

You and UAC

UAC calculates the Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) for NSW HSC students and processes applications for admission to tertiary courses at participating institutions, mostly in NSW and the ACT.

When you apply for university through UAC, you can apply for multiple courses at multiple institutions, all in one spot. You'll have several opportunities to receive uni offers for study next year, and the chance to change your course preferences between each round.

Through UAC, you can also apply for schemes and scholarships to help you access university:

- Schools Recommendation Scheme – for early offers
- Educational Access Scheme – to have challenges you've faced taken into account by unis

- Elite Athlete and Performer Scheme – to have your elite achievements considered
- Equity Scholarships – for financial support.

Ready to learn more? This publication will help kickstart your journey, from researching post-school options through to submitting an application through UAC, and receiving and accepting offers.

Getting help

If you have questions about the content or structure of a uni course, your best option is to talk directly to staff at the university. Open days are a great opportunity to do this. You'll find a list of this year's open days on our website.

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

Understanding the ATAR



The ATAR allows us to compare the overall achievement of students who have completed thousands of different combinations of HSC courses. Its only purpose is to help universities select students.

HSC: the starting point

The Higher School Certificate syllabus and exams are set by the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA).

Your HSC marks, as reported in your Record of Achievement, indicate the performance standards you have reached in each of your courses. Your HSC mark for each course is a 50:50 combination of your school-based assessment mark for that course and your HSC examination mark.

There is no quota as to the number of students who can achieve top marks and students are not scaled against each other.

HSC assessment marks

As you know, your assessment tasks are marked at your school. Because schools mark in different ways, NESA needs to remove the differences so that it can compare the results in a way that is fair for all students. It does this through a process called 'moderation'.

Moderation aligns school-based assessment marks with the raw state-wide exam marks. Since the exam for a course is taken by all students completing that course (and it's marked by the same people in the same way), it can be used as a common standard against which school assessments can be compared. When assessment marks are moderated, students maintain their assessment rank but may be given a different assessment mark. If you are ranked second in your school assessment, you will receive the second highest moderated assessment mark.

Only assessment marks are moderated; you will always keep your own examination mark.

HSC examination marks

Your exam mark will depend on how well you perform in the exam and is independent of your assessment rank. You keep your own exam mark, regardless of your performance in your assessments.

Your Record of Achievement

Your HSC Record of Achievement, provided by NESA, will show your examination mark, assessment mark, HSC mark and performance band. You won't be given a single, overall score for your combined courses.



In 2025, 60,432 NSW students earned an ATAR, studying almost 28,000 different HSC course combinations.



Here is an example of how your HSC marks will be listed on your Record of Achievement:

ATAR: your ranking in the HSC

In contrast to your HSC results, your ATAR is a rank, not a mark or a percentage. It's a number between 0.00 and 99.95 with increments of 0.05. While your HSC marks tell you about your performance in the HSC, your ATAR tells you about your position overall in relation to your peers. Think of it like a running race: your HSC marks are your time (and your time is not compared to anyone else's time), and your ATAR is your place (first, second, third, and so on). Your position in the race depends not only on your time but on the times of the students you are competing with.

ATARs are calculated in each state to reflect a student's rank against other students in their state. An ATAR of 85.00 in NSW or the ACT is, however, considered equivalent to an ATAR of 85.00 in other states.

In NSW the ATAR is calculated and released by UAC. In the ACT the ATAR is calculated by the ACT Board of Senior Secondary Studies and released by schools.

ATAR eligibility in 2026

To be eligible for an ATAR in NSW, you must satisfactorily complete at least 10 units of HSC courses. These courses must include at least:

- ✓ 10 units of HSC Board Developed courses (courses developed by NESA)
- ✓ 2 units of English
- ✓ 3 HSC Board Developed courses of 2 units or greater
- ✓ 4 subject areas.



If you're completing an **International Baccalaureate (IB)**, you won't receive an ATAR. Instead, an IB Admissions Score (IBAS) will be calculated for you based on your diploma score. When you apply through UAC, your IBAS will be converted into an ATAR-like value (called the Combined Rank) so that you can be ranked against other applicants.

A UAC rank (not an ATAR) will also be calculated for applicants undertaking **tertiary preparation programs** such as the Tertiary Preparation Certificate (TPC) and Open Foundation.

HSC Board Developed courses

To be included in your ATAR, your HSC courses must be developed by NESA. Courses developed by NESA have formal examinations and give you a graded assessment. They include courses like Economics, Geography and Visual Arts. They also include VET courses, such as Hospitality and Financial Services, but you must sit the optional exam to have your marks contribute to the calculation of your ATAR.

Subject areas

You need to study courses from four subject areas to be eligible for an ATAR. Within an HSC subject area (eg mathematics) there may be a number of courses (eg Mathematics Standard 1, Mathematics Standard 2, Mathematics Advanced, Mathematics Extension 1, Mathematics Extension 2).

If you study, for example, Mathematics Extension 1, Mathematics Extension 2, English Advanced, English Extension 1, English Extension 2 and Biology, you will not meet the four subjects requirement because you have only studied courses from three subject areas: mathematics, English and biology.



VET courses with an HSC exam can count towards your ATAR, as long as you complete the exam.

ACT Year 12 students who want an ATAR must sit the ACT Scaling Test (AST).

ATAR calculation in 2026

In NSW, your ATAR is based on your **scaled marks** in 10 units of ATAR courses, which will include:

- your best 2 units of English
- your best 8 units from your remaining courses.

Your scaled mark in a course will be influenced by:

- where your result places you in that course (your position)
- the scaled mean for that course (the average position of students taking the course).



No matter what path you choose, there are so many ways to get to where you want to go. While making these exciting decisions can be overwhelming, so many people will support you. I spoke with universities, careers advisers, family, friends and members of the community, asking them to share their stories. I encourage you to do the same – you might be surprised by what inspires you!

The example below shows a set of 2025 HSC and scaled marks corresponding to results at the 90th percentile (ie 90 per cent of marks were lower) for each course.

Course	Scaled mean	HSC mark	Scaled mark
Ancient History	44.8	89.0	74.8
Biology	52.4	88.0	79.8
Business Studies	47.8	90.0	78.4
English Standard	40.8	80.0	63.0
Physics	62.0	91.0	86.0
Society and Culture	46.2	91.0	75.4

Even though the HSC mark for Ancient History was higher than the HSC mark for Biology, it will not be included in the ATAR calculation. This is because Ancient History has the lowest scaled mark of all the courses, other than English. (At least 2 units of English must be included, even if they are the lowest scaled marks.)

Scaled marks are not reported to students.

The ACT ATAR is calculated from a student's best three major scaled course scores plus 0.6 of the next best scaled course score (major or minor). The scaled course scores are added to form an aggregate score. Students are then ranked based on their aggregate score, which is converted to an ATAR.



English Standard and Mathematics Standard 2 are the most popular HSC courses.

Scaling

Just as individual units of different currencies are not of equal value (£1 is not the same as \$1), marks in different courses can't be compared because the courses are completely different. But just as exchange rates allow us to compare the value of different currencies, the scaling process allows us to compare marks in different courses properly and fairly.

Courses are scaled using the mean scores and distribution of marks, which indicate the ability of the students taking the course, not the perceived difficulty of the course:

- If a course has a high scaled mean, it tells us that, on average, the ability of the students in that course is high – in general, they did well in their other courses. Courses such as Mathematics Extension 2 and Physics usually have high scaled means because they're studied by high-achieving students.
- If a course has a low scaled mean, it tells us that the ability of the students in that course ranges from high to low. (It doesn't mean that you can't get a high ATAR if you study that course.)

The following table illustrates these points using data from selected 2025 HSC courses.

HSC mean = average student performance in the course

Scaled mean = average position of students taking the course

Max. ATAR of student taking the course = highest ATAR calculated using both units of the course

HSC course	Median performance band	HSC mean	Scaled mean	Max. ATAR of a student taking the course
Aboriginal Studies	4	70.6	 29.6	 99.90
Biology	4	73.4	52.4	99.95
English Advanced	5	82.2	 65.6	99.95
Physics	4	74.0	 62.0	99.95
Visual Arts	5	81.8	43.4	99.90
VET course				
Hospitality	4	75.4	37.4	 99.15



This student's ATAR is very high even though it was calculated using their results in a course with a low scaled mean.



High scaled means for these courses indicate that the students are generally high achievers in all their courses.



A student taking a VET course with an exam can still receive a high ATAR.

Remember, the ATAR is about position, and your position in a course is not altered by scaling.

Extension courses: For most extension courses the scaled means and standard deviations are determined by the performance of the extension students in the corresponding 2-unit course.

Your age cohort

Each state has a different number of Year 12 students who are eligible to receive an ATAR; that is, they have a different participation rate. To ensure the interstate equivalence of ATARs, an age cohort is used in each state. This means that a student's rank is a measure of their performance against their age group, not just those who completed Year 12 and were eligible for an ATAR.

English courses

Your ATAR is calculated using at least 2 scaled units of English. If you have completed more than 2 units of English, your best 2 will be included first; the remaining 1 or 2 units will be included if they are among your next best 8 units.

Mathematics courses

Up to 4 units of calculus-based maths can be included in the ATAR calculation. Mathematics Extension 1 is counted as 1 or 2 units depending on whether it is paired with Mathematics Advanced or Mathematics Extension 2.

If you study Mathematics Advanced (2 units), then Mathematics Extension 1 accounts for 1 unit.

If you study Mathematics Extension 2 (2 units), then Mathematics Extension 1 accounts for 2 units. This is calculated by doubling the mark you receive for the 1-unit course.

If you complete Mathematics Advanced then go on to satisfactorily complete Mathematics Extension 1 and Mathematics Extension 2, your results in Mathematics Advanced will not be included in your ATAR calculation, even if you have excelled in it.

Accumulated courses

Courses can be accumulated for the ATAR over a period of up to five years. Scaled marks are calculated in the year you complete the course and the scaled mark can be included in your ATAR calculation when you become ATAR eligible.

Repeated courses

You will be considered to be repeating an HSC course if you:

- repeat the same course
- study a different course in the same subject area, apart from an extension course.

If you repeat a course, only the marks for your latest satisfactory attempt will be available for inclusion in the calculation of your ATAR, even if they are lower than your earlier attempt.

Your most recent ATAR will be the one used by tertiary institutions for selection purposes; again, even if it is lower than your original ATAR.

Re-marked HSC papers

If NESA provides UAC with amended HSC results, your ATAR will automatically be recalculated and UAC will notify you by email. Your ATAR can increase, decrease or stay the same.

Getting your ATAR

You can access your ATAR by logging in to [UAC's website](#) once ATARs are released.



To log in, you'll need your Year 12 student number and your 4-digit UAC PIN.

You can also access your ATAR via UAC's free digital wallet, CredFolio, which allows you to securely store and share your ATAR. You'll be notified by email when your ATAR is issued to your wallet. We'll use the email address you have registered with NESA, so make sure you register a personal – rather than school – email address.

When you view your ATAR, you'll also be able to see:

- a list of the ATAR courses you studied
- the number of units of each ATAR course that contributed to the calculation of your ATAR.

If you receive an ATAR between 0.00 and 30.00, your ATAR will be recorded as '30 or less'. If you haven't met the requirements of the ATAR, your ATAR will be recorded as 'not eligible'.

If you have a query about your ATAR, you can call UAC's ATAR Enquiry Centre, which operates when ATARs are released. The telephone number and opening hours are published on [UAC's website](#) and social media in December.

ATARs are also released to institutions to make offers to courses. If you apply for uni through UAC, you also have the option to allow us to share your ATAR with your school.

Limited ATAR

Some institutions will assess applicants based on a Limited ATAR, along with other selection criteria.

A Limited ATAR is calculated using the scaled marks from at least 1 unit of English plus the best 4 other units, rather than the best 10 units used for the standard ATAR.

To be eligible for a Limited ATAR, you must:

- be **over 20 years of age** on 1 March in the year you complete your HSC studies
- have taken between 5 and 9 units of ATAR courses, including at least 1 unit of English
- have completed all courses in the same academic year. You can't accumulate courses over several years.

HSC marks and the ATAR: what's the difference?

When Year 12 students receive their results, they often ask, 'Why is my ATAR low compared to my HSC marks?'


The answer is that they are very different measures of achievement: HSC marks tell you about your performance in the HSC, whereas your ATAR tells you about your position, or ranking, in the HSC.

Marks around 70 in the HSC could lead to an ATAR in the 50s, while marks closer to 80 could lead to an ATAR around 80.00. This is because most students usually achieve marks between 70 and 80 (Band 4) and, when they are ranked, that group really spreads out. If you are getting marks in the 70s, do your best to get closer to 80 – it will make a big difference to your ATAR. The experience of Fred and Laura, set out on [page 9](#), clearly illustrates this point.

HSC marks and ATARs are calculated separately using different methods.



In 2025, many HSC courses had a median mark above 75.



The following table outlines the main differences between these two measures of achievement:

Your HSC marks	Your ATAR
Are presented as marks out of 100.	Is a rank, not a mark or a percentage.
Tell you how well you've performed in each of your courses, according to standards set by NESAs.	Tells you where you're positioned overall in relation to other students.
Can only be compared to the marks of students who completed the same HSC courses.	Tells you how you compare with other students who have completed different combinations of HSC courses.
Are provided by NESAs.	Is provided by UAC.


FRED AND LAURA

Fred and Laura studied the same courses for the HSC. When Fred and Laura finished their exams, their HSC marks and their ATARs showed the difference between their performance and their position.

In the table below you can see that Fred got marks of 70 for all his courses, while Laura's marks were all 80. Even though their HSC marks only differed by 10, the difference between their ATARs is 20.00. Their performance was similar, but their positions were quite different.

HSC marks between 70 and 79 are Performance Band 4 results. These are 'average' HSC marks, so a large percentage of students are in this category. This means that when students are ranked for their ATAR, those at the bottom of Band 4 (like Fred) are placed significantly lower than those at the top of Band 4 or higher (like Laura).

The **percentile** column in the table below tells the story of their positions in more detail. For example, let's look at Biology. Laura's mark of 80 positioned her in the 67th percentile, which means she is placed in the top 33 per cent of students. Fred, on the other hand, with his mark of 70, is in the 37th percentile, so he is only in the top 63 per cent of students. Even though Fred and Laura's performances in Biology differed by 10 marks, their percentile positions differed by 30 (67 minus 37).

Essential advice for Year 11 students

ATAR calculation

Your ATAR will be calculated from your:

- best 2 units of English
- best 8 units from your remaining units.



Dropping courses

Before you drop an HSC course at the end of Year 11, ask yourself the following questions:

1 Will you still be eligible for an ATAR?
To be eligible for an ATAR, NSW Year 12 students must satisfactorily complete at least 10 units of ATAR courses. These ATAR courses must include at least:

- ✓ 10 units of Board Developed courses
- ✓ 2 units of English
- ✓ 3 Board Developed courses of 2 units or greater
- ✓ 4 subject areas.

Within a subject area (eg mathematics) there may be a number of courses (eg Mathematics Standard 1, Mathematics Standard 2, Mathematics Advanced, Mathematics Extension 1, Mathematics Extension 2). If you study, for example, Mathematics Extension 1, Mathematics Extension 2, English Advanced, English Extension 1, English Extension 2 and Biology, you will not meet the four subjects requirement because you have only studied courses from three subject areas: mathematics, English and biology.

2 Is it a prerequisite for a tertiary course you might want to study?
Some institutions specify HSC courses you need to have completed in order to be offered a place in certain tertiary courses. If prerequisites exist, they are listed in the course descriptions on [UAC's website](#).

3 Is it assumed knowledge for a tertiary course you might want to study?
Many institutions assume you have knowledge of specified HSC courses when you begin certain tertiary courses. If you haven't studied these HSC courses, you can still be selected for the course but you may have some difficulty coping with your studies. Assumed knowledge is also listed in the course descriptions.

Don't think about how your courses are going to scale: you won't get a higher ATAR simply by studying, or not studying, a particular HSC course. The underlying principle of scaling is that you should be neither advantaged nor disadvantaged by choosing one HSC course over another.

Accelerating courses

If you accelerate your studies by attempting an HSC course in Year 11, your scaled marks for that course will be calculated in the year you complete it and contribute to your ATAR the following year.

Your Year 11 results

Your studies this year do matter. They are the foundation for your Year 12 courses. Also, if you apply for an early offer to university through the Schools Recommendation Scheme, the institutions will base part of their assessment on your Year 11 results. Early offer schemes run by individual institutions often assess your Year 11 results, too.

What you can do now

It's a good idea to get to as many uni open days as you can before you make your final course preference decisions next year. Many are held on the same day or weekend, so take the opportunity to attend some open days while you're in Year 11.

Step 1: Prepare

To make the best decisions about what you will do when you leave school, it pays to do your research and find out as much as you can about the areas that interest you.

Getting started

If you're not ready to dive into searching for specific uni courses, here are some ideas to help you narrow your focus:

- Consider all the fields of study that complement your personal interests and the subjects you enjoy at school.
- Research job growth areas and skills shortages in different fields and look at job vacancy and career websites. The Your Career website is a good place to start.
- Meet with prospective employers and recruiters at expos and information sessions and consider volunteering to gain work experience in a field that interests you.

Which university, which course?

If you've decided that tertiary study is for you, the next questions are: which university or college and which course?

There are many different institutions of varying size and location to choose from and there are more than 2,000 undergraduate courses available through UAC.

UAC handles applications for the universities and colleges included in the Course Finder, which starts on [page 51](#).

Most public university courses for domestic students are Commonwealth-supported; this means the Australian Government subsidises your tuition fees. You can also get a government HECS-HELP loan for your contribution and repay your tuition fees once your income meets a certain amount.

Courses at private universities and colleges tend to be full fee-paying – this means your course costs are not subsidised by the Australian Government. However, you may be eligible for a government FEE-HELP loan.

Here are a few tips on researching your options:

- **Start with Course Compass:** Visit uac.edu.au/course-compass to discover the paths taken by students with an academic background similar to yours.
- **Browse courses:** Courses offered in 2026 are listed at the end of this booklet. Also explore the undergraduate course search on [UAC's website](#). Courses offered in 2027 will be added to the website progressively throughout the year: check back regularly to see what's new.
- **Compare course structures and content:** Although many institutions offer courses with the same name, the way they are taught can be very different. So looking at the areas of study and asking questions about the course content is important.
- **Have a Plan B:** Research all institutions that offer the course you are interested in and the various pathways to that course.
- **Go to uni open days and info sessions:** Explore the campus and ask questions. Most institutions will have faculty representatives and presentations to explain the content of courses being offered. Open day dates and locations are published in the key dates on the [UAC website](#).



Uni open days are a great way to find out which uni is right for you.



How you're selected

To be selected for a place in a course you must:

- meet the entry requirements of the course and the admission criteria of the institution offering the course (check the course descriptions on the [UAC website](#))
- compete against other applicants who also meet the entry requirements.

Selection rank

As a Year 12 student you will be selected on the basis of your selection rank (your ATAR plus any applicable adjustments – read [page 35](#)) for most courses.

Non-ATAR selection criteria

Some courses also have non-ATAR selection criteria. You may need to attend an interview or audition, present a portfolio, provide a personal statement or sit a test. For example, if medicine interests you, you'll need to sit the University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT) in July.

Prerequisites and assumed knowledge

You may need to have completed certain Year 12 courses (prerequisites) before you can be selected for a particular tertiary course (eg a specific level of English or maths, or a specific science course).

Even if your preferred course has no prerequisites, the institution may assume you have knowledge of a specific HSC course or its equivalent when you begin your lectures. If you don't have the assumed knowledge but do have a suitable ATAR, you can still be selected for the course but you may have some difficulty coping with your studies.

Bridging courses can help you achieve the required level of assumed knowledge. However, these courses are not equivalent to the two-year HSC course and they may add significantly to your workload at university.

Recommended studies are HSC or equivalent courses that the institutions suggest will help you in your chosen tertiary course. If you haven't studied these courses, your chances of selection are not affected but, again, a bridging course might be useful.

Prerequisites, assumed knowledge and recommended studies are listed in the course descriptions on the [UAC website](#).



Throughout Year 12, I had no idea what I wanted to do, whether that was to stay home and work or to go to university. My teachers advised me to find things I am passionate about and explore pathways to expand these interests, which led me to my education degree. My advice is to find things you love and enjoy and to seek all opportunities to explore those joys at camps, programs and orientation days. Remember that you never have to know everything straight away about what you want to do – it is okay to not know.

There are lots of ways to reach your goal, so think about your Plan B. Is there a different course – or a similar course at a different uni – that you could start as a pathway to your dream degree?

ACT students may need to know how their Senior Secondary Certificate courses compare to NSW HSC courses when applying to NSW universities. For a list of comparable ACT and NSW courses, visit the [UAC website](#).

International students

International students applying to medicine, dentistry, occupational therapy and speech and language therapy courses may be required to sit the International Student Admissions Test (ISAT).

Some other courses may also require special categories of applicants to sit the ISAT. The university will notify you if you are required to sit this test.

For information about ISAT, visit isat.acer.org.

What does it cost?

Your course costs will depend on the institution you attend and the type of course you enrol in. There are two main types of courses for domestic students:

- 1 Commonwealth-supported (CSP)
- 2 domestic fee-paying (DFEE).

Most university courses for Year 12 students are CSP. This means the Australian Government pays some of the course cost and you pay a student contribution.

Each institution sets its own student contribution level for each unit of study. The range varies depending on the area of study. For an indication of what you'll be required to pay, search for 'university course costs' on the [UAC website](#).

DFEE courses are generally run by independent or private universities, colleges, institutes or training organisations. DFEE courses typically cost more up-front than CSP courses – you pay the full cost of your course. Your tuition fees are not subsidised by the Australian Government. Each institution sets its own tuition fees for its DFEE courses; the amount you pay depends on the institution and the type of course.

A small number of courses are:

- a combination of CSP and DFEE (eg the bachelor program is CSP, the masters program is DFEE)
- sponsored by the Australian Defence Force (ie the student contribution is paid by the Australian Defence Force)
- exempt from student contributions
- fee-paying with VET Student Loans for eligible students
- fee-paying with no government loan scheme.

The course fee type is identified in each course description on [UAC's website](#).

For the most up-to-date information on the fees that universities can charge and the Australian Government's Higher Education Loan Program (HELP), visit the Study Assist website at studyassist.gov.au and contact institutions directly.

Other costs

Apart from your student contribution, you need to think about other costs involved in going to uni. For example:

- accommodation: Do you have to move out of home? Many universities offer on-campus accommodation, but you need to organise this early as demand can be high. Renting independently or in a share house with friends is another option. University housing services can help you find other students in a similar situation.
- travel costs: If you study full-time, you can use public transport at a cheaper rate. International students are eligible for discounted public transport fares on some tickets.
- living expenses
- textbooks and equipment
- computer and internet access.

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How to pay for university

There are various ways to pay for your uni course and support yourself while studying.

HECS-HELP

If you enrol in a CSP course, you can choose to pay all or part of your student contribution up-front, or defer payment by taking a HECS-HELP loan, which is repaid later through the tax system when your salary reaches a certain amount.

FEE-HELP

This Australian Government loan scheme helps eligible students pay their tuition fees for DFEE courses. It won't pay for other costs like accommodation or textbooks. Your FEE-HELP loan is repaid later through the tax system once your salary reaches a certain amount.

For information about HECS-HELP and FEE-HELP, visit studyassist.gov.au.

If you plan to pay your student contributions through the HELP scheme you must have a tax file number (TFN) and unique student identifier (USI) when you enrol at university. Apply online at:

- ato.gov.au for a TFN
- usi.gov.au for a USI.

Work

Most tertiary students have a part-time or casual job. Some work in the area of their study to gain experience before graduating.



Government assistance

The Australian Government provides financial help to eligible students through payments administered by Services Australia. Visit servicesaustralia.gov.au/students to find out if you are eligible for a payment.

You may be able to get one of these payments:

- **Youth Allowance**, a fortnightly payment for people aged 16 to 24 who are studying full-time or doing a full-time Australian Apprenticeship. Some job seekers aged 16 to 21 can also get it.
- **Austudy**, a fortnightly payment for people aged 25 or over who are studying full-time or doing a full-time Australian Apprenticeship.
- **ABSTUDY**, a group of payments for First Nations people studying or doing an Australian Apprenticeship. It can help with living costs, study costs and travel.
- **Pensioner Education Supplement**, a regular payment to help with study costs if students also get certain income support payments from Centrelink or the Department of Veterans' Affairs.

International students

If you're not an Australian citizen, New Zealand citizen, or permanent resident of Australia, but are studying an Australian Year 12, International Baccalaureate or New Zealand NCEA, you apply through UAC as an international student.

Not all domestic courses are available to international students. Check the international course search on [UAC's website](#).

Courses available to international applicants are known as international fee-paying (IFEE) courses. Each institution sets its own tuition fees for international students, so fees vary between institutions and courses. International students must pay these course fees up-front.



If you're moving for study, you may also be able to get:

- **Tertiary Access Payment**, a one-off payment of up to \$5,000 for people moving from a regional or remote area for tertiary study within the year directly after completing Year 12
- **Relocation Scholarship**, an annual payment to help students getting Youth Allowance or ABSTUDY who need to move to or from a regional or remote area for higher education study
- **Fares Allowance** to help with the costs of travel for students who need to live away from their family home to study.

You may also be able to get extra help, including:

- **the Student Start-up Loan**, a voluntary loan students getting Youth Allowance, Austudy or ABSTUDY Living Allowance can get up to twice a year. You have to pay the loan back once you start earning a certain amount of income.
- **the Education Entry Payment** to help with the costs of study or training if you've been on certain payments from Services Australia
- **other concessions and allowances** such as a Health Care Card and Rent Assistance.

You can claim most payments online 13 weeks before your course starts using your myGov account (linked to Centrelink).

Equity Scholarships available through UAC

Equity Scholarships provide financial support to students from low socio-economic backgrounds, particularly those receiving Centrelink income payments. They are funded by institutions.

Merit-based scholarships available from institutions

Institutions award merit-based scholarships to applicants based on a range of criteria such as:

- school examination results
- academic excellence
- ATAR
- course/faculty of study
- personal achievements such as:
 - leadership
 - creativity
 - self-motivation
 - communication skills
 - an outstanding ability in sport.

You need to apply directly to individual institutions for merit-based scholarships. To find out more, search for 'scholarships' on the institution websites.

Step 2: Apply

Now that you've done your research and decided on the courses you'd like to study, you're ready to apply. Every year, around 50,000 Year 12 students apply for uni through UAC.

Why apply through UAC?

You can apply through UAC if you're:

- an Australian citizen
- a New Zealand citizen
- a permanent resident of Australia
- the holder of an Australian permanent resident humanitarian visa.

Applying through UAC means you don't need to apply separately to each institution. You can apply for up to five courses at any of our participating institutions.

It also means you can apply for early offer schemes processed through UAC (the Schools Recommendation Scheme), the Educational Access Scheme, and the Elite Athlete and Performer Scheme.

Through these schemes, the institutions are able to consider factors in addition to your ATAR, such as your Year 11 results, certain challenges you've faced while at school and specific sporting or performance commitments. Read more about them on [pages 26 to 29](#).

UAC processes the applications but the institutions decide who receives an offer. UAC's participating institutions are listed on [page 44](#).

How to apply

Applications open on the [UAC website](#) in April. By applying before the end of September, you'll avoid the significant increase to processing charges between the end of September and early February the following year, which is the final closing date for semester 1 courses.

If you are also applying for the Schools Recommendation Scheme, you'll need to complete both applications by early September.

Can't find the course you're after? Courses will be available for selection in the application once institutions confirm the details. Complete your application by selecting a different course, and change your preferences later. All courses should be available for selection by early August.

Application checklist

Here's what you need to have ready to apply:

- a private email address (not a shared or school address)
- your Year 12 student number (issued by NESA or ACTBSSS) and UAC PIN (emailed to you in April)
- your Unique Student Identifier (USI) (if you don't already have one, go to usi.gov.au)
- your UCAT candidate number, if relevant (eg if you're applying for a medicine degree)
- a list of your chosen courses and their course codes (up to five) - you can change these whenever you like
- a credit card (Mastercard or Visa) or PayPal account to pay the processing charge. If you're a domestic student, you can also pay by BPay.

International Baccalaureate students: Your Year 12 student number is your IB code. Your UAC PIN is the first four digits of your date of birth.



International students

Some international students can apply through UAC. If you're not an Australian or New Zealand citizen or a permanent resident of Australia, you can apply for undergraduate courses through UAC if, in 2025 or 2026, you completed/are completing:

- an Australian Year 12 qualification
- an International Baccalaureate
- a New Zealand NCEA Level 3.

All other international students need to apply directly to the institution.

International applicants are encouraged to apply by the end of September for courses starting in semester 1, as the processing fee increases after this date. However, applications for semester 1 don't close until early February. You can list up to six courses in your application.

If you're an international student you will receive advice of a conditional offer from UAC approximately 48 hours after you apply. This is for visa purposes only and does not guarantee a place in a course. Read [page 43](#) for more information.

UAC PIN and application number

NSW and ACT students will be issued with a four-digit UAC Personal Identification Number (PIN) in early April. You will need your UAC PIN to apply for uni and to log in to get your ATAR.

A nine-digit UAC application number is generated after you enter your personal details. You'll need to reference this number if you contact us.

Keep these numbers handy and don't share them with others.

Listing qualifications

Your Year 12 qualification will be added to your application automatically when ATARs are released. International Baccalaureate students need to authorise the IB to release their results to UAC.

Most Year 12 students will have no further qualifications to add.

The work experience question in the application isn't relevant to Year 12 students. The question is there for applicants with other qualifications, such as 12 months or more of full-time employment. As a Year 12 student, it is not necessary to list or supply your employment experience as entry to tertiary study is based on your selection rank (ATAR + adjustment factors) and other selection criteria, where applicable.



Do you have your Unique Student Identifier (USI)? You need it to apply, enrol and get a HELP loan. Go to usi.gov.au.



Listing course preferences in your application

As an undergraduate applicant you can list up to five different courses at five different institutions. However, you can also apply with just one preference, particularly if you are still undecided about what you want to do. When you're ready, you can change your preferences at no extra cost.

Some courses have early closing dates: check the course descriptions on [UAC's website](#) for details.

Changing your mind

Preferences can be changed quickly, easily and as many times as you wish at no extra cost. When you get your ATAR in December, you can make more informed choices about the university courses you want to apply for and change your preferences before the main offer rounds for Year 12 applicants.

Why the order matters

You can only receive one offer in each offer round. During the selection process, your course preferences will be considered one at a time in the order in which you list them. If you're not competitive enough to be selected for your first preference, you'll be considered equally with all other eligible applicants for your second preference, and so on.

The golden rule: list your course preferences in the order you would like them to be considered.

Many students believe that you have a lower chance of getting into a course if it's further down your preference list – this is not the case. You'll receive an offer for the first course in your list for which you're eligible.

The course listing starting on [page 51](#) shows the lowest selection rank required to receive an offer to each 2026 semester 1 course in the main Year 12 offer rounds. Use it as a guide to your chances of being selected. The selection ranks required to receive offers to courses starting semester 1, 2027 won't be known until those offers have been made: they might be lower, higher or the same.





How to make the most of your preferences

UAC recommends you list your 'dream preference' at number one, but always have a back-up plan: at the bottom of your preference list include one or two 'safe' options to ensure that you get an offer. These could include certificates and diplomas, which can act as a pathway into your desired degree. Read more about these pathways on [page 31](#).

- 1 Start with your dream course** – Choose the course you want most, your top pick no matter what.
- 2 Another top choice** – Choose a similar course or one you'd be just as happy to study.
- 3 A strong match** – Choose a realistic course based on your results and interests, which could help you transfer to your dream course.
- 4 Your safe option** – Choose a course you feel confident you'll get into and that could help you transfer at a later stage.
- 5 Your back-up** – Choose your 'just in case' course to give you the best opportunity to start your study journey.



After you apply, it's free to change your course preferences as many times as you like.



Use the name on your official ID in your application: they need to match when you enrol.

Supplying documents

Year 12 students usually do not have to supply any documents with their UAC application. If you do need to provide supporting documents, you will be prompted to do so in your application. The required documents will also be listed in your Confirmation of Application, which you can download when you complete your application.

If you also apply for the Educational Access Scheme or Elite Athlete and Performer Scheme, you'll need to provide various supporting documents, so start preparing and collecting these as soon as you can and avoid a last-minute rush. (Read more about these schemes on [pages 27 to 29](#).)

Non-ATAR selection criteria

Year 12 students are selected on the basis of their selection rank (ATAR or equivalent + adjustment factors) for most courses. However, some courses have other selection criteria. These can include interviews, auditions, portfolios, supporting statements, questionnaires and tests.

Check if any of your courses have any non-ATAR selection criteria or particular course requirements. These can be found in the course descriptions on [UAC's website](#). For further information, contact the institution directly.

University Clinical Aptitude Test

If you're planning to study medicine (or some health science degree programs), you'll need to sit the UCAT during Year 12. It is held in July and August but you have to register between March and May. The test is used by many universities to help them select students for undergraduate health science degrees.

If you choose course preferences that require you to sit the UCAT, you'll be asked to include your UCAT candidate number on your UAC application. Your UCAT results will be sent directly to the institutions, which match them to your application for admission to the relevant courses. For more information, visit ucat.edu.au.

Special requirements

If you're applying for entry into health/welfare-related and teacher education courses, be aware that there are special requirements relating to:

- criminal record/working with children checks
- clinical placements
- procedures for employment after completing the course.

There are also specific English language proficiency requirements for nursing applicants.

For details, go to uac.edu.au/special-requirements and check individual course descriptions on the [UAC website](http://uac.edu.au).

These requirements and policies are subject to regular review, so check with institutions before you apply for these types of courses.

Interviews, statements, auditions and portfolios

All interviews and auditions are organised by you and the institution. You'll need to make these arrangements in addition to listing the course in your UAC preferences.

If a portfolio or personal statement is required, it will be listed in the course description on [UAC's website](http://uac.edu.au). It will also be flagged in your application. Follow the institution's instructions for how to submit the portfolio or personal statement.

Each institution has its own policy for determining how you will be assessed. Some institutions may allocate a weighting for each type of selection criteria. For example, the ATAR might be worth 50 per cent, a portfolio 25 per cent and an interview 25 per cent. At other institutions, a minimum ATAR may be used to filter applicants, and those above the minimum ATAR assessed and ranked on the other criteria. Or the portfolio or audition may take precedence over other criteria, including the ATAR. For further information, contact the institution.

Gap years

If you're planning to take a gap year, UAC recommends that you apply now and defer. Current Year 12s are eligible for early offer schemes and selection rank adjustments (eg recognition of achievement in an HSC course or attendance at a regional school). Any adjustments will improve your selection rank. In addition, depending on the institution, the Educational Access Scheme and Equity Scholarships may only be available to current school leavers.

Applying for early offers

While the ATAR is still the main selection tool used by most unis, there are other ways for you to show that you're ready to succeed at tertiary study.

Many institutions have one or more early offer schemes for Year 12 students. Through these schemes, the institutions will assess you using criteria other than (or in addition to) your ATAR.

Always check the institution websites to make sure the courses you are applying for are covered by the schemes.

Schools Recommendation Scheme

Institutions use the Schools Recommendation Scheme (SRS) to make early offers to current domestic or international Year 12 students who have applied for undergraduate admission through UAC.

They do this by using criteria other than (or in addition to) ATARs. These criteria include school recommendations and Year 11 results. Each institution has its own policies on how its individual scheme will work.

Not all courses are included in SRS.

How to apply

After you've applied to UAC for undergraduate admission, follow the link in your UAC application to apply for SRS.

If you're a NSW HSC or ACT BSSS student, details of your Year 11 studies will be displayed. Check that they are correct. If they're not, contact UAC.

All other students will need to enter the details of their Year 11 studies and upload their Year 11 report.

Applications close early September. There is no separate fee.

How you are assessed

After you apply, UAC will ask your school to assess your aptitudes. Participating institutions will then take

a variety of information into account when considering your application, including your Year 11 results and your school's assessment.

Offers

In most cases, institutions make offers to successful applicants before ATARs are released. There are two types of SRS offers:

- unconditional offers (which have no further conditions for you to meet)
- conditional offers (which require you to meet additional conditions, such as a minimum ATAR).

Direct application to the uni

Some of our participating institutions also take direct applications for early offers to their undergraduate courses. This means you can submit a UAC application and a direct application to the institution.

If you do complete both a UAC application and a direct application, we highly recommend that you don't duplicate your course preferences. Make the most of both applications and choose different preferences in each. That way, you can potentially receive offers to different courses.

Check with the uni as to how and when it will make its direct offers. You can read about UAC offers in 'Step 4: Accept', starting on [page 38](#).

In 2025, unis made over 15,000 conditional or unconditional SRS offers to Year 12 students.

Educational Access Scheme

The Educational Access Scheme (EAS) recognises UAC applicants who, due to circumstances beyond their control or choosing, have faced challenges that impacted their educational performance during Years 11 and 12 (or equivalent).

When assessing your application, institutions will consider the adversities you have overcome and, as a result, may make you an offer to a course even if your ATAR (or equivalent) is below the required selection rank.

Eligibility

The educational challenges universities will consider span a range of experiences:

- receiving Centrelink payments
- your health and/or disability
- an immediate family member or close friend has died
- an immediate family member or close friend has a serious or life-threatening illness
- you care for a family member or another person with a medical condition or disability
- your parents have separated or you have separated from your partner
- you, your siblings, or your parents have experienced abuse
- you are involved in legal matters (for crimes not committed by you)
- your home was impacted by a major natural disaster (eg floods, bushfire, cyclone, drought)
- you've lived in out-of-home care (eg foster care or kinship care)
- you live independently and support yourself (Year 12s only)
- you study a Year 12 subject through distance education
- you work at least 7 hours a week to support your family (Year 12s only)
- English is not your first language and you started school in Australia in Year 11 or Year 12
- you are, or have been, a holder of an Australian refugee or humanitarian visa
- you attend a rural, regional or remote school.

EAS doesn't cover temporary physical ailments like breaking your arm just before your exams. In this situation you are encouraged to submit an illness/misadventure appeal form to NESA via your school principal.

Elite athletes and performers can't apply for EAS on the basis of missing periods of schooling due to sporting or performance commitments. However, you can apply for the Elite Athlete and Performer Scheme instead (see [page 28](#)).

International students can't apply for EAS.

How to apply

- 1** Submit your undergraduate application through UAC.
- 2** On your application home page, select the 'Apply for EAS' button.
- 3** Follow the prompts to claim all the circumstances that apply to you.
- 4** Submit separate supporting documents for each circumstance you claim.

There is no additional fee to apply for EAS.

Automatically generated applications

After you've applied for undergraduate admission through UAC, we will automatically generate an EAS application (ie you don't have to submit an application) if you meet one of the following criteria:

- you are a 2026 Year 12 student who, **at the time of submitting your UAC application**, attends a school located in a rural, regional or remote area as determined by the Australian Bureau of Statistics
- the residential address you entered in your UAC undergraduate application is identified by the Australian Bureau of Statistics as being in the lowest 25 per cent of socio-economic disadvantage in Australia.

If we automatically generate an EAS application for you, we'll email you a confirmation of your application the day after you submit your undergraduate application. If you do not receive an automatically generated EAS application, you can still apply by following the prompts in your UAC undergraduate application.

Assessment

If you are eligible for consideration under EAS and your ATAR (or equivalent) is below the required selection rank for a course, an institution can increase your selection rank for that course. This will make you more competitive for a place.

You won't be notified of how many adjustment points may have been added to your selection rank. However, around the time you get your ATAR, UAC will inform you of your eligibility for all institutions regardless of your course preferences. This will help you make decisions about your final preferences in time for the first offer round after ATARs are released.

Note that you may be eligible for EAS consideration at an institution and not be offered a place. This is because you still have to compete against other applicants for an offer to your preferred course.

Elite Athlete and Performer Scheme

The Elite Athlete and Performer Scheme (EAPS) allows institutions to consider both your academic results and your elite sporting or performance achievements. If you're eligible, a participating institution can increase your selection rank for certain courses and improve your chances of being selected. It applies to semester 1 offers only.

If you successfully compete against other applicants, you will receive an offer as part of the standard undergraduate offer rounds.

Who can apply

EAPS is open to domestic undergraduate applicants, including Year 12 students and non-school leavers, who meet the eligibility requirements:

- **Elite athlete:** a person competing at a national or international standard in their sport, often identified by the Australian Institute of Sport (AIS), a state institute/academy of sport, or a recognised professional sporting body.
- **Performer:** a person who has achieved at a professional or elite level in the performing arts (eg music, dance, theatre), usually through a recognised company, conservatorium, or industry body.

How to apply

- 1 Submit your undergraduate application through UAC.
- 2 On your application home page, select the 'Apply for EAPS' button.
- 3 Declare your status as an elite athlete or performer.
- 4 Nominate up to five elite athlete activities and five performer activities.
- 5 Submit the required supporting documents.

For eligibility and supporting document details, go to uac.edu.au/eaps. Note that:

- Not all institutions that participate in EAPS offer consideration for both elite athletes as well as performers.

- Each institution also has its own policy on when and how it increases selection ranks for eligible applicants and each course.
- Providing documentation is not guaranteed to increase your selection rank.

Equity Scholarships

Equity Scholarships provide financial support to students from low socio-economic backgrounds, particularly those receiving Centrelink income payments. They are funded by institutions.

Eligibility

If your family is receiving a Centrelink or other Australian Government means-tested income support payment, such as a Disability Support Pension, Parenting Payment (single) or Carer Payment, you are considered to be in financial need.

You may also be considered for an Equity Scholarship if you meet one or more of the following criteria:

- have carer responsibilities
- have financial hardship
- have a long-term medical condition/disability or ongoing effects of abuse
- reside in a regional or remote area
- have sole parent responsibilities.

If you are Indigenous, have humanitarian refugee status, and/or have been in out-of-home care, this will also be considered.

Be aware that meeting the scholarship eligibility criteria doesn't guarantee that you will be awarded a scholarship. There are a limited number of Equity



Scholarships and there are more applicants than scholarships. Individual institutions make offers as a result of a competitive process. If you're unsuccessful it doesn't mean that you're not in need; rather, it means that there are other applicants who've been assessed as being in greater need.

Applying

Submit an Equity Scholarship application through [UAC's website](#).

By submitting just one Equity Scholarship application through UAC, you will be considered for all Equity Scholarships for which you are eligible. You'll need to supply supporting documentation with your application. For example, if you apply under the long-term medical condition category, you'll need to submit:

- a medical impact statement completed by a registered health professional treating you for your condition
- an educational impact statement completed by someone at your school, such as a teacher, counsellor, principal or another responsible adult who can comment on the impact of your circumstances on your studies.

Offers

Institutions make their Equity Scholarship offers after assessing applications submitted as part of a competitive application process. The Equity Scholarship application gathers sufficient information from applicants to determine which applicants best meet the eligibility criteria.

An institution can only award you an Equity Scholarship if you've received an offer of admission to that institution or are currently enrolled with that institution.

Studying interstate

If you want to study in another state, apply through the tertiary admissions centre in that state or directly to the institution.

- **Victoria:** Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre, vtac.edu.au.
- **Queensland:** Queensland Tertiary Admissions Centre, qtac.edu.au.
- **South Australia and Northern Territory:** South Australian Tertiary Admissions Centre, satac.edu.au.
- **Western Australia:** Tertiary Institutions Service Centre, tisc.edu.au.
- **Tasmania:** University of Tasmania, utas.edu.au.

Do not submit multiple Equity Scholarship applications: your one application is valid until March 2027.





Pathways to degrees

Concerned that you won't meet the required selection rank for a degree course? Want more support and preparation before studying at degree level? You have options!

Entry-level courses like diplomas and foundation programs are designed to help you build skills, confidence and uni-level study experience. They can be a smart stepping stone into your chosen degree or into the workforce.

Tip: In your UAC application:

- add one or more pathway courses to your preferences
- tick the box to receive information about other study options if you don't get an offer to any of your listed courses.

Non-degree courses

Institutions often offer non-degree courses, such as:

- foundation studies
- preparatory courses
- certificate, diploma or associate degree courses.

If you successfully complete one of these courses:

- an institution may guarantee you entry into particular degree courses
- you can use your new qualification to apply and compete for admission to degree courses
- you can decide to finish up studying and still have a complete qualification.

You can apply for some non-degree courses through UAC, or you may receive an offer to one of these courses if you don't get an offer to any of your listed preferences.

TAFE qualification

TAFE is another popular pathway to uni.

You can complete a TAFE diploma and use it to apply for degree courses. In some cases you can apply with a Certificate III or IV qualification. Speak to the uni or college about their admission criteria, as each institution is different.

TAFE NSW also offers tertiary preparation courses, such as a Certificate IV in Tertiary Preparation (otherwise known as the Tertiary Preparation Certificate). It focuses on study skills and subject-specific content.

For information about Vocational Education and Training (VET) providers and training courses, go to the 'Learn and Train' section of yourcareer.gov.au.

Entry schemes

Some institutions have entry schemes or programs through which they consider applicants who don't meet the usual minimum admission criteria of the institution. In addition, most institutions have an admission scheme specifically for First Nations students. Contact the institution for information about these schemes and programs.

How to apply for medicine, dentistry and veterinary courses

Entry into undergraduate medical degrees is highly competitive: make sure you're in the running by getting your application in on time and keeping the interview dates clear.

Check with each university to confirm application deadlines and requirements and to ask any questions you have about the selection process.

Admission requirements for most medical degrees include the following steps.

1

Register for and sit UCAT ANZ

You must register for the 2026 UCAT ANZ between March and May and testing begins in July. Register at ucat.edu.au.

2

Submit a direct application to the university faculty

Check UAC course descriptions to see if this is required and to check application deadlines.

3

Submit a UAC application

In your UAC application, first on your course preference list should be the course you'd most like to do, followed by your second, third, fourth and fifth preferences. If you're not selected for your first preference, you'll be considered equally with all other eligible applicants for your second preference, and so on.

4

Attend an interview

In-person interviews and assessments are an important part of the selection process for all medicine, dentistry and veterinary medicine degrees.

You'll be selected for an interview based on your UCAT results or your ATAR, or both. The order of your course preferences in your UAC application does not have an impact on your selection for interview.

Institutions advise you not to pay for interview coaching: they are looking for authentic responses from passionate students from diverse backgrounds.

Step 3: Review

Once you've applied for uni, it's important to know how to manage your application. This means understanding your selection rank and how to change your preferences.

Adding your ATAR

UAC will automatically add your HSC results and ATAR to your application when these results are released at the end of the year. International Baccalaureate students need to authorise the IB to release their results to UAC.

Changing your preferences

You can add, delete and change the order of your preferences online as often as you like by logging in to your application on [UAC's website](#). There is no charge to do this. You won't be able to choose a course as a preference if the course closing date has passed.

Once you've received your HSC results and your ATAR and have an idea of the selection rank adjustments you may be eligible for (read more about these on the next page), it's time to go back to your preferences to make sure they're realistic. Perhaps you've done better than you expected and want to change the courses you applied for, or maybe you've rethought what you really want to study.

Look at last year's lowest selection ranks for your preferred courses. These are included in the course listing in this book. If you're concerned that you're not going to meet the selection ranks for these courses, consider adding one or two pathway courses to your list of preferences.

Pathway courses generally include non-degree courses such as foundation studies, preparatory courses and certificates, diploma or associate degree courses. If you successfully complete a pathway course, an institution may guarantee you entry into a particular degree course. Otherwise, you can use your pathway course studies to apply and compete for admission to other degree courses. You may also be awarded credit for some of your pathway course studies.

Also check that you're not wasting preferences by listing courses that have additional selection criteria or prerequisites that you haven't met.

Make sure you do this by the final closing date for change of preferences for the next offer round. Change of preference dates for all offer rounds can be found on [UAC's website](#).



Selection ranks

Your selection rank determines whether you are eligible for selection to each of your course preferences. As a Year 12 student, your selection rank is usually your ATAR. However, if other factors are taken into consideration, these will be combined with your ATAR to adjust your selection rank and make it higher than your ATAR.

The course listing starting on [page 51](#) shows the lowest selection rank required to receive an offer to each 2026 semester 1 course in the main Year 12 offer rounds.

The interaction of three factors determines the lowest selection rank for each course:

- 1** the number of places available in the course
- 2** the number of applicants for the course
- 3** the quality of those applicants.

These three factors mean that the lowest selection ranks can change from year to year and are not known before applicants are selected for a particular course in a particular year.

The lowest selection rank does not represent the average ability of the students accepted for the course and does not reflect the difficulty or quality of the course.

Selection rank adjustments

Many applicants receive an offer to a course even though they have an ATAR below the published lowest selection rank. This is because other factors have been taken into consideration in combination with their ATAR and their selection rank for that course has been adjusted and is higher than their ATAR.

Example

Applicant	Selection rank
1	89.00 (ATAR of 89.00)
2	88.00 (ATAR of 87.00 plus adjustment of 1 point)
3	87.00 (ATAR of 83.00 plus adjustment of 4 points)
4	86.00 (ATAR of 86.00)
5	85.00 (ATAR of 83.00 plus adjustment of 2 points)
6	84.00 (ATAR of 84.00)

In the example above, offers will be made to applicants 1, 2 and 3. Applicant 4 won't receive an offer, even with an ATAR higher than applicant 3, and applicant 3 will receive an offer even though their ATAR is below the lowest selection rank. The lowest selection rank required to receive an offer to Course A will be 87.00.



I felt confident and reassured, especially as I had already received an early entry offer. My results didn't change my mind or my course preferences.

Selection rank adjustments are due to factors such as strong performance in HSC subjects, living or attending school in a certain area, and applying for consideration through the Educational Access Scheme or Elite Athlete and Performer Scheme.

Selection rank adjustments are applied differently from institution to institution and from course to course within the same institution. Visit each institution's website for details.

You need to know that:

- adjustments do not change your ATAR; they change your selection rank for a particular preference
- the lowest course selection ranks published in this booklet incorporate these adjustments
- your selection rank = your ATAR + adjustments
- institutions automatically adjust your selection rank if you are eligible
- you will not be notified of your selection rank.

As selection rank adjustments are course-specific, your selection rank can be different for each of your course preferences.

International students

The lowest ATARs and selection ranks for international applicants applying through UAC may differ from those of domestic applicants. Use the international course search on [UAC's website](#).



Step 4: Accept



Most offers to Year 12 applicants will be made after ATARs are released, but there are many offer rounds throughout the year. Understanding how to accept and manage your offers will help you make the most of your application.

Offer rounds

UAC advises students of their offers on behalf of the participating institutions. There are a number of offer rounds throughout the year. All the offer round dates are published on UAC's website.

Main rounds for Year 12 students

Although some Year 12 students receive early offers, the most important offer rounds for Year 12 students are in December and January, after ATARs are released. This is when most Year 12 applicants receive their offers.

Early offers

The offer rounds before December are usually for early offer schemes such as the Schools Recommendation Scheme, ADFA (Australian Defence Force Academy) courses, and some non-Year 12 applicants. Not all institutions participate in these early rounds, so if you don't receive an early offer and aren't in one of the categories listed, there's no need to worry.

Late offers

Offer rounds after mid-January are for entry to courses that still have vacancies or for courses that begin later in the year.

Receiving your offer

We'll send you your offer in an email, so it's important that we have your correct email address. This can be updated at any time via your application.

The institutions (not UAC) decide who receives offers. So, if you have questions, you'll need to speak to the admissions office at the institution. You can ask why you didn't receive an offer and what other study options are available to you.

Slipback offers

Some institutions may make you an offer to a lower-level course if you're not eligible or competitive enough for the course to which you've applied.

This means that you may receive an offer to a non-degree course in the same area at the same institution rather than the course you listed in your preferences, even if you didn't apply for it. For example, you may get an offer to a Diploma in Marketing if you applied for, but weren't competitive enough for, the Bachelor of Marketing at the same institution.

If you successfully complete a course such as a diploma, an institution may guarantee you entry into some degree courses. You may also be awarded credit for some of your studies.



Accepting your offer

If you receive an offer in one round, don't assume that you'll receive another offer in a later round. You must accept your offer by the date indicated in your offer material, otherwise your offer may lapse and go to another applicant in the next round.

Accepting an offer doesn't stop you from being considered in later offer rounds, but you must remove the successful course from your preferences list – or move it to the bottom of the list – to prevent it blocking offers to lower preferences in future rounds.

If you receive an offer in one round and accept it, then receive an offer in a later round, you can choose either to:

- keep your previous offer and not accept your new offer
- accept your new offer and withdraw from the course you've already accepted.



If you have accepted more than one offer, and enrolled in more than one course, make sure you formally withdraw from all courses you are not proceeding with so that you are not charged tuition fees or graded as failed.

Changing your preferences to receive further offers

Once you've received an offer, you can't be made an offer to any lower course preferences unless you change your preferences.

To be considered for another offer in subsequent offer rounds, you should:

- 1 Accept the offer you have straight away. Don't let it lapse.
- 2 Remove the current offer from your preference list.
- 3 Rearrange your preferences before the preference change deadline for the next offer round.

If you receive an offer to a lower preference, you will automatically be considered for higher preferences in the next round.

Example

Let's say you have the following five courses listed as preferences and you receive an offer to your second preference:

Preferences	
1	Bachelor of Animal Science
2	Bachelor of Zoology
3	Bachelor of Science (Physics)
4	Bachelor of Medical Science
5	Bachelor of Rural Science

First, you should accept your offer to Bachelor of Zoology.

If you leave your preferences as they are, then in subsequent rounds you will only be considered for your first preference, Bachelor of Animal Science.

If you want to be considered for courses other than Bachelor of Animal Science, you can change your preferences in any way you like – even add new courses to your list – just make sure you have a realistic chance of meeting the lowest selection rank and can satisfy any additional course requirements.

Say you change your preferences to the following:


Preferences	
1	Bachelor of Animal Science
2	Bachelor of Science (Physics)
3	Bachelor of Biotechnology
4	Bachelor of Scientific Studies
5	Bachelor of Teaching/Bachelor of Science

You'll notice that Bachelor of Zoology has been removed from the list. As long as you've accepted your offer to this course, you won't lose your place. If you now receive an offer to a course in your new list, you can decide whether to accept it and withdraw from Bachelor of Zoology, or not accept the new offer and keep your place in Bachelor of Zoology.

If you reject an early round offer or let it lapse, and then change your mind, you'll need to speak with the institution's admissions office as only the institution can reinstate the offer. Also, if you leave the offered, but rejected, course as your first preference, no further offers can be made because the rejected offer will 'block' any new offers to lower preferences.

Finalise your choices by the closing date for change of preferences for the next round. These dates are available on [UAC's website](#).

Courses that start later in the year are progressively added to UAC's online course search so check for these when changing your preferences. Not all institutions offer courses that start later in the year.



University has been a good mix of learning a lot and figuring things out along the way. I've found the course super interesting and hands-on, especially getting practical experience that relates to what I want to do. Direct offers from unis

If you have applied directly to an institution, as well as through UAC, you can receive offers from both UAC and the institution. Then it's up to you to decide which one to accept.

Deferring

After you've received an offer, you may decide that you'd like some time away from study. Some institutions let you defer your course, usually for six months or a year. You are not usually permitted to undertake tertiary study during this period.

Most institutions will ask you to provide a statement to explain why you want to defer and what you'll be doing during this period. There may also be a fee.

If your deferment application is successful, you'll receive written confirmation from your institution with instructions on how to take up your deferred offer. Read these instructions carefully.

Enrolment

Each institution has its own procedures for enrolment. When you apply, make sure the name on your application matches your official ID (birth certificate, passport, citizenship documents). You'll need your ID when you enrol and there may be problems if the name on your ID doesn't match your offer letter.

Organise your paperwork

When you enrol, you'll need your Unique Student Identifier (USI). You will have already entered this in your UAC application. If you don't have one yet, you can create a USI at usi.gov.au.

If you plan to pay your student contribution through the HECS-HELP scheme, you'll need a tax file number (TFN): if you don't already have one, apply online at ato.gov.au.

Commit or withdraw

After you enrol you have until the census date to pay your fees, sign up for a HELP loan, or withdraw without penalty from the course. The census date varies depending on when your course starts, but it is usually at least a couple of weeks after the course start date.

Go to orientation days

Many institutions have orientation days for new students. Orientation programs are designed to help you adjust to campus life. Most include course induction sessions, so it's important to attend.

Consider bridging courses

You can enrol in a course even if you haven't completed the HSC subjects that are assumed knowledge for that course. But you may find it difficult to keep up with the course content, or be limited in your elective subject choices.

Most institutions offer bridging courses if you need to do some extra study before the course begins. However, bridging courses are only taught to an introductory level and are not equivalent to the two-year HSC course.



After finishing Year 12, I felt overwhelmed by the pressure to choose the 'right' degree. A conversation with my uncle helped shift my mindset – he advised me to focus on starting something rather than finding the perfect course. I began a Bachelor of Engineering (Honours), specialising in software, where I learned valuable skills and discovered which areas I did and didn't enjoy. After a couple years, I changed to a Bachelor of Information Technology. Looking back, starting was the most important step as it allowed me to learn, grow and find the path that truly fits me.

Transferring

You may start a course that isn't your first preference. Many students enrol in a course with a view to transferring into another course after completing a year's study. A typical example is completing one year of a general degree such as Arts and then transferring to a more specialised degree such as Arts/Law.

Transfers such as this are possible but very competitive and you usually need to achieve excellent results in your first year. Remember that each institution has its own requirements for transfers – check with the relevant institution for more information before you enrol.

In most cases you are not in fact transferring, but withdrawing from one course and applying for entry to another. You usually need to submit a new application through UAC for the new course. Then, if you get an offer you can formally withdraw from your current course. It's important to do this so you don't have additional HECS fees or absent fails.



Each year, unis make more than 100,000 offers to undergraduate courses through UAC.

International students

Conditional offers

A few days after you've submitted your application, you'll receive advice of a conditional offer via email. The email will list all the courses you've applied for. You can also access your conditional offer advice by logging in to your application. If you use an agent, your agent will also be able to view your offer advice.

You only receive one conditional offer. You will not receive another one if you change your preferences.

Your conditional offer is intended for your pre-visa assessment only; it doesn't let you enrol at your chosen institution. You must receive an unconditional offer to be eligible to enrol in a course.

Unconditional offers

To receive an unconditional offer you must:

- have the course in your list of preferences when offers are made
- have a selection rank (ATAR + adjustment factors) equal to or higher than the lowest international course selection rank
- meet any other course entry requirements.

If you don't meet the requirements for a course, you may receive an offer to another course with a lower level of study, such as an international foundation program.

You can receive one offer per institution in each round.

UAC will email advice about unconditional offers to successful applicants between mid-December and February.

Acceptance and enrolment

Follow the institution's instructions for accepting your offer and paying the required tuition fee deposits and compulsory Overseas Student Health Cover charge.

Once you've accepted your offer and made your payments, the institution will send you a Confirmation of Enrolment. This document will allow you to obtain your student visa.

If you're granted permanent resident status after applying, you'll need to reapply as a domestic undergraduate applicant. Contact UAC for instructions on how to do this. Advise the institution, not UAC, if you've already received an unconditional offer or enrolled.

Course Finder: degrees and pathways

Course Finder is a guide to the more than 2,000 undergraduate courses offered to domestic students in 2026. Full course descriptions of the courses to be offered in semester 1, 2027 will be published on [UAC's website](#) from April 2026 as details are confirmed.

Course Finder is in three parts:

1. 'Find your topic of interest' directs you to the fields of study that incorporate your interests.
2. 'Find your degree' lists relevant semester 1, 2026 degree courses under each field of study. It indicates the institution that offered the course, the UAC course code and the lowest selection rank (LSR) required to receive an offer to each course in the main Year 12 offer rounds. Selection ranks can change from year to year.
3. 'Find your pathway' lists university preparation programs, certificates, diplomas and associate degrees. These courses can lead you into an undergraduate degree. Diplomas and associate degrees are also a complete qualification that can be your launchpad to the workforce.
