with an academic background similar to yours. Go to uac.edu.au/coursecompass.

What jobs could I get with this degree?

On the UAC website you'll find course descriptions that include examples of jobs and careers graduates could pursue – you might be surprised by the options available to you. For information about other places to find careers information and advice, read section 3.3.

What do I need to get in?

To be eligible to be considered for a course you need to:

- meet the admission criteria of the institution offering the course. You can find these in each institution's entry on the UAC website at uac.edu.au/institutions.
- fulfil the entrance requirements of your chosen course. Some have course prerequisites or additional selection criteria – these details can be found in the course descriptions on UAC's website via uac.edu.au/search.

What are my chances of getting in?

Selection is a competitive process and your chances of being offered a place in your chosen course depend on how well you meet its selection criteria. Selection into most courses is based primarily on your selection rank (ATAR plus adjustment factors). Some courses also assess additional criteria, such as interviews, assessments or portfolios.

Course descriptions show, where relevant, the lowest ATAR and lowest selection rank that previously resulted in an offer to each course. Use these as a guide only to your chances of being selected for the course for semester 1, 2020. Be aware that the lowest selection rank includes the applicant's ATAR and any applicable selection rank adjustments; the applicant may not have received an offer if they hadn't been eligible for those adjustments.

Some institutions provide a guaranteed ATAR or selection rank instead of a lowest selection rank. If you achieve this ATAR or selection rank you will receive an offer to the course. Other institutions provide an estimated selection rank.

What if I'm not eligible for a course?

If you don't meet the entry requirements for your chosen course/s, you can select pathway courses as your preferences.

Some institutions may make a slipback offer to a pathway course if you're not eligible or competitive enough to receive an offer to a course you've applied to.

Read section 5.3 for information about pathway courses through UAC.

Does the course have additional selection criteria or special requirements?

Some courses have additional selection criteria you're required to meet to be considered for entry. These could include a personal written statement, a questionnaire, a portfolio of work, an audition, an interview or a test. For details, read the course descriptions via uac.edu.au/search.

There are also special conditions for students enrolling in health- and welfare-related courses and teacher education courses: read section 3.2 below.

3.2 SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS AND POLICIES

Special requirements and policies apply to students in health- and welfare-related courses and teacher education courses.

These requirements relate to:

- clinical/internship placements undertaken as part of your course
- proof of English language proficiency
- accreditation and procedures for employment after you have completed the course.

Note that requirements and policies in these areas are subject to regular review.

Teacher education courses

Requirements for students intending to teach in NSW schools

For accreditation as a teacher in NSW, graduates will need to meet requirements set by the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA). Students entering accredited teaching programs need to have achieved a minimum of three Band 5s, one of which must be in English, in their HSC or meet a comparable academic standard early in the program.

Check with individual institutions for further information on academic and non-academic entry requirements for particular teaching programs and other approved pathways to study if you do not meet these requirements.

Literacy and numeracy test for initial teacher education students

All initial teacher education students will need to meet the benchmark set by the national Literacy and Numeracy Test for Initial Teacher Education Students prior to their final professional experience placement and graduation. Read further information about the test at aitsl.edu.au.

Background checking processes

If you intend to engage in child-related work, you must hold a valid Working With Children Check clearance. Visit the Office of the Children's Guardian website at kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au for more information.

Additionally, you must be employment screened before beginning an internship or associate teacher program in schools. This may involve providing a Working With Children Check clearance number and completing other employment screening requirements. Visit teach.nsw.edu.au for details. If you do not meet these requirements, you may not be able to undertake practical course requirements in NSW schools.

Health- and welfare-related courses

Criminal record checks

In accordance with NSW Health policy, students who need to complete clinical placements in the NSW public health system are required to:

- obtain a National Criminal Record Check before they commence clinical placements in NSW Health facilities
- sign a Code of Conduct Agreement stating that they will abide by the NSW Health Code of Conduct.

To ensure you provide the correct documentation, search for 'clinical placements' at heti.nsw.gov.au or health.nsw.gov.au.

Infectious diseases

Students who need to complete clinical training in NSW public health facilities are subject to NSW Health requirements for healthcare workers to demonstrate their protection against specified infectious diseases in the first year of their course: search for 'clinical placements' at health.nsw.gov.au.

There are other restrictions on clinical practice of healthcare workers with certain blood-borne viruses. For more information, search for 'HIV, Hepatitis B or Hepatitis C – Health Care Workers Infected' at health.nsw.gov.au/policies.

If you do not comply with the above requirements relating to criminal record checks and infectious diseases, you will not be permitted to attend your clinical placement in the NSW health system and progress in your course may be affected.

Nursing and midwifery courses: English language proficiency

In your path to becoming a nurse or midwife in Australia you may have to provide proof of proficiency in English in the following instances.

When you apply through UAC for admission to your course

If you have undertaken your studies in an overseas country, you may have to provide proof of proficiency in English. Most institutions have many ways for you to provide proof of English language proficiency. You can find information on which tests and qualifications are acceptable on UAC's website at uac.edu.au/elp.

When you apply for registration as a nurse or midwife

If you are applying for the first time in Australia for registration as a nurse or a midwife, you are required to show English language proficiency. You must meet the English language skills registration standard of the Nursing and Midwifery Board (NMBA). For more information, visit the NMBA website at nursingmidwiferyboard.gov.au.

3.3 WHERE TO GO FOR MORE INFORMATION

There are many places you can go to research career information and seek advice.

UAC's participating institutions

Read the course descriptions on the UAC website via uac.edu.au/search for a list of possible career opportunities for your chosen courses and contact the careers service at individual institutions.

School careers advisers

The careers adviser at your school can give you careers advice and information.

Professional organisations

Find careers information from societies, institutes or associations for each profession. You can search industry organisations online. Some tertiary institutions list professional organisations on their websites.

4 YOUR APPLICATION

4.1 APPLYING THROUGH UAC

You can apply through UAC as a domestic student if you're:

- an Australian or New Zealand citizen
- a permanent resident of Australia
- the holder of an Australian permanent resident humanitarian visa.

If you're an international student you can apply through UAC if you are undertaking one of the following qualifications in 2019:

- an Australian Year 12 in Australia
- an Australian Year 12 outside Australia
- an International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma
- a New Zealand National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA) Level 3.

Other international students can apply directly to the institution: contact the institutions to which you intend to apply as soon as possible. Each institution has its own application procedures and admission criteria.

PROSPECTIVE PERMANENT RESIDENTS

If you are granted permanent resident status **after you have applied** to UAC as an international applicant, you must apply again through UAC as a domestic undergraduate applicant. You must also write to the Senior Operations Officer at UAC as soon as possible to explain your change in status and provide a verified copy of your current passport.

If your status changes **after you receive an offer**, you must speak with the individual institution concerned.

Every year, more than 50,000 Year 12 students apply for uni through UAC. Applying through UAC means you don't need to apply separately to each institution. It also means you can apply for early offer schemes processed through UAC (Schools Recommendation Schemes) and, if you're a domestic applicant, Educational Access Schemes.

Through these schemes, the institutions are able to consider factors in addition to your ATAR, such as your Year 11 results and any educational disadvantages you have experienced. Read more about them in section 5.6.

UAC processes the applications but the institutions decide who receives an offer of a place. UAC's participating institutions are listed on the back cover.

Applying directly to the uni

Some of our participating institutions also take direct applications, which you can have in addition to your UAC application. If you complete both a UAC application and a direct application, make sure you don't duplicate your course preferences. If you do, you will be automatically assessed as 'not eligible' for an offer to that course in your UAC application. This ensures you don't receive two offers to the same course. So make the most of both applications and choose different preferences in each.

If you receive an offer through your direct application, you can still receive an offer through your UAC application. Check with the uni as to how and when it will make its direct offers. You can read about UAC offers in section 6, 'Offers and enrolment'.

4.2 WHEN DO I APPLY?

Applications open on Wednesday 3 April 2019.

Early closing dates

Some courses, particularly those with additional selection criteria, have early closing dates. You can't select a course after it has closed.

Early closing dates are indicated in the course search on the UAC website and in the My UAC app.

What if I'm still deciding which courses to choose?

It's best to apply before midnight on Monday 30 September 2019 to avoid the increase to the processing charge. It doesn't matter if you're not sure which courses to apply for – you can change your preferences as many times as you want before preference deadlines.

Note that many courses won't be available to be selected when applications open in April. They will be added when details have been confirmed. If your course is not available, simply select one course to complete your application – it's quick, easy and free to change your preferences later.

We'll keep you posted on new courses as they become available – check UAC's course search at uac.edu.au/search or the My UAC app regularly.

4.3 HOW DO I APPLY?

To apply, go to the UAC website and select 'Apply or log in' at the top right of the screen. If you are a domestic student, select 'Undergraduate application'. If you are an international student, select 'International application'. A series of questions and prompts will guide you through the application process.

AUSTRALIAN GOVERNMENT REQUIREMENTS FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

There are several requirements international students must meet to study in Australia.

Student visa requirements

To study in Australia you need to apply for a student visa. A student visa allows you to come to Australia for a specified period to study at an educational institution. To be eligible for a student visa, you need to meet the conditions set by the Australian Government's Department of Home Affairs.

At the time of making your student visa application, you must have a Confirmation of Enrolment from an education provider.

You will receive a Confirmation of Enrolment from an institution after you accept your offer and send your payment. For further information, refer to the institution entries at uac.edu.au/institutions.

To find out more about student visa requirements, visit 'Visas' at immi.homeaffairs.gov.au.

Students under 18 years of age

If you will be under 18 years of age when you arrive in Australia to study, special requirements are in place. Before you are granted a student visa, the Australian Government must be satisfied that you have appropriate accommodation, support and general welfare arrangements in place for the period that you will be under 18 years of age while in Australia.

Each institution decides whether they will accept responsibility for welfare arrangements for international students who are under 18 years of age. Check the institution information at uac.edu.au/institutions.

Overseas Student Health Cover

Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) is insurance for international students to help them with the costs of medical and hospital care they may require while they are in Australia. However, OSHC does not cover dental treatment. As dental services in Australia are expensive, you should have your teeth checked and any necessary dental work completed before you leave home.

The Australian Government requires all international students on a student visa and their dependants to purchase an approved OSHC policy from an Australian registered health fund for the duration of their visas. OSHC is not included in tuition fees.

Belgian, Norwegian and some Swedish students are not required to purchase OSHC as part of their visa requirements; they are considered to have met 'adequate insurance' requirements due to a reciprocal arrangement between their country and the Australian Government.

Many institutions have arrangements with preferred OSHC providers. Read the institution entries at uac.edu.au/institutions for more information. Students, however, are free to choose their own health cover provider. A list of OSHC providers, together with general information about OSHC, is available from the Private Health Insurance Ombudsman website. Search 'OSHC' at privatehealth.gov.au.

How do I organise OSHC?

You must organise and pay for OSHC before you arrive in Australia. Once you receive an unconditional offer to study at an Australian educational institution, you will be required to pay your OSHC charge at the same time that you pay your tuition fee deposit.

You can arrange to pay for your OSHC through your educational institution or you can choose your own OSHC provider from another Australian registered private health insurer.



You'll need to agree to a declaration – you can read the printed version on page 28.

To start your application you'll need your Year 12 student number and UAC PIN (this will be emailed to you on 3 April).

Enter your full name as it appears on your official ID (ie birth certificate, passport or citizenship documents).

Once you've entered these details, you'll be given a nine-digit UAC application number. You'll need this number to log in to your UAC application to update details, change preferences, check for messages and view offers.

To make the application process as quick and easy as possible, make sure you have the following within reach:

- your Year 12 student number and UAC PIN
- a list of your chosen courses and their course codes
- your UCAT (University Clinical Aptitude Test) or International Student Admission Test (ISAT) candidate number, if relevant
- a credit card (MasterCard or Visa) or PayPal account to pay the processing fee. Domestic Year 12 students can also 'commit to pay' using BPAY or Post BillPay.

If you wish to apply to a course at one of the institutions listed in Part 3, apply directly to the institution. You cannot apply through UAC.

Only one application

You can submit only one application through UAC for undergraduate courses starting in semester 1, 2020.

If you change your mind about the courses you've selected, you can replace or re-order them at any time before offer round closing dates by logging in to your application through the UAC website. Read section 4.11, 'Changing your course preferences', to find out how.

Questions or problems?

If you have any questions about your application, admission criteria or course details, it's best to ask.

To talk to someone about your application, call UAC on 1300 275 822 or (02) 9752 0200 (from mobiles), Monday to Friday between 8.30am and 4.30pm Sydney time. Alternatively, you can send your question via the enquiry form at uac.edu.au/contact, or send us a message on Facebook or Twitter.

Queries about admission criteria or course details should be directed to the relevant institution. See the back cover of this Guide for contact details.

4.4 SELECTING YOUR COURSE PREFERENCES

Domestic applicants can select up to five courses in their UAC application, and international applicants can select up to six.

Take some time to think about the courses you've chosen. First on the list should be the course you'd most like to do, followed by your second preference, then third, and so on.

You can change the order of your preferences – or even the courses you've selected – as often as you like before the closing dates for each offer round.

If there is more than one start date for a course, you'll need to select your preferred start date. You can apply for the same course with multiple start dates, however each start date counts as a separate preference.

Most undergraduate courses are Commonwealth-supported place or domestic fee-paying courses. For information about the different types of courses and their costs, read section 7, 'Course costs and financial assistance'.

Are all my preferences given equal consideration?

Yes. If you're not selected for your first preference, you'll be considered equally with all other eligible applicants for your second preference and so on.

Your chance of being selected for a course is not decreased because you placed it as a lower order preference. Similarly, you won't be selected for a course just because you entered that course as a higher order preference.

For example: Anna, James and Sarah all applied for B Accounting. Anna put it as her fourth preference, while James and Sarah listed it as their first preference. Anna missed out on offers to her first, second and third preferences but was a more competitive candidate for B Accounting than both James and Sarah. So, Anna received an offer to B Accounting (her fourth preference) while James and Sarah did not, despite them listing it first.

4.5 AUTHORISING SOMEONE TO ACT ON YOUR BEHALF

Your application and all the information within it is confidential. For privacy reasons, we cannot discuss information relating to your application with anyone but you.

If you wish, you can authorise another person to act on your behalf and speak to UAC about your application. To do so, select this option when you first apply.

To authorise someone to act on your behalf after you've applied, submit an email enquiry and include the details of the person you are authorising.

For international applicants, this person can be a different person or the same person as the agent/representative who may be helping you with your application and visa formalities. Read 'Agent-assisted applications' on the next page.

The person you authorise cannot accept an offer on your behalf. For details on how to authorise someone to accept an offer on your behalf, contact the relevant institution.

Agent-assisted applications

If you're an international applicant, you may be applying through an agent. When you apply you will be asked to enter your agent's unique identification code (UACID) for each institution you apply for; your agent will have this. You can add, change or delete your agent's UACID later, if you need to.

Your agent will be able to access information about your application through UAC's website; for example, they will be able to view the courses you list and the offers you receive.

4.6 SERVICES FOR APPLICANTS WITH A DISABILITY

If you have a disability or an ongoing illness that may disadvantage you during your studies, we encourage you to include this information in your application. Any information you provide will not affect your application for admission; it will be seen only by disability services staff and will help the institution meet your education needs should you be offered a place in one of their courses.

Institutions may be able to provide note takers, personal readers, examination provisions, learning assistance, alternative assessment methods and academic material in alternative formats. Some institutions may provide parking for holders of Roads and Maritime Services Mobility Parking Scheme permits.

Speak to disability services staff at the institution for information and advice about preparing for study. For contact details and more information about services provided, visit uac.edu.au/disability.

The Get Ready for Uni website has information on making the move from school to university when you have a disability: westernsydney.edu.au/getreadyforuni.

If you have a disability and you're having trouble applying through UAC, call us on 1300 275 822 or (02) 9752 0200 (from mobiles), Monday to Friday between 8.30am and 4.30pm Sydney time, and we'll help you through the application process.

4.7 YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES AS AN APPLICANT

When you apply through UAC, you have certain responsibilities.

By meeting your responsibilities you will ensure that your application will be processed and assessed as soon as possible.

You must:

- read the instructions before submitting your application
- read the relevant parts of this Guide or corresponding information on UAC's website

Keep your UAC PIN private – it can be used to view your ATAR and change your application.

APPLYING INTERSTATE

Applications for most undergraduate courses in other Australian states are processed through the tertiary admissions centres in that state – see the next column for details.

Application processes and fees vary, so visit the relevant state's tertiary admissions centre or institution website for further information. The Australian Government's Course Seeker website provides details of all undergraduate courses – and the institutions that offer them – across Australia: courseseeker.edu.au.

Like UAC, most tertiary admissions centres increase their processing charges at the end of September, so apply early to avoid higher charges and ensure you can apply for your chosen course.

Northern Territory and South Australia

Applications are made through the South Australian Tertiary Admissions Centre (SATAC) – visit satac.edu.au.

Queensland

Applications are made through the Queensland Tertiary Admissions Centre (QTAC) – visit qtac.edu.au.

Tasmania

There is no centralised admissions centre in Tasmania. Applications to the University of Tasmania are made online at utas.edu.au/admissions. Applications to Australian Maritime College (AMC) are made through UAC – visit uac.edu.au.

Victoria

Applications are made through the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC) – visit vtac.edu.au.

Western Australia

Applications are made through the Tertiary Institutions Service Centre (TISC) – visit tisc.edu.au. Applications for the University of Notre Dame should be made directly to nd.edu.au.

- follow any institution-specific instructions
- provide true and complete information in connection with your application
- provide true and complete copies of official documentation with your application where requested
- accept the conditions set out in the online declaration – read the printed version on page 28.

If you're an international applicant, you must also:

- satisfy your student visa conditions by maintaining full-time enrolment in your course, satisfactory class attendance and course progress
- remain with the same university where you originally enrolled for at least the first six (6) months of your principal course except under certain circumstances outlined in Part D of the National Code. (For more information, view the 'Standards' section at internationaleducation.gov.au/regulatory-information.)
- maintain your Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for the period of your stay
- if you are under 18, maintain your approved accommodation, support and general welfare arrangements
- inform your institution if you change your address
- provide details of your passport upon acceptance of an offer
- ensure you have sufficient financial capacity to support your study and stay in Australia
- return home immediately upon completion of your course or expiration of your visa.

By meeting your responsibilities you will ensure that your application will be processed and assessed as soon as possible.

If you fail to meet your responsibilities

UAC may cancel your application and/or institutions may withdraw any place offered if at any stage you have submitted an application that contains information that UAC or a participating institution determines to be untrue or incomplete. For further information, read the policy statement on page 28.

If you are an international student and have breached your student visa conditions by failing to maintain full-time enrolment or satisfactory course progress, the institution will notify you and the Australian Government. This may result in your visa being cancelled immediately.

4.8 PAYING FOR YOUR APPLICATION

You're required to pay a fee to lodge your UAC application. How much you pay depends on when you apply – the processing charge increases after 30 September 2019.

Apply as early as you can to avoid the higher fees. See page 8 for a full list of UAC charges.

These charges are not refundable under any circumstances, except as required by law, and cannot be transferred from one admissions period to another.

Your application is not complete until you've paid the processing charge. Save the payment receipt with your Confirmation of Application as proof of payment.

4.9 YOUR UAC APPLICATION NUMBER AND UAC PIN

You'll need your Year 12 student number and UAC PIN to start your application. When you apply, you'll be issued with a UAC application number.

Your UAC application number

You will be emailed your UAC application number when you apply. It will also be recorded on your Confirmation of Application. Keep it handy, as you'll need it to log in to and manage your application and to view your offer/s.

Lost it?

Check your Confirmation of Application or call UAC.

Your UAC Personal Identification Number (PIN)

You'll need your UAC PIN to access your ATAR, to apply for courses, to log in to your application to update or change details and, finally, to view your offer/s. It's a good idea to change your UAC PIN once you've submitted your application. Keep your UAC PIN in a safe place and don't give it to anyone else.

2019 NSW HSC applicants and ACT Year 12

applicants: You'll receive your UAC PIN by email on 3 April 2019.

All other applicants: Your UAC PIN is the first four digits of your date of birth (eg if your birthday is 3 October, your UAC PIN is 0310; if your birthday is 17 May, your UAC PIN is 1705).

Lost it?

- Check you're using your UAC PIN and not your NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) PIN by mistake.
- Go to the application login page, click the 'Forgotten your PIN?' link and follow the prompts to reset your PIN.

4.10 SO, WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

Your Confirmation of Application

After you've applied through UAC, you'll be able to download your Confirmation of Application. Check this carefully to make sure everything in your application is correct. If you need to change your contact details or course preferences, or add study that you didn't originally include, log in to your application on UAC's website.

For other changes, notify UAC in writing as soon as possible.

Additional selection criteria

Depending on the courses you are applying for, you may need to provide a personal statement, complete a questionnaire, submit a portfolio of work, attend an audition or interview or complete a test. Details of any additional selection criteria are provided in the individual course descriptions on UAC's website and in the My UAC app.

Your Year 12 results

You do not have to provide your results to UAC as we obtain them directly from the relevant Australian body or the New Zealand Qualifications Authority.

However, you must authorise the release of your International Baccalaureate Diploma to UAC. Ask your school's IB Diploma coordinator to request this on your behalf.

Providing documents

If you need to provide any documents to UAC in support of your application, you'll be told in your Confirmation of Application, which you'll be prompted to download when you complete your application.

While most Year 12 students don't have to provide any documents to support their application, you'll be encouraged to supply documentary evidence of your Australian citizenship in order to speed up the admission and enrolment process if you receive an offer. For examples of the documents that we'll accept, go to uac.edu.au/documents.

LOCK IN YOUR PREFERENCES

After any round, whether you receive an offer or not, you can change your preferences for the next offer round up until the closing date.

For example, after December Round 2, you can change your preferences for January Round 1 until midnight Sunday 5 January 2020.

After January Round 1, you can change your preferences for January Round 2 until midnight Monday 20 January 2020.

For further information about offer rounds, read section 6.

Documents will need to be uploaded to UAC's website by logging in to your application, or some can be sent in hard copy to the UAC office. This will be made clear in the instructions included in your confirmation package.

Correspondence from UAC

You'll need to provide a current email address when you apply so that UAC can contact you about your application. Don't use a school email account.

Some email accounts might send emails from UAC to your junk folder. Add the domain **uac.edu.au** to your list of safe email contacts to stop this from happening. It's your responsibility to check your emails regularly (including in your junk folder) for any messages from UAC.

To update or change your contact details, log in to your application.

Tracking your application

You can track the progress of your application throughout the assessment process by logging in to your application. You'll be able to see when UAC has received your results and finalised the assessment of your qualifications, and if there are any issues preventing you from receiving an offer to your preferences.

4.11 CHANGING YOUR COURSE PREFERENCES

You can change your course preferences by logging in to your application on the UAC website or in the My UAC app (select the 'Change your preferences' option). You'll need your UAC application number and UAC PIN.

Closing dates for changing preferences

You can add, delete or change the order of your preferences as many times as you like until change of preference closing dates for each offer round. See the key offer dates tables on the inside front cover.

Remember that some courses have early closing dates, which means you must have that course as a preference by the course closing date. To find out if a course has an early closing date, refer to the course description on the UAC website or in the My UAC app.

4.12 CANCELLING YOUR APPLICATION

If you wish to cancel your UAC application, you must do so in writing and send it to UAC, Locked Bag 112, Silverwater NSW 2128. Remember to include your UAC application number.

Please note: UAC will not under any circumstances refund charges or fees paid, except as required by law.

FAQS ABOUT APPLYING

How many times can I apply?

You can apply once in each admissions period. If you change your mind about the courses you'd like to apply for in this period, you can easily change them by logging in to your application on UAC's website or through the My UAC app – read section 4.11.

If you have applied to UAC in a previous admissions period, you will need to start a new application. You cannot use your previous UAC application number and PIN.

How many courses can I choose?

Domestic applicants can choose up to five course preferences. International applicants can choose up to six course preferences – read section 4.4.

How long does it take to apply?

It should take you about 30 minutes to apply.

Why is my connection slow?

Your application should load quickly but will be slower if:

- you are applying close to or on a closing date
- you are applying during the peak usage period (4pm to 10pm Sydney time)
- the speed of your modem or the bandwidth of your internet service provider's connection is insufficient.

Remember that applying will be much quicker if you do not leave your application until the last minute.

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DECLARATION AND AUTHORITY

This is a printed version of the online Declaration and Authority you will have to accept when you apply.

Your application cannot be considered unless you or the person you have authorised to act on your behalf accept all conditions set out below.

UAC collects information about you, including information you provide in this application, to assist in the assessment of your application. This information may be used as described below.

- 1 I declare that I have read and understand the questions and that all the information submitted is true and complete.
- 2 I declare that I have read and understand section 4.7 'Your responsibilities as an applicant' and the 'Policy statement on untrue or incomplete information submitted by applicants' below.
- 3 I declare that I have read and understand the section 'Collection of personal information' below.
- 4 I authorise UAC and the participating institutions to obtain available official records from any educational institution attended by me. I understand that UAC is not responsible if any institution does not provide these records.
- 5 I understand that UAC and the participating institutions may check my visa and residency status using Visa Entitlement Verification Online (VEVO), and I authorise UAC and the participating institutions to do so.
- 6 I authorise UAC to verify any information provided by me.
- 7 I authorise UAC to provide all information and documents provided with and/or obtained in connection with this application to all institutions participating in [undergraduate/international] admissions through UAC or their affiliates for any purpose connected with my possible selection, admission and/or enrolment in any course at any of those institutions or affiliates.
- 8 I authorise UAC to collect, receive, store, transfer and use any information provided by me, or any information obtained in connection with this application, and to disclose such information to all participating institutions, Universities Australia, Universities Australia member institutions, the members of the Australasian Conference of Tertiary Admissions Centres (ACTAC), the Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Authority (TEQSA), the Australian Skills Quality Authority (ASQA), state and territory governments and any other authority or tertiary educational institution either in Australia or overseas, where UAC reasonably considers it is necessary to make such disclosure.
- 9 I authorise any future educational institution I attend as a result of this application to provide all of my results from future studies to UAC or a person nominated by UAC. I authorise UAC or the nominated person to collect, receive, store, transfer and use all such information and all information in or connected with this application for research purposes. I give these authorities on condition that all information provided pursuant to them is deidentified by UAC or the nominated person.
- 10 I understand that UAC may disclose the personal information I have given in this application to the Department of Education and Training, or its successor, for the purpose of:
 - use in connection with the Higher Education Information Management System (HEIMS) and/or
 - use in connection with the National Data Collection on University Applications and Offers and/or
 - other collections as the Department of Education and Training, or its successor, may lawfully require from time to time.
- 11 I understand that UAC and the participating institutions have the right to vary or cancel an application or enrolment made on the basis of what UAC or a participating institution determines to be untrue or incomplete information from any source.
- 12 I understand that UAC, on behalf of the participating institutions, makes offers based on the information provided by me and on advice received from UAC. If a participating institution subsequently finds that the information or advice was incorrect, it may withdraw the offer.
- 13 I understand that UAC will release details of my course preferences and offers to my school/college and that I must notify UAC in writing within 7 days of applying if I do not wish these details to be released to my school/college.
- 14 I understand that information and documents provided with and/or obtained in connection with this application may be used by UAC for training, research or other purposes and that I must notify UAC in writing within 7 days of applying if I do not wish this information to be used.
- 15 I understand that all fees paid to UAC in connection with my application are not refundable under any circumstances except as required by law.

Policy statement on untrue or incomplete information submitted by applicants

UAC recognises that all decisions which affect an applicant must be made fairly using appropriate academic or other criteria as specified by the participating institutions.

Selection into courses by application to UAC is based on merit. It is the responsibility of applicants to ensure that they comply with all instructions when submitting a UAC application. The responsibilities of applicants are set out in section 4.7.

An application must be complete and correct and all attempts at academic study must be disclosed. Applicants must accept the conditions set out in the declaration and authority when they apply – read the printed version above.

UAC will review, and may take action against, anyone who submits an application that contains information that UAC or a participating institution determines to be untrue or incomplete. That application may also be cancelled.

UAC will also investigate, and may take action against, an applicant who, by any other means, has or could have achieved an advantage over other applicants.

Examples of conduct by an applicant which will be investigated by UAC include, but are not limited to:

- submitting an incomplete or falsified academic transcript
- failing to declare previous study at secondary, post-secondary or tertiary level
- submitting an incorrect or otherwise misleading statement of employment experience
- claiming special consideration of educational disadvantage based on incorrect information
- having some other person complete a selection task on the applicant's behalf such as an interview, audition or a portfolio of work

- claiming membership of a special selection group when not a member of that group.

The procedures for processing applications suspected of being in some way incomplete or untrue have been approved by the NSW Vice-Chancellors' Committee.

These procedures accept the right of applicants to be treated fairly and without prejudice, and in accordance with the principles of natural justice.

Collection of personal information

UAC collects personal information and, in some circumstances, information regarding your health, or information about someone other than yourself, for the purpose of processing your application for undergraduate admission to tertiary institutions.

If you are providing personal information about someone other than yourself, you should tell them about UAC's Privacy Policy, which can be found on UAC's website at uac.edu.au/privacy.

While your personal information is generally collected from you, UAC also collects information about you from other educational institutions that you have attended.

UAC provides your personal information and, where applicable, your health information to all institutions participating in undergraduate admissions through UAC. If you do not provide personal information where required in your application, UAC will not be able to process your application. Please contact UAC's Privacy Officer if you have any queries.

You are able to gain access to any personal information and health information that is held about you by UAC. To obtain access, or if you have any questions, write to:

5 ADMISSION CRITERIA AND SELECTION

5.1 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

There are three general requirements for being offered a place in a course. You must:

- 1 **be eligible:**
 - by meeting the academic requirements outlined in this section and the specific requirements of each institution outlined under their 'Admission criteria' at uac.edu.au/institutions
 - by meeting the specific entrance requirements of the course (eg prerequisites or additional selection criteria) set out in the course descriptions at uac.edu.au/search.
- 2 **compete against other eligible applicants**
- 3 **have paid the UAC processing charge.**

5.2 ACADEMIC CRITERIA

Tertiary institutions in Australia have found that a selection rank based on a student's overall academic achievement is the single best predictor of success in tertiary study. Therefore, they use a ranking system as the basis for selecting students. Your selection rank is your ATAR plus any applicable adjustment factors.

ATARs and selection ranks

Each course description on the UAC website will indicate, where relevant:

- the lowest ATAR (LA) previously required to receive an offer
- the lowest selection rank (LSR) previously required to receive an offer OR the ATAR required to be guaranteed an offer (guaranteed ATAR (GA)).

Some institutions also provide a guaranteed selection rank or an estimated selection rank.

Use the data provided in the course description as a guide only to your chances of being selected for the course in 2020.

Lowest ATARs and selection ranks for entry to semester 1 courses in 2020 won't be known until all offers have been made.

Lowest ATARs

Don't assume that the published lowest ATAR for a course is the ATAR you require to be made an offer to that course. The applicant who received that ATAR may have been eligible for adjustment factors and had their selection rank increased, making them eligible for an offer.

Lowest selection ranks

We used to refer to the lowest selection rank for a course as the course 'cut-off'. It includes any increase to an applicant's selection rank made as a result of adjustment factors (which used to be called 'bonus points').

Three factors determine the lowest selection rank:

- the number of places available in the course
- the number of applicants for the course
- the quality of those applicants.

These three factors mean that lowest selection ranks change from year to year and are impossible to predict before applicants are selected for a particular course in a particular year. The lowest selection rank for any course can increase, decrease or remain the same.

The lowest selection rank doesn't represent the average ability of the students accepted for the course and does not reflect the difficulty or quality of the course.

Selection rank adjustments

Many applicants receive an offer to a course even though they have an ATAR below the published lowest selection rank. Often this is because other factors have been taken into consideration in combination with their ATAR and their selection rank for that course has been adjusted and is higher than their ATAR.

These adjustments are due to factors such as performance in HSC subjects, living or attending school in a certain area, and applying for consideration through Educational Access Schemes.

Selection rank adjustments are applied differently from institution to institution and from course to course within the same institution. Visit each institution's website for details.

You need to know that:

- adjustments do not change your ATAR, they change your selection rank for a particular preference
- your selection rank = your ATAR + adjustments
- institutions automatically adjust your selection rank if you are eligible.

As selection rank adjustments are course specific, your selection rank can be different for each of your course preferences.

For example: Course A has six applicants and only three places available. The six applicants have the following selection ranks:

Applicant	Selection rank
1	89.00 (ATAR of 89.00)
2	88.00 (ATAR of 87.00 plus adjustment of 1 point)
3	87.00 (ATAR of 83.00 plus adjustment of 4 points)
4	86.00 (ATAR of 86.00)
5	85.00 (ATAR of 83.00 plus adjustment of 2 points)
6	84.00 (ATAR of 84.00)

Offers will be made to applicants 1, 2 and 3. Applicant 4 won't receive an offer, even with an ATAR higher than applicant 3, and applicant 3 will receive an offer even though their ATAR is below the lowest selection rank. The lowest selection rank required to receive an offer to Course A will be 87.00.

The example also shows that an applicant with an ATAR above the published lowest ATAR for a course will not necessarily receive an offer. The lowest ATAR for this course is 83.00 (applicant 3). Even though applicants 4, 5 and 6 have ATARs of 83.00 and above, their selection ranks are below the lowest selection rank of 87.00 and therefore they will not receive an offer.

Guaranteed ATARs and selection ranks

Some institutions indicate a guaranteed ATAR or selection rank for each course. If you achieve the guaranteed ATAR or selection rank you will be eligible for an offer to the course for semester 1, 2020.

Depending on the demand for the course, applicants with lower ATARs and selection ranks may also be eligible for offers.

Additional selection criteria

Some courses have additional selection criteria such as a personal statement, questionnaire, portfolio of work, an audition, an interview or a test, which are considered together with (or sometimes instead of) your selection rank. You can find details of any additional selection criteria in the course descriptions on the UAC website and in the My UAC app.

2019 Year 12 students with an ATAR

ATARs are calculated in each state (except Queensland) to reflect a student's rank against other students in their state. An ATAR of 85.00 in your state is equivalent to an ATAR of 85.00 in other states. For information on the ATAR in NSW, read section 2.

Prerequisites

Some courses require you to satisfy course prerequisites (HSC courses or equivalent you need to have studied) to be considered for an offer. For details of prerequisites, read the course descriptions on the UAC website or in the My UAC app.

If you're applying to NSW universities from another state, you can compare your courses and results to NSW HSC courses and results at uac.edu.au/year12-quals.

If you live in NSW or the ACT and are applying interstate, check if you meet the admission criteria of institutions in that state as they may be different to the criteria in your home state.

2019 Queensland Year 12 students

Queensland Year 12 students receive an Overall Position (OP) instead of an ATAR. To see how Queensland OPs equated to the ATAR in 2018, visit uac.edu.au/op.

Students who complete a Queensland Senior External Examination are not eligible for an OP; UAC calculates a UAC rank for these students. Refer to 'Students studying non-standard Year 12 programs' in the next column.

2019 International Baccalaureate students

2019 International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma students will receive a UAC rank derived from their IB score.

In your UAC application, you will be asked if you are completing an Australian Year 12 in 2019:

- If you are attempting the IB **in Australia** and are an Australian or New Zealand citizen (including a dual citizen), an Australian permanent resident visa holder or an Australian permanent resident humanitarian visa holder, answer 'Yes.'
- If you meet the above citizenship criteria but are sitting the IB **outside of Australia**, answer 'No.'

Ask your school IB Diploma coordinator to authorise the International Baccalaureate to release your IB Diploma results directly to UAC. This needs to be done in addition to any other request for results to be sent to an institution.

If UAC receives your results directly from the International Baccalaureate then any subject adjustment factors you are eligible for will be automatically allocated by the institutions.

Alternatively, provide a copy of your official Results Certificate and Diploma Certificate as soon as they become available. You'll also need to contact the institutions about the allocation of any subject adjustment factors for which you are eligible.

Refer to the lists of IB score/ATAR equivalences and IB subjects equivalent to NSW HSC courses at uac.edu.au/ib.

International Baccalaureate predicted grades

Some institutions may make offers based on your predicted grades if your final results will not be available for a particular offer round (eg December Round 2). Each institution has its own conditions and requirements for assessments based on predicted grades: contact the institution for details.

To have your predicted grades assessed, you will need to provide UAC with a statement from your school that meets specific requirements: visit uac.edu.au/ib for details.

Students studying non-standard Year 12 programs

Non-standard Year 12 programs of study include those completed through Australian Christian Education, Rudolph Steiner Education, home schooling and the Queensland Senior External Examination. If you're studying these programs, select 'No' in your application when you are asked if you're completing an Australian Year 12 in 2019.

UAC assesses the Queensland Senior External Examination. For all other non-standard Year 12 studies to be assessable by UAC, you must provide proof of completion of an accredited Year 12 program of study and have sat the American Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT), results from which will be assessed by UAC.

UAC will also assess results from the Special Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT). Find out more about STAT at stat.acer.edu.au.

Contact the admissions offices of the institutions you are applying to for information on acceptance of STAT and on how they will consider your non-standard Year 12 studies.

2019 New Zealand NCEA Level 3 students

If you are completing the NCEA Level 3, an Interstate Transfer Index (ITI) will be calculated by the New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA) and provided to UAC. This will be used in the selection process, provided you have fulfilled NZQA's University Entrance requirements. NZQA does not report the ITI to applicants.

When you begin your application, select 'No' when asked if you're undertaking an Australian Year 12 in 2019.

Direct queries about the ITI and University Entrance requirements to NZQA: visit nzqa.govt.nz.

5.3 PATHWAY OPTIONS

Most institutions offer pathway options for applicants who don't meet the entry requirements for their degree courses, or need further support and preparation before studying at degree level. These generally include non-degree courses offered by the institution such as foundation studies, preparatory courses and certificate, diploma or associate degree courses.

If you successfully complete one of these courses, an institution may guarantee you entry into a particular degree course. Otherwise you can use your non-degree studies to apply and compete for admission to other degree courses. You may also be awarded credit for some studies undertaken in your non-degree course.

Slipback offers to lower-level courses

Some institutions may offer you a place in a lower-level course – even if you don't apply for it – if you're not eligible or competitive enough to receive an offer to the course to which you've applied. This is known as a slipback offer.

5.4 ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

English language proficiency is an admission requirement for all tertiary courses. If you need to provide proof of your proficiency in English, this will be indicated in your application.

Applicants who don't need to provide proof

Most applicants – including those with an Australian Year 12 qualification – **do not** have to prove proficiency in English.

Students with assessable qualifications

For most institutions, you do not need to provide proof of English language proficiency if you have an assessable qualification – undertaken in English – from one of the following countries:

- American Samoa
- Australia
- Botswana
- Canada
- Fiji
- Ghana
- Guyana
- Ireland
- Jamaica
- Kenya
- Lesotho
- Liberia
- New Zealand
- Nigeria
- Papua New Guinea
- Singapore
- Solomon Islands
- South Africa
- Tonga
- Trinidad and Tobago
- United Kingdom
- United States of America
- Zambia
- Zimbabwe.

Assessable qualifications are:

- senior secondary studies comparable with the NSW HSC (including the IB Diploma or Bilingual Diploma)
- one full year of Australian or comparable tertiary studies, including associate degree, bachelor degree and postgraduate studies
- Australian non-award studies
- tertiary preparation courses, including the NSW TAFE Tertiary Preparation Certificate, with a full-time equivalence of one year.

The following qualifications may also be accepted as satisfying English language proficiency if you were born in *and* undertook the qualification in one of the countries listed above:

- AQF qualifications: AQF Certificate III or IV, Diploma or Advanced Diploma (or equivalent)
- Special Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT)
- professional registration/qualification (eg nursing, trade, CPA).

Note: Some institutions may accept a different group of countries or have different qualification requirements. For institution-specific details, visit uac.edu.au/elp.

Students with qualifications specified by an institution

Each institution specifies additional qualifications it will accept as proof of English language proficiency. These qualifications are set out on the UAC website at uac.edu.au/elp.

Applicants who do need to provide proof

If you don't have the required tests or qualifications outlined above, there are two ways to prove your proficiency in English.

Method 1: Sit an English language proficiency test

There are a number of English language proficiency tests that are commonly accepted by institutions.

Check with your preferred institution to make sure it will accept the test results as proof of English language proficiency for the course you want to study. Include details of your proposed test in the English language proficiency question in your UAC application and submit it. Provide UAC with evidence of your results as soon as you receive them.

Register with the individual test centre:

International English Language Testing System (IELTS): Academic

Visit ielts.org.

Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)

UAC's TOEFL Designated Institution code is 8619. To have your results sent directly to UAC, enter this code on your answer sheets when you sit the TOEFL examination or on the Score Report Request Forms for tests previously taken. Visit ets.org.

Pearson Test of English (PTE): Academic

Authorise the release of your PTE Academic results to UAC via your Pearson account. UAC's PTE Academic institution code is LL5. Visit pearsonpte.com.

C1 Advanced

Formerly known as Cambridge English: Advanced (CAE). Visit cambridgeenglish.org/exams/advanced.

C2 Proficiency

Formerly known as Cambridge English: Proficiency (CPE). Visit cambridgeenglish.org/exams/proficiency.

Method 2: Write to the institution admissions office

If you believe you can demonstrate your proficiency in English but your test or qualification is not included here or on the UAC website, write to the admissions office at each institution to which you're applying. Include supporting documentation so that the acceptability of your test or qualification can be determined. **Do not send this information to UAC**

– we cannot make decisions about your English proficiency on behalf of institutions.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

The Australian Government has separate English language requirements for students applying for student visas from some countries. For more information, visit homeaffairs.gov.au.

5.5 SELECTION CRITERIA AND PROCESS**Criteria**

For most courses, you'll be selected mainly on your academic qualifications; that is, your selection rank or equivalent.

Some courses select applicants based on additional selection criteria such as a personal statement, a questionnaire, a portfolio of work, an audition, an interview or a test. Other courses may use a combination of both academic qualifications and additional selection criteria. For details of these criteria, read the course descriptions at uac.edu.au/search or in the My UAC app.

Regardless of how selection is made to a particular course, you must meet the admission criteria outlined in sections 5.1 and 5.2 before you can be considered for a course.

Process

Your course preferences (read section 4.4) will be considered in the order you've listed them in your application. If there's no place available in the course listed as your first preference, your second preference will be considered and so on until an offer can be made or you have no more preferences.

You'll only receive one offer per offer round to your highest preference for which you're eligible and competitive enough. In some cases you may also receive a slipback offer – read section 6.3.



5.6 ENTRY SCHEMES

Some institutions have a specific scheme or program for applicants who don't meet the usual minimum admission criteria of the institution but meet other requirements. For details, refer to the general information for each institution on the UAC website at uac.edu.au/institutions.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander applicants

Most institutions have an admission scheme specifically for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students. This information is provided in the general information for each institution on the UAC website at uac.edu.au/institutions.

Educational Access Schemes

Most of UAC's participating institutions have Educational Access Schemes (EAS) to help students who have experienced long-term educational disadvantage gain admission to university.

To be eligible for an equity adjustment under EAS for 2019–20 admissions, you must be:

- a UAC domestic applicant for undergraduate admission
- an Australian or New Zealand citizen, or a permanent resident of Australia (includes holders of permanent humanitarian visa)
- able to demonstrate that you've experienced long-term educational disadvantage because of circumstances beyond your control.

International students cannot apply for EAS. For detailed information, visit uac.edu.au/eas.

EAS applications

EAS applications open on Wednesday 3 April 2019 and remain open throughout the admissions period.

Before you apply for EAS you need to complete an application for undergraduate admission. Once you've submitted your undergraduate application, you'll have the option to immediately access the EAS application via the 'Apply for EAS' button, or you can log back in to your undergraduate application at any time and apply for EAS.

You're encouraged to apply by the early bird closing date of Monday 30 September 2019, but if you miss this date the following EAS application and documentation deadlines apply:

- Friday 29 November 2019: to guarantee receipt of your eligibility letter by Thursday 19 December 2019 and ensure you have time (one day only) to change preferences for December Round 2.
- Friday 27 December 2019: to be included in January Round 1.

If you have any questions, you can call UAC.

Notification of EAS eligibility

After your application has been assessed, UAC will send you an email to notify you of your EAS eligibility at each institution.

If your EAS application and supporting documentation are received by UAC on or before Friday 29 November 2019, you'll receive your EAS eligibility notification by Thursday 19 December 2019, in time to consider it with your preferences when ATARs are released. This means if you want to change your course preferences for December Round 2, you already know your EAS eligibility for every institution.

Notification of EAS eligibility for applications submitted after Friday 29 November 2019 will be issued progressively.

Early offer schemes

Some institutions have early offer schemes for Year 12 students. Through these schemes, applicants may be selected for courses based on a range of criteria, including recommendations provided by schools/colleges, rather than their final Year 12 results.

Schools Recommendation Schemes

Schools Recommendation Schemes (SRS) aim to help current Australian Year 12 students gain access to higher education using a wide range of selection criteria other than (or in addition to) the ATAR. These include school recommendations and senior secondary studies.

SRS also enable institutions to make early offers to current Australian Year 12 students who have applied for undergraduate admission through UAC. Institutions may make early offers based on:

- Year 11 results
- school ratings
- ATAR (or equivalent) or selection rank
- equity criteria
- institution-specific conditions.

Participating institutions have their own policies on determining SRS eligibility and making offers. For details, visit uac.edu.au/srs.

After you've submitted your UAC undergraduate application you can apply for SRS online via the UAC website. UAC centrally processes these applications.

SRS applications open on Wednesday 3 April 2019 and close at midnight on Monday 30 September 2019.

Who can apply

SRS is open to all Year 12 applicants who are completing either an Australian Year 12 qualification or an International Baccalaureate (within Australia) in 2019, and are:

- UAC domestic applicants for undergraduate admission for 2019–20
- Australian or New Zealand citizens
- permanent residents of Australia or holders of Australian permanent resident humanitarian visas.

However, individual institutions may have additional requirements for applicants. To find out more, read the institution entries on the UAC website at uac.edu.au/institutions.

Course preferences

Finalise your course preferences by midnight on Sunday 10 November 2019. Place the course you would most like to do at the top of your list, your next most preferred second and so on down the list.

SRS offers

Most SRS offers will be made in November Round 1 on Thursday 14 November 2019.

There are two types of SRS offers:

- unconditional offers (which have no further conditions for you to meet)
- conditional offers (which require you to meet additional conditions, such as a minimum ATAR).

In November, you can receive one unconditional offer. Accept it, even if it's for your lowest course preference. You will automatically be considered for your higher preferences in later rounds.

If you receive an unconditional offer to one of your higher preferences and want to be considered for all your other preferences in later rounds:

- accept the offer
- log in to your UAC undergraduate application, go to 'Update course preferences' and move that course down to the bottom of your course preference list or remove it entirely (as long as you have accepted the offer, you can't lose it).

If you then receive an offer to a course in your new list, you can decide whether to accept it and withdraw from your original course, or not accept the new offer and keep your place in your original course.

Unsuccessful applicants

UAC won't advise applicants who do not receive an offer through SRS. An unsuccessful SRS application has no effect on your UAC undergraduate application.

6 OFFERS AND ENROLMENT

OFFERS

6.1 DOMESTIC APPLICANTS

UAC advises students of their offers on behalf of the participating institutions. There are a number of offer rounds throughout the year. A list of the semester 1 offer round dates can be found in the table on the inside front cover of this Guide. The table also shows the dates by which you need to apply, provide documents and change your preferences to be guaranteed consideration in each offer round.

Although some Year 12 students receive early offers, the most important offer rounds for Year 12 students are December Round 2 and January Round 1, after ATARs are released. This is when most Year 12 applicants receive their offers.

The offer rounds before this are usually for early entry schemes such as Schools Recommendation Schemes, ADFA (Australian Defence Force Academy) courses and distance education courses. Not all institutions participate in these early rounds, so if you don't receive an early offer and aren't in one of the categories listed, there's no need to worry.

Offer rounds after January Round 1 are for entry to courses that still have vacancies.

6.2 INTERNATIONAL APPLICANTS

Conditional offers

Approximately 48 hours after you have applied through UAC, you'll receive a conditional offer via email, which you may use as part of your pre-visa assessment if required. Your conditional offer lists all the courses for which you have applied. It is a conditional offer of admission only; it does not mean you are able to enrol. To be eligible to enrol in a course of study you need to receive an unconditional offer.

Unconditional offers

To receive an unconditional offer, you must have the course listed in your application when offers are made, meet the minimum admission criteria of the institution and any other specific entry requirements for the course, and successfully compete against other applicants for a place. UAC starts issuing unconditional offers to successful applicants on behalf of institutions at the end of September. However, most offers will be made from mid-December, after you receive your final Year 12 results.

6.3 RECEIVING AN OFFER

To find out if you've been made an offer, go to UAC's website on the offer round date and log in using your UAC application number and UAC PIN.

The institutions (not UAC) decide who receives offers. So, if you have questions, you'll need to speak to the admissions office at the institution. You can ask why you didn't receive an offer and what other study options are available to you.

Your courses are considered in the order you have listed them in your application. However, each institution you have applied to will consider your application separately. Therefore, you can receive an offer to your highest preference at each institution included in your application (if you are eligible and competitive enough).

Slipback offers

Some institutions may make a slipback offer to a lower-level course if you're not eligible or competitive enough for the course to which you've applied.

This means that you may receive an offer to a lower-level course in the same area at the same institution rather than the course you listed in your preferences, even if you didn't apply for it. For example, you may get an offer to a Diploma in Marketing if you applied for, but weren't competitive enough for, the Bachelor of Marketing at the same institution.

If you successfully complete a course such as a diploma, an institution may guarantee you entry into some degree courses. You may also be awarded credit for some of your studies.

Direct offers from the unis

If you have applied directly to an institution, as well as through UAC, you can receive offers from both UAC and the institution. Then it's up to you to decide which one to accept.

6.4 ACCEPTING YOUR OFFER

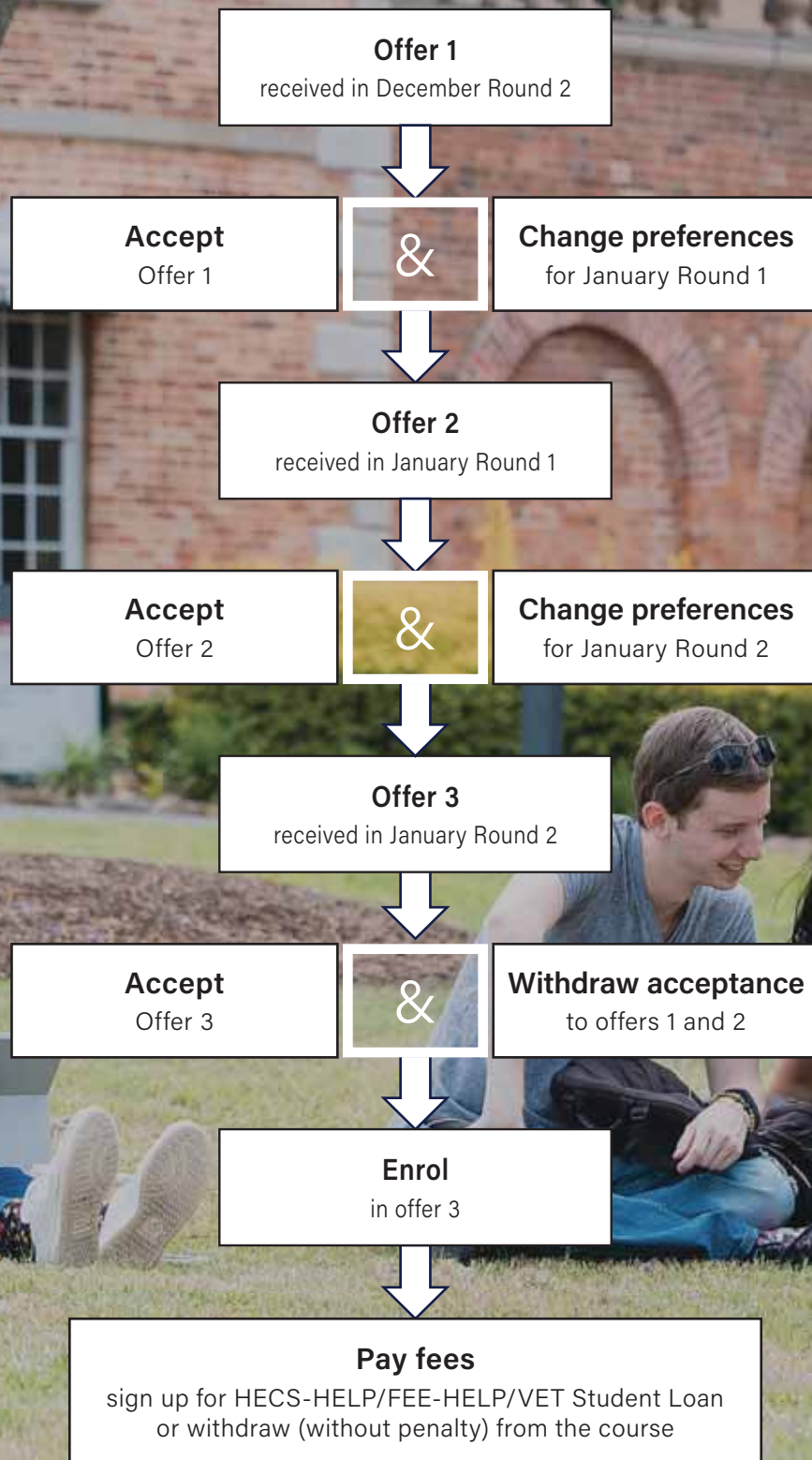
If you receive an offer in one round, don't assume that you'll receive another offer in a later round.

Accept any offer you receive by following the instructions the institution gives you. You must accept your offer by the date indicated in your offer material, otherwise your offer will lapse and it may go to another applicant in the next round.

Accepting an offer doesn't stop you from being considered in later offer rounds, but you must remove the successful course from your preferences list to prevent it blocking offers to lower preferences in future rounds.

RECEIVING OFFERS IN MULTIPLE OFFER ROUNDS: AN OVERVIEW

For domestic applicants, there are several offer rounds throughout the admissions year. As most Year 12 students will receive their offers in December and January, these offer rounds are used in this flowchart, which outlines the path you might take to receive an offer in each of these rounds.



If you receive an offer in one round and accept it, then receive an offer in a later round, you can choose to:

- keep your previous offer and not accept your new offer, or
- accept your new offer and withdraw from the course you've already accepted.

Once you accept your offer, the next step is enrolment.

International applicants

Your offer will include an explanation of how to accept your offer, enrol and pay the required compulsory Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) charge. Take particular notice of any deadlines the institution has for accepting the offer.

Once you have accepted your offer and sent your payment, the institution will send you a Confirmation of Enrolment. This document will allow you to obtain your student visa.

6.5 RECEIVING FURTHER OFFERS

Once you've received an offer, you can't be made an offer to any lower course preferences unless you change your preferences.

So, if you receive an offer to your first preference, you won't be considered for further offers in subsequent rounds unless you move that course down to the bottom of your list or remove it entirely. (Before you do this, don't forget to accept the course you've already been offered!)

If you receive an offer to a lower preference, you will automatically be considered for higher preferences in the next round. But if you'd like to be considered for other courses, you need to remove the course you've been offered, and any other courses you're no longer interested in, from your list of preferences.

For example, let's say you have the following five courses listed as preferences and you receive an offer to your second preference:

Preferences	
1	B Life Science
2	B Animal Science
3	B Science (Physics)
4	B Human Sciences
5	B Natural Science (Animal Science)

First, you should accept your offer to B Animal Science.

If you leave your preferences as they are, then in subsequent rounds you will only be considered for your first preference, B Life Science.

But if you want to be considered for courses other than B Life Science, you can change your preferences in any way you like – even add new courses to your list. Just make sure you have a realistic chance of meeting the lowest selection rank and can satisfy any additional course requirements.

Say you change your preferences to the following:

Preferences	
1	B Science (Physics)
2	B Science (Flexible)
3	B Biotechnology
4	B Human Sciences
5	B Teaching/B Science

You'll notice that B Animal Science has been removed from the list. As long as you've accepted your offer to this course, you won't lose your place. If you now receive an offer to a course in your new list, you can decide whether to accept it and withdraw from B Animal Science or not accept the new offer and keep your place in B Animal Science. (Also refer to the 'Receiving offers in multiple offer rounds' flowchart on the opposite page.)

If you reject an early round offer or let it lapse and then change your mind, you'll need to speak with the institution's admissions office, as only the institution can reinstate the offer. Also, if the course to which you've rejected the offer was your first preference and you don't remove it, no further offers can be made because the rejected offer will 'block' any new offers to other preferences.

6.6 UNSUCCESSFUL APPLICANTS

Domestic applicants who don't receive an offer in any round will be notified by email after the following offer rounds:

- January Round 1
- January Round 2
- February Round 2.

International applicants will be emailed after the February and March rounds.

The email will detail why you have been unsuccessful for each preference. UAC cannot give you any more information: contact the relevant institution for further advice on your study options.

If you don't receive an offer you can change your preferences for any remaining rounds. For more information, read section 6.5. If you don't change your preferences, they'll automatically be considered in the same order in subsequent rounds.

Alternative study options

When you apply for undergraduate study, you'll be asked if you'd like to receive information about alternative study options should your application be unsuccessful. If you select 'Yes', you may be contacted by institutions (including some not in your preferences) with details of other available study options. You can opt out of receiving this information by logging in to your application on the UAC website.

ENROLMENT

6.7 ABOUT ENROLMENT

Each institution has its own procedures for enrolment. For details, read the institution entries at uac.edu.au/institutions.

After you enrol in a course, you have until the census date at the end of March to pay your fees, sign up for a HECS-HELP or FEE-HELP loan (if you're eligible), or withdraw without penalty from the course.

If you are applying as an international student through an agent, your agent will help you.

6.8 ORIENTATION

Most institutions include subject selection, course planning and enrolment sessions in their orientation programs. International students are strongly encouraged to attend as orientation programs are specifically designed to help with adjusting to life as a student in Australia. For more information, read the institution entries at uac.edu.au/institutions.

6.9 DEFERMENT

Deferment is when your institution gives you permission to delay starting your course. Deferment is for a fixed period; usually six months or one year. All deferments are granted subject to the course being offered the following semester or following year. Each institution has its own policy regarding deferment – refer to the institution entries at uac.edu.au/institutions.

When you receive an offer to enrol in a course, information included with your offer will explain how to apply for deferment. You may have to accept the offer before you can defer.

Most institutions will ask you to provide a statement to explain why you wish to defer and what you'll be doing during this period.

Once your deferment has been granted, you'll receive written confirmation of your deferment from the institution concerned. This will also give instructions on how to take up your deferred course.

If, at the end of the deferment period, you decide you'd like to be considered for other courses, you can complete a new UAC application and include these course preferences. If you receive an offer to one of the new courses, you can then decide whether to accept the offer or take up your deferred course.

Can my deferred offer lapse?

Yes. If you undertake degree studies or certain levels of TAFE study other than NSW HSC courses during your deferment period, your offer at many institutions will lapse. You will need to reapply through UAC and declare all of your studies. Check with each institution for specific policies.

6.10 TRANSFERRING TO ANOTHER COURSE

Many students enrol in a course with a view to transferring into another course after completing a year's study. A typical example is completing one year of a general degree (such as Arts) and then transferring to a more specialised degree (such as Arts/Law).

Transfers such as this are possible but very competitive, and you usually need to achieve excellent results in your first year. Each institution has its own requirements for transfers and you should seek more information before you enrol.

In most cases you're not actually transferring; you're withdrawing from one course and applying for entry to another. You usually need to submit a new application through UAC for the new course.

If you're transferring to another course in the same admissions period, you don't need to reapply because your application is still active – you just need to change your preferences. Then, if you get an offer you can formally withdraw from your current course. It's important to do this to avoid additional HECS fees or absent fail results on your academic record.

FAQS ABOUT OFFERS

Can I receive an offer in more than one round?

Yes, domestic students can receive one offer per round. If you receive an offer in one round and accept it, then receive an offer in a later round, you can either keep your first offer and not accept the second offer, or withdraw from the first offer (that you accepted) and accept the second offer. Refer to the 'Receiving offers in multiple offer rounds' flowchart on page 36.

International applicants can receive one offer per institution in each round.

Most offers are made in December and January.

Should I accept my offer? I might receive another offer in the next round.

Yes, you should accept your offer. If you receive an offer in one round, don't assume you'll receive another offer in a subsequent round. If you don't accept your offer and you don't receive another one in later rounds, you may miss out on a place.

Accept your offer by the date specified by the institution, otherwise you may lose your offer. Accepting an offer doesn't stop you from being considered for your higher preferences in subsequent offer rounds.

How do I receive more offers after I accept an offer?

If you receive an offer to your first preference but you'd like to be considered for other courses in subsequent offer rounds, you need to accept the offer, then remove your first preference and reorganise the order of your preferences before the next offer round (read the example in section 6.5).

If you receive an offer to a lower preference in an offer round, you'll automatically be considered for your higher preferences in subsequent rounds.

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7 COURSE COSTS AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

COURSE COSTS FOR DOMESTIC STUDENTS

7.1 TYPES OF COURSES

Your course costs will depend on the type of course in which you're enrolled. There are two main types of courses:

- Commonwealth-supported place (CSP)
- domestic fee-paying (DFEE).

CSP courses typically cost you less than equivalent DFEE courses because they're subsidised by the Australian Government.

Not all institutions offer CSP courses and not all institutions offer DFEE courses.

A small number of courses are:

- ADF: sponsored by the Australian Defence Force (ie student contribution paid by the Australian Defence Force)
- C3F: three years Commonwealth-supported, fourth year fee-paying
- CBF: a combination of CSP and DFEE (ie bachelor program is CSP, masters program is DFEE)
- ENA: Commonwealth-supported and exempt from student contributions
- OTH: DFEE with no government loan scheme for students
- VET: DFEE with VET Student Loans for eligible students.

The course descriptions at uac.edu.au/search indicate the types of fees charged.

7.2 COMMONWEALTH-SUPPORTED PLACE (CSP) COURSES

When you study in a CSP course, you only have to pay part of the cost of your course (a student contribution) and the Australian Government pays the remainder of the cost.

The amount you pay for your student contribution depends on the institution and the area of study. Each institution sets its own student contribution level for each unit of study, within a range set by the Australian Government.

The table in the next column shows the range of student contributions for 2019 admissions. These amounts are indexed each year and are based on one year of full-time study.

Student contribution band	Student contribution range in 2019
Band 1 humanities, behavioural science, social studies, education, clinical psychology, foreign languages, visual and performing arts, nursing	\$0–\$6,566
Band 2 computing, built environment, other health, allied health, engineering, surveying, agriculture, mathematics, statistics, science	\$0–\$9,359
Band 3 law, dentistry, medicine, veterinary science, accounting, administration, economics, commerce	\$0–\$10,958

Paying your student contribution

Australian citizens and holders of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa can pay their student contribution in three ways:

- pay the entire student contribution upfront
- receive a HECS-HELP loan for the whole student contribution
- pay some of the student contribution upfront and receive a HECS-HELP loan for the balance.

All CSP students must submit a 'Request for Commonwealth support and HECS-HELP' form, regardless of their payment option (including upfront payers). The institution will give you the form.

Repayments for HECS-HELP loans are based on income and are made through the taxation system so you must have a tax file number. (Find out more at ato.gov.au.) Students don't have to start repaying their HECS-HELP loan until their income reaches a certain level.

New Zealand citizens who are Special Category Visa (SCV) holders and meet the requisite criteria can also access the loans. Other New Zealand citizens and holders of an Australian permanent resident visa (other than an Australian permanent humanitarian visa) don't have access to HECS-HELP loans and must pay all of the student contribution upfront.

Read institution websites for information about student contributions.

7.3 DOMESTIC FEE-PAYING (DFEE) COURSES

DFEE courses typically cost you more than equivalent CSP courses because you pay the full cost of your course (a tuition fee). There is no subsidy from the Australian Government.

The amount you pay for your tuition fee depends on the institution and the type of course. Each institution sets its own tuition fee for each DFEE course.

Paying your tuition fee

Australian citizens and holders of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa can pay their tuition fee in three ways:

- pay the entire tuition fee upfront
- receive a FEE-HELP loan or VET Student Loan for the whole tuition fee
- pay some of the tuition fee upfront and receive a FEE-HELP loan or VET Student Loan for the balance.

FEE-HELP is a loan scheme that helps eligible fee-paying students pay all or part of their tuition fees.

VET Student Loans help eligible students studying higher level vocational education and training (VET) qualifications (diploma level and above) pay their tuition fees.

New Zealand citizens who are Special Category Visa (SCV) holders and meet the requisite criteria can also access the loans. Other New Zealand citizens and holders of an Australian permanent resident visa (other than an Australian permanent humanitarian visa) don't have access to HELP loans and must pay the tuition fee upfront.

In 2019, FEE-HELP loans and VET Student Loans allow students to borrow a total of \$104,440 (or \$150,000 for medicine, dentistry or veterinary science). Repayments for these loans are based on income and are made through the taxation system. Students don't have to start repaying their loan until their income reaches a certain level.

FEE-HELP loans are subject to a 25 per cent loan fee and VET Student Loans are subject to a 20 per cent loan fee.

7.4 STUDENT SERVICES AND AMENITIES FEE

Most institutions charge a Student Services and Amenities Fee (SSAF) for student services and amenities of a non-academic nature, regardless of whether students intend to use the services and amenities provided.

The SSAF is indexed annually and may be spent on amenities and services such as sporting and recreational activities, employment and career advice, child care, financial advice and food services.

Not all institutions charge international students the SSAF. Check the institution entries on the UAC website for individual institution policies.

For more information on SSAF, visit the Department of Education and Training website at education.gov.au/student-services-and-amenities-fee.

COURSE COSTS FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

7.5 TUITION FEES

Each institution sets its own tuition fees, so fees vary between institutions and courses. The course fees listed in the course descriptions on UAC's website are indicative and subject to change. They are published for guidance only. In general, course fees are based on an average course load of two semesters of full-time enrolment. Fees may vary depending on the specific units of study in which you enrol. All tuition fees are quoted in Australian dollars. Check the institution entries on the UAC website at uac.edu.au/institutions for more information.

What do tuition fees cover?

Tuition fees generally cover teaching costs only but they may also include:

- reception at the airport nearest to campus
- assistance in finding accommodation
- orientation program
- access to all available student services and facilities
- special uniforms for nursing courses.

Check each institution's entry on the UAC website for more information. Tuition fees do not include:

- accommodation expenses
- costs of textbooks, course materials, study aids and equipment
- living expenses such as food, transport and clothing
- costs of field trips
- health cover and medical costs
- the Student Services and Amenities Fee (not charged by all institutions).

7.6 LIVING EXPENSES

It is a requirement of the Australian Department of Home Affairs that prospective international students can demonstrate that they have access to at least A\$20,290 a year to fund their living costs in Australia.

You will need at least this amount to cover your living expenses. This is a rough guide only and will depend on many things, including where you live (eg in Sydney, outer Sydney, regional NSW or in Canberra); the type of accommodation you live in; and your lifestyle. Remember, your living expenses are separate from your tuition fees.

Living costs include items such as:

- accommodation
- electricity and/or gas
- entertainment
- food
- personal incidentals
- telephone and internet bills
- transport (bus/train).

You'll also need to meet establishment costs such as rental bonds for accommodation, furniture and general household items. Other expenses may include textbooks, study aids, vacations or the running of a car or motorbike.

You will find useful information on costs and other aspects of living in Australia at studyinaustralia.gov.au.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

7.7 AUSTRALIAN GOVERNMENT PAYMENTS

The Australian Government provides financial help to eligible Australian students through payments such as Youth Allowance, Austudy and ABSTUDY. These payments are administered by the Department of Human Services.

The general information provided below is correct as at March 2019. Full, up-to-date details of payments and eligibility criteria are available at humanservices.gov.au/students. You can also get information and ask questions about payments and services via the Student Update Facebook page or @StudentUpdateAU on Twitter.

Youth Allowance

Youth Allowance is a payment for people aged 16 to 24 who are studying full time, doing a full-time Australian Apprenticeship, looking for work, or are sick.

Austudy

Austudy is a payment for people aged 25 or older who are studying full time or doing a full-time Australian Apprenticeship.

ABSTUDY

ABSTUDY is a group of payments for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students and Australian Apprentices.

Pensioner Education Supplement

The Pensioner Education Supplement is a regular extra payment to help with study costs if students also get certain income support payments from Centrelink.

Student Start-up Loan

The Student Start-up Loan is a voluntary loan you can get up to twice a year. If you're a student getting Youth Allowance, Austudy or ABSTUDY Living Allowance, you might be eligible for this loan. It is not paid automatically; you need to apply for it. You have to pay the loan back once you start earning a certain amount of income.

Relocation Scholarship

The Relocation Scholarship is a once a year payment if you're a dependent student getting Youth Allowance, ABSTUDY Living Allowance or Energy Supplement and need to move to or from a regional or remote area for higher education study.

Other assistance

If you receive Youth Allowance, Austudy, ABSTUDY, the Pensioner Education Supplement or the ABSTUDY Pensioner Education Supplement, you may also be eligible for the following payments.

Education Entry Payment

The Education Entry Payment helps with the upfront costs of study and is paid when you start study if you get certain income support payments from Centrelink.

Fares Allowance

Fares Allowance helps with travel costs between your permanent home and your place of study in Australia if you need to live away from home to study. You may get Fares Allowance if you're a tertiary student getting Youth Allowance, Austudy or Pensioner Education Supplement, or a tertiary or secondary student getting ABSTUDY.

Concessions and allowances

You may also be able to get other concessions and allowances such as a Health Care Card or Rent Assistance.

7.8 EQUITY SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE THROUGH UAC

Equity Scholarships help disadvantaged students with costs associated with higher education.

Institutions award Equity Scholarships to Australian students from low socio-economic backgrounds, particularly those who receive Centrelink income support payments. There are two types of Equity Scholarships:

- Institution Equity Scholarships (IES) funded by individual institutions
- Indigenous Student Success Program (ISSP) funded by the Australian Government.

By submitting just one application through UAC you'll be considered for all available Equity Scholarships for which you're eligible at participating institutions.

You can only submit this one Equity Scholarships application during the admissions period; your application remains active and may be considered for subsequent offer rounds.

To apply and find details of Equity Scholarship participating institutions, offer rounds and application dates, visit uac.edu.au/es.

7.9 OTHER SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships funded by institutions

UAC's participating institutions offer a range of merit scholarships.

There are also scholarships designed to help international students fund the cost of their study. These scholarships may be country-specific or targeted to particular areas of study.

For details, read the general information about each institution at uac.edu.au/institutions.

Scholarships funded by the Australian Government

The Australia Awards Scholarship program is funded by the Australian Government and provides opportunities for people from selected developing countries to study in Australia. These scholarships are awarded either on merit or on nomination by home governments. There are a limited number of undergraduate scholarships available.

For information on Australia Awards Scholarships and how to apply, visit dfat.gov.au/people-to-people.

7.10 SPONSORED INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Sponsored students are those who receive financial support for their study and/or other agreed educational expenses from sources other than their own funds.

To be recognised by an institution as a sponsored student, you must be funded under an agreement with a sponsoring authority recognised by the institution.

Check each institution's policy on sponsored students and sponsoring authorities at uac.edu.au/institutions.

7.11 WORKING WHILE STUDYING AS AN INTERNATIONAL STUDENT

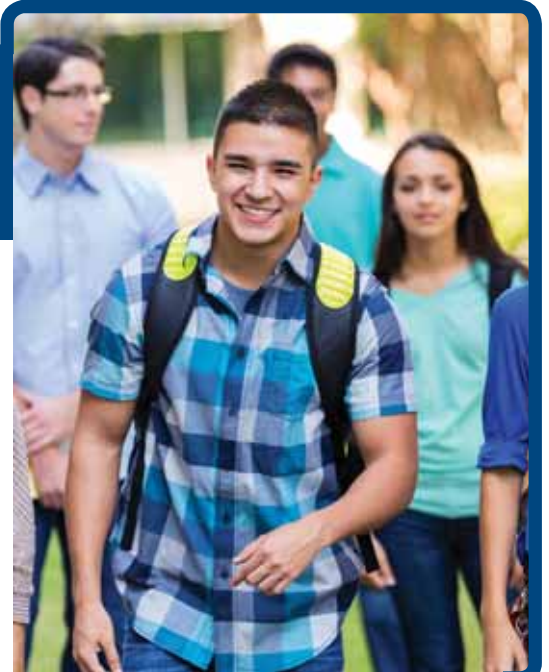
International students can work for up to 40 hours per fortnight during teaching periods, and unlimited hours when your course is not in session. Certain categories of voluntary, unpaid work is included in this total. Work undertaken as part of your course is not included.

You should not rely on working to fund your tuition or living expenses while in Australia as work cannot be guaranteed and spending excessive amounts of time working may adversely affect your studies. Applications for work visas can only be submitted after you have arrived in Australia and started your classes.

The Department of Home Affairs determines work entitlement for students. For more information, visit 'Visas' at immi.homeaffairs.gov.

You may not think of yourself as having a 'disability' but the definition under the Disability Discrimination Act is broad and includes dyslexia, medical conditions and mental illness. Do you have to put in extra effort at school because of your disability or condition? If so, it's best to plan ahead rather than "wait and see" how you manage university study.

While in Year 12 (or earlier)

- ➔ Uni disability staff can answer all kinds of questions about uni. Make an appointment and get the inside info to help you make decisions and prepare for uni. You can find their contact details at uac.edu.au/disability
- ➔ Check out the Get Ready for Uni website at www.westernsydney.edu.au/ndco/getready
- ➔ Decide what you want to tell others about your disability: www.westernsydney.edu.au/ndco/disclosure
- ➔ Read about the Educational Access Scheme (EAS) in this Guide. EAS recognises the impact of personal illness/disability and can make a significant difference to your uni course options.

When applying

- ➔ Lodge your UAC application as required.
- ➔ If you make an EAS application (a separate application) keep a copy of your documentation.
- ➔ Answer the question for 'People with Disabilities' and then complete the questionnaire. The questionnaire assists Disability Services staff to identify demand and to plan for their services. **You still need to meet with them to set up services.**

When you get your offer and when enrolling

- ➔ Contact disability staff at the uni to let them know you will be enrolling. **If you will need services in place at the beginning of semester, for enrolment, and/or orientation make an appointment immediately.** Take along whatever documentation you have.
- ➔ At enrolment you will be given the opportunity to indicate you have a disability. This info is compiled in a non-identifying way and sent to the Australian Government for statistical purposes. It may also go to the uni Disability Service; however this does not mean that you are registered with them or will have support in place.
- ➔ **It is up to you to make contact with Disability Services if you need adjustments because of a disability. This is critical if you need course material in electronic formats.**

Remember to make contact with Disability Services early!



For more information, you can also talk to your local National Disability Coordination Officer (NDCO). The NDCO program is an Australia-wide Government funded program that assists people with a disability to move into post-school training, education, and subsequent employment. 8 COMMON TERMS AND ABBREVIATIONS

Following are definitions of many of the terms and abbreviations used by UAC and its institutions. Knowing these terms will help you understand the tertiary admissions process.

Academic record (see Transcript)

Academic year

The part of the year when classes are held at a university. The academic year usually starts in February–March when classes begin, and ends with the examination period in November–December. It may comprise two semesters or three terms/trimesters. Some institutions also have an additional study period in December–February.

Additional selection criteria

Compulsory or optional requirements, either in addition to or instead of admission criteria, which you must meet to be considered for selection into a course.

Examples include a personal statement, a questionnaire, a portfolio of work, an audition, an interview or a test. If a course has additional selection criteria it is specified in the course description.

Adjustment factors

Factors that institutions consider in order to increase your selection rank for a particular course (eg achievement in an HSC course related to the student's preferred degree or eligibility for Educational Access Schemes). They do not change your ATAR. These adjustments used to be referred to as 'bonus points'.

Admission criteria

The minimum qualifications required for you to be considered for entry to a particular course. Entry to many courses is competitive. The attainment of minimum qualifications does not guarantee you will be offered a place.

Admissions period

The period when applications are open for tertiary study. Applications open in April.

Advanced diploma

An award requiring two or three years of full-time, or equivalent part-time, study. This is the highest of the undergraduate diploma awards.

Apply direct institution

An institution that lists its courses through UAC but which manages its own admissions. UAC does not process applications for these institutions; students apply directly to the institution.

Areas of study

Areas of study within a course, which may consist of a sequence of subjects/units in a single discipline (generally studied throughout the course as major areas of study or specialisations or sub-majors) or additional or supporting subjects or units.

For details of areas of study offered in a course, read the course description on the UAC website.

Associate degree

An award requiring two years of full-time, or equivalent part-time, study. It equates to the first two years of a designated three-year degree course.

Associate diploma

An award requiring two years of full-time, or equivalent part-time, study.

Assumed knowledge (see *also* Prerequisites)

Some institutions assume you have knowledge of specified NSW HSC courses or equivalent before beginning your course. If you do not have the assumed level of knowledge but have met the admission requirements you can still be selected for the course, but you may have some difficulty coping with your studies. Bridging courses may be recommended for some students who do not have the assumed level of knowledge. If an institution recommends assumed knowledge for a course it is specified in the course description on the UAC website.

Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF)

A national policy for qualifications in the school, vocational education and training (VET) and higher education sectors in Australia. All AQF qualifications are quality assured.

Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR)

A measure of academic achievement in the HSC that helps institutions rank applicants for selection to tertiary courses. The ATAR is a rank, not a mark.

ATAR courses

Board Developed courses for which the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) conducts examinations that yield graded assessments. Classified as Category A courses or Category B courses, these are the only courses that can be included in the ATAR calculations.

Bachelor degree

An award requiring three or four years of full-time, or equivalent part-time, study.

Bridging courses

Courses that enable you to achieve the required level of assumed knowledge. The inclusion of one or more of these courses (also called introductory courses) in the first-year program, however, could prevent you from completing your course in the minimum time.

Combined/double/dual degrees

Degrees structured to allow students to complete two degrees in less time than would be taken if the two degrees were studied sequentially.

Commonwealth Register of Institutions and Courses for Overseas Students (CRICOS)

A register of all Australian educational providers and their courses offered to students studying in Australia on student visas.

Commonwealth-supported place (CSP)

A place in a course to which the Australian Government contributes towards the cost, and the student pays a student contribution.

Deferment

Permission to delay starting a course, usually for one year. Refer to each institution's entry for deferment information specific to that institution.

Diploma

An undergraduate award that usually places more emphasis on practical skills than on theoretical content. Also a postgraduate award requiring one year of full-time, or equivalent part-time, postgraduate study.

Distance education

A form of full-time or part-time study that takes place outside the institution, either at a study centre, online or at home by correspondence. Periodic residential attendance at on-campus sessions is usually required.

Domestic fee-paying (DFEE) course

A course not subsidised by the Australian Government; the student meets the entire cost of their studies through tuition fees.

Education Services for Overseas Students (ESOS) framework

A combination of the ESOS Act, associated legislation and a National Code that protects the interests of students studying in Australia on student visas. Regulated by the Department of Education and Training, it provides tuition and financial assurance and ensures there is a nationally consistent approach to registering education providers so that the quality of the tuition and services offered to students remains high.

Educational Access Schemes (EAS)

Schemes for university applicants who have experienced long-term educational disadvantage due to circumstances beyond their control or choosing.

Enrolment

Formal registration as a student at an institution after receiving and accepting an offer. Each institution has its own enrolment procedures. Successful applicants will receive enrolment details with their offer.

Equity Scholarships (ES)

Scholarships offered by institutions to help financially disadvantaged students with the costs of higher education.

Exclusion

A decision by an institution to exclude a student from continuing their study at that institution, usually because they have breached a regulation, such as failure in their program of study. In most cases they may re-apply for admission to the course/institution after a set period of time from the date of exclusion, usually one or two years.

Faculty

A department within a university in a particular area of study, such as arts, law, engineering or medicine.

FEE-HELP

A loan for eligible fee-paying students to pay their tuition fees. FEE-HELP is subject to a 25 per cent loan fee.

Fee-paying students

Students who meet the entire cost of their studies through tuition fees. They can be domestic or international students.

Graduate

A person who has received a degree or diploma.

HECS-HELP

A loan for eligible Commonwealth-supported students to pay their student contributions.

Higher Education Loan Program (HELP) (see also FEE-HELP, HECS-HELP and VET Student Loans)

A loan program available to Australian citizens, holders of Australian permanent humanitarian visas and New Zealand citizens who are Special Category Visa (SCV) holders (and meet the requisite criteria) to enable them to pay their student contributions or tuition fees or their overseas study expenses. Loans are repaid later through the taxation system once income has reached a certain level.

Honours

In a three-year undergraduate course (or part-time equivalent), honours is an additional year of study to meritorious students. In a four- or five-year course, honours is awarded on the basis of superior performance in the course.

Institution

A provider of tertiary study, such as a university or a college. UAC's participating institutions are those for which you apply through UAC.

International fee-paying students (IFEE)

Students who are not Australian or New Zealand citizens or permanent residents of Australia and who meet the entire cost of their studies through tuition fees.

Lowest ATAR

The lowest ATAR of an applicant to receive an offer to a course. Lowest ATARs can only be determined when offers are made each year.

Lowest selection rank

The minimum selection rank required for selection into a course. (It used to be called the course 'cut-off'). Any lowest selection ranks published in this Guide are those from semester 1, 2019. They are intended to be used as a guide only and are supplied to help you assess your chances of getting into a particular course and decide on your preferences.

The lowest selection ranks can only be determined when offers are made each year.

Moderation

A process undertaken by NESA to remove differences between how schools assess their students. It involves the comparison of school-based assessment marks with state-wide examination marks and their alignment to course standards to produce an assessment mark for each student.

Non-award program

A course of study for students giving them a pathway into a bachelor degree. It allows students to study individual units (subjects) that, when successfully completed, can enable entry into a degree course.

Non-standard Year 12 applicant

An applicant who is completing a Year 12 program through Australian Christian Education, Rudolph Steiner Education, home schooling or the Queensland Senior External Examination.

NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA)

The body that sets the core curriculum for Kindergarten to Year 12 for government and non-government schools in NSW; sets guidelines for school assessment tasks and sets, organises and marks the HSC examinations; and sustains and improves the standards of achievement in NSW schools.

Open days

Days set aside by an institution for prospective students to visit their campus, view their facilities and meet academic staff and students.

Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)

Compulsory health insurance for international students studying on a student visa in Australia to cover any costs for medical and hospital care. Students must purchase an approved OSHC policy before enrolment.

Participating institution

An institution that lists its courses through UAC and UAC manages its admissions process, including applications and offers.

Pathway courses

Non-degree courses – such as foundation studies, preparatory courses and certificates, diplomas or associate degrees – offered by institutions to applicants who don't meet the entry requirements for their degree course or need further support and preparation before studying at degree level. Some institutions offer pathway courses through UAC – read section 5.3 and the institution entries at uac.edu.au/institutions for details.

Percentile

Calculating percentiles is part of the process of calculating ATARs. The percentile indicates a student's position in a course against other students. For example, a student in the 73rd percentile is in the top 27 per cent of students in that course.

Postgraduate courses

These are courses usually available only to people who have qualified for an appropriate first degree or diploma. They are not available to school leavers. They include:

- graduate/postgraduate certificates
- graduate/postgraduate diplomas
- postgraduate degrees such as masters or doctorates.

Practical experience

A requirement of some courses, it involves supervised practice that takes place in an approved workplace and helps students develop skills relevant to their area of study. It may be undertaken during a semester or in semester breaks and can vary from regular one-day placements to block periods of several weeks. Costs may be involved, such as instruments, uniform, accommodation or travel. Courses requiring practical experience will list it in the course description.

Preparation courses

Courses offered by most institutions, including TAFE colleges, as a preparation for further study. They are usually undertaken by students with insufficient formal entry qualifications, or for those who have not participated in formal education for some time.

Prerequisites (see also Assumed knowledge)

Year 12 courses that must be completed in order to be considered for admission to certain tertiary courses. Some tertiary courses require applicants to have completed a specific HSC course or equivalent before they will be offered a place in those courses (course prerequisites). Some subjects within a tertiary course require applicants to have completed a specific HSC course or equivalent before they are able to enrol in those particular subjects (subject prerequisites).

Professional recognition

A course that has been approved by a professional body, which enables graduates to apply for membership and/or registration to practise in the profession.

Recommended studies

NSW HSC or equivalent courses that the institutions suggest will assist students in their chosen university course. However, if they haven't studied these courses their chances of selection are not affected. If a course has recommended studies they are specified in the course description.

Record of failure

Appears on a student's academic record due to withdrawing from a course or a single unit where that withdrawal is counted as a failure, or where the student has failed to satisfy the assessment requirements for one or more units.

Scaling

The first step in calculating the ATAR. It enables the many different courses taken by students to be compared fairly.

The scaling process is designed to encourage students to take courses for which they are best suited and which best prepare them for future studies. The underlying principle is that you should be neither advantaged nor disadvantaged by choosing one HSC course over another. The scaling algorithm estimates what your marks would have been if all courses had been studied by all students.

Scaling modifies the mean, the standard deviation and the maximum mark in each course. Adjustments are then made to the marks of individual students to produce scaled marks. Although scaled marks are generally different from the raw marks from which they are derived, the ranking of students within a course is not changed.

Schools Recommendation Schemes (SRS)

Schemes that enable schools to recommend current Year 12 students who are UAC applicants for offers of undergraduate admission. SRS aim to assist access to higher education for current Australian Year 12 students using a wide range of selection criteria, including school recommendations and senior secondary studies. SRS are processed through UAC.

Although most institutions make early offers of undergraduate admission under SRS, institutions have their own policies on determining SRS eligibility and making offers.

Semester

The division of the academic year into study periods. Students can start courses at the beginning of the first and, in some cases, second semester. Some institutions call their study periods 'autumn' and 'spring' semesters. Others use the terms 'session' or 'half-year'. Some institutions have trimesters or terms, with an additional study period over summer.

Slipback offer

An offer to a lower level of study than that applied for. For example, if you applied for a bachelor degree and the institution decides that, while you are not eligible and competitive enough for entry to the bachelor degree, you are eligible for a lower level of study (such as a diploma), the institution makes you an offer to the lower level.

Special requirements and policies

Special requirements and policies apply to students in health- and welfare-related courses and teacher education courses.

These requirements relate to:

- clinical/internship placements undertaken as part of your course
- proof of English language proficiency
- accreditation and procedures for employment after you have completed the course.

Note that requirements and policies in these areas are subject to regular review.

Student contribution

The amount that Commonwealth-supported students must pay towards their study costs. This amount is determined by each institution.

Student Services and Amenities Fee (SSAF)

Supports the delivery of student services including counselling, employment, orientation, career advice, child care, financial advice, health services, food services, sporting and recreational activities, student advocacy and legal services. The maximum SSAF amount chargeable is determined by the Australian Government.

Students studying on a part-time basis cannot be charged more than 75 per cent of the maximum amount that students studying on a full-time basis are charged.

Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Agency (TEQSA)

Regulates and assures the quality of Australia's higher education sector. TEQSA also maintains the National Register of Higher Education Providers. The register includes information on whether higher education institutions are self-accrediting or non self-accrediting and the courses they are accredited to deliver.

Transcript

An official copy of a student's complete academic record at a post-secondary or tertiary institution, issued by the institution.

Tuition fee

The amount that domestic fee-paying students or international students must pay for their course. Tuition fees are determined by each institution.

Undergraduate course

A course leading to a first qualification, namely a first degree of bachelor, an associate degree, an associate diploma or a diploma.

Universities Admissions Centre (UAC)

The central office that receives and processes applications for admission to most undergraduate degree, advanced diploma and diploma courses at participating institutions. UAC also notifies students of their ATAR and, on behalf of the participating institutions, makes offers to courses. Owned by universities in NSW and the ACT, UAC is a not-for-profit organisation that aims to provide excellence in admissions services and promote equity of access to tertiary education.

VET Student Loans

A loan for eligible fee-paying students studying higher level vocational education and training (VET) qualifications to pay their tuition fees.

Year 12 applicant

A student who is sitting one or more units of an Australian 2019 Year 12 in Australia or outside Australia (except Queensland Year 12 external students) or sitting the International Baccalaureate in Australia in 2019. Also referred to as a 2019 Year 12 or current Year 12 applicant.

Fee type

DFEE = domestic fee-paying (not subsidised – you pay the full cost of the course)

A small number of courses are:

- ADF: student contribution paid by the Australian Defence Force
- C3F: three years Commonwealth-supported, fourth year fee-paying
- CBF: a combination of CSP and DFEE (ie bachelor program is CSP, masters program is DFEE)
- ENA: Commonwealth-supported and student contribution exempt
- OTH: domestic fee-paying with no government loan scheme for students
- VET: domestic fee-paying with VET Student Loans for eligible students.

All international students pay the full cost of their course. Read section 7 for information on course costs and financial assistance.

Course code

This is the code used in the UAC application and in the course search on the UAC website.

Pattern of attendance

3F	= 3 years of full-time study
6P	= 6 years of part-time study
3F/EqP	= 3 years of full-time or equivalent part-time study
D	= Distance or online

LSR

LSR = lowest selection rank for domestic applicants in the main offer rounds for Year 12 students (December Round 2, 2018 and January Round 1, 2019). The lowest selection rank is determined by the interaction of three factors:

- 1 the number of places available in the course
- 2 the number of applicants for the course
- 3 the quality of those applicants.

Lowest selection ranks include any increases made as a result of adjustment factors (see below), so many applicants will have received an offer to that course even though their ATAR was below the lowest selection rank.

N/A = not applicable: selection not based on the ATAR; or the course is not offered to current Year 12 applicants

new = new course offered through UAC

– = data not provided, contact the institution

<5 = less than 5 ATAR-based offers were made for this course

Selection rank adjustments

When determining your selection rank for a course, institutions often take other factors into consideration in addition to your ATAR. This means that your selection rank for that course will be adjusted and will be higher than your ATAR.

Factors that can increase your selection rank include high achievement in specified HSC courses relevant to your preferred course, living in or attending school in an area defined by the institution, or assessment of your Educational Access Schemes (EAS) application.

As selection rank adjustments are course specific, your selection rank can be different for each of your course preferences. For more information, read section 5.2.

Confirmed Sem 1 2020

Institutions intend to run all listed courses in 2020. However, not all have been confirmed for semester 1. Course starting dates and full course descriptions will be published on the UAC website when details are confirmed.

Avail INT

Avail INT = available to international students through UAC. Where this column does not appear, international applicants cannot apply through UAC. Check the institution websites for details of all courses offered to international students.

From 1848, before Australian universities offered law degrees, the Supreme Court of New South Wales set examinations for admission to the profession. The Legal Profession Admission Board (LPAB) offers the oldest law course in Australia. The Board's long history of providing legal education has contributed to a unique and rigorous course that prepares students for legal work in many areas, including business, policy, public service, academia and advocacy. Graduates of the LPAB course are leaders in the legal profession.

The LPAB governs the accreditation for all law courses in educational institutions in NSW. The Board's course set the standard and shaped the curriculum against which all other law courses are measured. These highly regarded standards are maintained today through a unique collaboration between the LPAB and the Law Extension Committee (LEC) of the University of Sydney. Together they continue the exceptional teaching and examination traditions instituted by the Supreme Court of NSW prior to the first university law degrees in Australia.

Graduates are unique because of the nature of the course. Emphasis in the Board's curriculum is on its practical, professional orientation. Taught at night and on weekends, our students study while working and so are prepared to meet the rigorous demands of practice. They are experienced in managing competing priorities and practiced in meeting tight deadlines. Completion of the Board's course requires resilience, perseverance and a real hunger to attain legal knowledge. This characteristic, coupled with the high academic standards of the course, produces confident and work ready graduates. This is one of the most affordable courses as a pathway to the legal profession.

Students are taught in a lecture based program by leaders in their fields, drawn from the ranks of academia and the profession. Lecturers include authors of leading textbooks, and barristers arguing the cases which will shape the law of tomorrow. For the purposes of admission as a lawyer, graduates of the Board's course meet the academic requirements, as do accredited university law schools. Generations of judges, solicitors and barristers have been educated in this way for over 170 years.


